LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Grant peace to those who are waiting for you, O Lord, so that your prophets may be proved trustworthy; hear the prayers of your servant and of your people Israel.

Offertory: Moses prayed to the Lord his God, and said; Moses addressed this prayer to the Lord his God: "Why, O Lord, is your anger enkindled against your people? Let the wrath your mind has conceived cease. Remember Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, to whom you swore to give a land flowing with milk and honey." And the Lord was dissuaded from accomplishing the evil which he had threatened to inflict upon his people.

Communion: I say unto you: there is joy among the Angels of God for one single sinner who repents. *This Sunday's readings and Antiphons are exceptionally beautiful, highlighting with forceful clarity the mercy of God. The Offertory Antiphon catches our attention right away, echoing the first reading in which Moses pleaded for clemency on Israel after their heinous crime of rejecting God after everything He did to save them. Given God's omniscience, one gets the sense that He very much wanted to be merciful and was waiting, with bated breath as it were, for Moses to intercede for Israel. The Communion Antiphon reinforces this point, summarizing the Gospel's multiple parables about the lengths to which God will go to find the lost and the patience He will show to sinners in order to draw out repentance in their hearts. We see here a wonderful confluence of Antiphons and readings that is more common in the high liturgical season like Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. In the midst of the ocean of "Ordinary Time", we are swept off our feet and immersed in the wondrous and infinite mercy of God, the inexhaustible Divine Mercy that brings hope to even the most hardened sinner. "Eternal Father, we offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, of your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world; for the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world!"*

FROM THE DIRECTOR OF LITURGY AND MUSIC



On the Liturgy

Part VI

Daniel Kirkland

Last week, we briefly discussed how architecture and the very layout of churches can direct our attention to the mysteries that unfold within their walls. Having surveyed the Liturgy, its music, some gestures contained within it, and the physical space it occupies, we now return to the Council to revisit *Sancrosanctum Concilium* with fresh eyes: **"...the liturgy, 'through which the work of our redemption is accomplished,' most of all in the divine sacrifice of the Eucharist, is the outstanding means whereby the faithful may express in their lives, and manifest to others, the mystery of Christ and the real nature of the true Church. It is of the essence of the Church that she be both human and divine, visible and yet invisibly equipped, eager to act and yet intent on contemplation, present in this world and yet not at home in it; and she is all these things in such wise that in her the human is directed and subordinated to the divine, the visible likewise to the invisible, action to contemplation, and this present world to that city yet to come, which we seek" (paragraph 2).**

We can see how the Mass "is the outstanding means whereby the faithful may express[...]the mystery of Christ and the real nature of the true Church." The Mass, through its various components, ritualistically reveals to us and to non-believers what it is to be a Christian. When the priest and the people face the liturgical East (*ad orientem*), the people participate in the sacrifice of Christ in a priestly manner because their orientation is the same as that of the ordained priest, who offers the sacrifice *in persona Christi capitis* ("in the person of Christ the Head [of the body]"). The Church, then, is revealed to be a priestly society whose members intercede for the world through their daily prayers and sacrifices, participating in Christ's single offering on the Cross. The layout of church buildings reveals to us the centrality of Christ's sacrifice by placing the altar and crucifix in the center. When the music used in a liturgical setting imitates the prayerful, unassuming, and irregularly metered character of Gregorian chant (when the chant itself is not used), we lose the sense of progression of time and are transported into eternity, which is where the Wedding Feast of the Lamb shall be fully realized. Music of this timeless variety connects us to previous generations and generations yet to come, modeling the reunion of all peoples from all times and places in heaven.

All of this hinges on the Person of Jesus Christ. He is God-Incarnate, the union of heaven and earth, who made possible a human sacrifice with divine merit that was able to "take away the sins of the world" with one single salvific act. Everything we do in

Mass serves to strengthen our faith in the Son of God and to offer Him fitting worship, enabling us to approach the Father with confidence because the Son, our Brother in the flesh, has gone before us as the firstborn of the children of God. The Mass reenacts the awe-inspiring sacrifice initiated at the Last Supper and culminating with the Crucifixion and Death of Christ. Not only does it recall that moment in history, but it draws us into that moment, reliving in a supremely real way the saving Sacrifice at Calvary by making present the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, of Jesus Christ in bread and wine and offering this perfect Gift to the Father in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world. Without this central mystery, the Mass means nothing; it becomes a mere social gathering that celebrates a moment in the past and does not call down the infinite merits of Christ to cleanse us and strengthen us anew for the work of ministry. Eucharistic devotion, then, is paramount to participating in the Mass fruitfully.

It is also incumbent, though, on those who contribute to the celebration of the Mass through the various ministries to ensure that the Mass is celebrated in such a way that the "human is directed and subordinated to the divine". Mass is meant to strengthen us in addition to providing an opportunity to worship God publicly. If we demean the dignity of Christ's Sacrifice by (literally) removing Him from the center of our worship or drawing attention to ourselves through gestures and music that exclusively focus on the gathered community, we are in grave danger of compromising our faith in the Eucharist, **"the source and summit of Christian life" (Lumen Gentium, no. 11)**. The celebration of Mass, then, is a two-way street where ritual inspires devotion and devotion informs ritual.

Let us, then, join the U.S. Bishops in their journey to promote a Eucharisti revival, striving to rediscover the saving, loving, and healing Presence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. Through our renewed efforts to approach the Liturgy with reverence for the mysteries it presents and to present it in a manner that demands reverence towards those mysteries, we shall find a wellspring of strength and consolation to help us navigate our daily lives in a society that grows increasingly hostile to Christian values and the dignity of human life. Go to Mass and give thanks to God for having called us to the Banquet of the Lamb and beg for the fortitude to share that love that has so generously been given to us, whatever the cost.

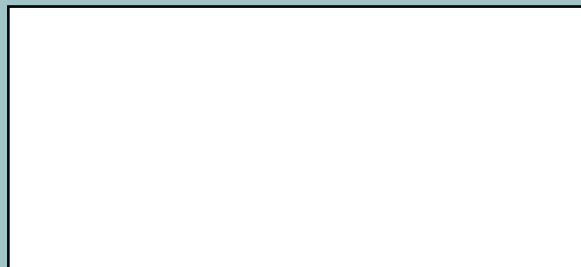

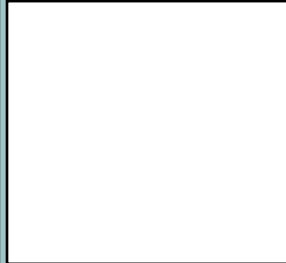
