

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Behold, O God, our protector, and consider the face of your Anointed; for one day in your house is better than a thousand elsewhere.

Offertory: The Angel of the Lord shall encamp round about those who fear him and shall deliver them; taste and see how good the Lord is. **Communion:** Siek first the kingdom of God, and all the rest will be

given to you in addition, says the Lord.

Christ wishes to set our hearts on fire with zeal for the Kingdom in today's Gospel. Living the Christian life can be difficult, though, because it can mean estrangement from family or even danger to one's very life, as we see in the reading about Jeremiah. The Antiphons offer us profound encouragement, though, promising God's protection for "those who fear him" and who "seek first the kingdom of God". Our Entrance Antiphon in particular, reminds us that our heavenly homeland is better than anything this world can offer. God is calling us daily to self-denial, attending to our duties, and showing charity to our neighbor. All we need to do is ask for the strength, and He will provide it, for He desires our salvation even more than we do! "Taste and see how good the Lord is."

FROM THE DIRECTOR OF LITURGY AND MUSIC



On the Liturgy

Part II

Last week I provided a basic overview of the essence and purpose of Liturgy in the life of the Church, especially as it pertains to the Latin Church (that's us!...the Western Church). Now I direct our attention to acquiring a basic understanding of the structure of the Mass, the Church's highest form of liturgy. Such knowledge can help deepen our own lives of prayer so that we can enter into the mysteries unfolding before our eyes and pass on what we have learned from the Table of the Word.

Holy Mass is divided into two parts: the Liturgy of the Word (formerly the Mass of the Catechumens) and the Liturgy of the Eucharist (formerly the Mass of the Faithful). The Liturgy of the Word begins with a solemn entrance of the ministers, signifying that something very special is about to take place. Highlighting the gravity of what is to come, it then calls on those present to prepare themselves during the penitential rite by confessing their faults and receiving absolution from the priest. Any venial sins that are weighing down the soul are wiped away with this general absolution. What a gift from the Church! The response of the faithful fittingly is one of joy and is expressed in the ancient hymn of the angels to the shepherds at Christmas: Gloria in excelsis Deo. Having prepared themselves, the Faithful then receive instruction in the history of salvation from the Old Testament and apostolic epistles. Music during this part of the Mass, i.e., the responsorial psalm, is primarily meditative and fosters reflection on the Sacred Texts. The Liturgy of the Word then reaches its climax with Christ made sacramentally present in the proclamation of the Gospel, heralded by the jubilant Gospel Acclamation. When the priest or deacon reads the Gospel, it is as if Christ Himself is speaking to us; the words themselves are given special power by the Holy Spirit to move souls to conversion. Countless saints were stirred to heroic action while listening to the Gospel!

Historically, catechumens would be dismissed after the homily whilst the Faithful, justified by the graces of their baptisms, remained to confess their Faith and worthily partake in the "breaking of the bread". Hence, the Liturgy of the Eucharist

was called the *Mass of the Faithful*. After professing their belief in all that the Church teaches, gifts that assist in the carrying out of the Sacrifice and support the Church in her works are brought to the altar. Whilst the priest prepares the Offering, the music at this time calls to the minds of the Faithful the need to bring their own offerings before God and is often petitionary in nature. The priest, when ready, then exhorts all present to lift up their hearts in prayer that God might find the Sacrifice acceptable in order that He might be glorified in what is to be accomplished. All then proceed to give Him glory, joining the song of the angels as revealed to us in the Book of Revelation, the Sanctus, which ushers in the "Canon of the Mass" with the prayers of consecration. Jesus Christ, the second Person of the Trinity, is made present in the priest, who then, to quote St. Thomas's hymn, "offers Himself with His own hands" and makes Christ present in the Bread and the Chalice. Heaven meets earth in a mystical union.

The Faithful then petition God to provide them with their daily bread and to purify them to receive the most holy Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, ending with the penitential litany, Agnus Dei. All who are ready then come forward to receive of the One Body that unites them into the One Mystical Body of Christ, the Catholic Church, and fills them with the graces and strength to go do the work of salvation. This is the climax of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. During this time, the music is contemplative, fostering prayerfulness and primarily focusing on the Gospel of the day and also Eucharistic themes. Once all have received, a blessing is given and a song of thanksgiving is offered to God, escorting the solemn procession out of the Church.

When we assist at Holy Mass, we are transported back to Calvary two thousand years ago and relive, in an unbloody manner, the drama of the Crucifixion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ. It was by the single act of offering Himself on the Cross that Christ purchased us with His Precious Blood. That act is re-presented at Mass, and the fruits of that action are applied to our time. Through the Mass, the shadow of the Cross reaches into all of time, making Christ's merits available to all peoples of all times. Our response to this overwhelming act of love should be one of humility and gratitude. Make your first act when entering the church to prepare for Mass a prayer of thanksgiving that God has called you by name to the Wedding Feast of the Lamb.


