



FROM THE DIRECTOR OF LITURTY AND MUSIC



On the Liturgy

Part I

Daniel Kirkland

In Father's absence, I have been asked to provide some reflections on the exceptionally broad term "liturgy" — what it is and how we might enter into it. I should note that while I will offer some useful references and resources, my talk is primarily based on my experience as a liturgical musician. By no means am I a theologian or even a liturgist; I just love our Lord, the Faith that He has given us, and its manner of expressing the truths contained in that sacred Deposit of Faith left to us by His apostles.

What is Liturgy? The word comes to us from the Greek leitourgia, or litos and ergos, which literally means a "public work". It is common for people to conflate this with "work of the people", a misleading term commonly circulated in liturgical circles. Leitourgia carries the sense of a small group of individuals undertaking a project for the good of the people. Specifically, the rich citizens among the Greeks would spend great sums of money to perform a public service, which could either involve sponsoring a religious festival or undertaking an infrastructure project among other duties. In the Latin Church, we now generally use the word Liturgy to mean the formalized public rituals of the Sacraments, the canonical hours (such as Morning and Evening Prayer), and the Mass.

It is interesting that the early Catholics applied this word to the Church's official expressions of worship. This tells us that public worship was (and still is!) considered a service of the Church — and those acting on her behalf — for the People of God. St. Thomas Aquinas teaches that "God has no need for our worship. It is we who need to show our gratitude for what we have received." The Church is therefore providing an opportunity to the Faithful to perform their duty to worship the Creator publicly. But our worship ultimately is much more than a mere duty because we were created to be loved by God and to love Him, so Liturgy is ultimately tied up with our true happiness because we are fulfilling the purpose for which God made us.

Turning our attention to the Council – the constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Sacrosanctum Concilium, offers us a deeper understanding of the nature of Liturgy: "...the liturgy, 'through which the work of our redemption is accomplished,' most of all in the divine sacrifice of the Eucharist, is the outstanding means whereby the faithful may express in their lives, and manifest to others, the mystery of Christ and the real nature of the true Church. It is of the essence of the Church that she be both

human and divine, visible and yet invisibly equipped, eager to act and yet intent on contemplation, present in this world and yet not at home in it; and she is all these things in such wise that in her the human is directed and subordinated to the divine, the visible likewise to the invisible, action to contemplation, and this present world to that city yet to come, which we seek" (Paragraph 2)

Firstly, Liturgy is an expression of the truths of our Faith. Yet it is more as well because through it "the work of our redemption is accomplished." Therefore, liturgical actions *convey graces* and tell us something about what those graces accomplish through symbolism, i.e., it is sacramental. When we are baptized, water is used to signify a cleansing, and that cleansing *actually occurs* within the soul, freeing us from Original Sin. At Confirmation or Holy Orders, the laying on of hands signifies the passing on of the power of the Spirit, and the Holy Spirit in reality configures the soul to Christ more closely. The priest at Mass offers bread and wine to the Father, saying that they are the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ, and really and truly these signs become what they signify. Hence, Eucharistic adoration, devotions, etc.

Secondly, the Council affirms that the "human is directed and subordinated to the divine". Everything that happens in Liturgy is supposed to direct us to heaven. It is "sacred", a word that ultimately comes from the Latin sanctum, which means "holy" or "set apart" (as in for a special purpose). Therefore, liturgical expressions should have the character of otherworldliness. Going to Mass or any public worship of the Church should not be part of a to-do list nor a pedestrian activity. It is a time when time itself seems to stop, and we are caught up into something altogether different, awe-inspiring, and beautiful. All of this must be true to the highest degree at Holy Mass, which is the greatest act of worship that the Church can offer God since it is a representation of the Sacrifice of Calvary (albeit in an unbloody manner).

The great modern philosopher, Josef Pieper, spoke of the need for modern man to rediscover leisure. When we hear *leisure*, we tend to think of either idleness or recreation. His use of the word refers to its older sense of doing something for its own sake because of its inherent goodness. It is, primarily, a mindset of wonderment and contemplation, lived out in the pursuit of the good and the beautiful through quiet reflection, the arts, recreation, the pursuit of virtue, etc. Liturgy, then, is the highest form of leisure. We participate in it not because it is useful but because it is good in itself, giving glory to God. The beginning of appreciating liturgy is cultivating a sense of wonder and an inner attentive quietness whilst engaged in worship.
