

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: I have called out because you answer me, O God; incline your ear and hear my words; keep me, O Lord, like the apple of your eye; protect me under the shadow of your wings.

Offertory: I shall meditate upon your commandments which I greatly love; I will extend my hands towards your commandments which I love. **Communion:** O Lord our governor, how admirable is your name in all the earth!

A beautifully confident passage begins Mass this weekend: "I have called out because you answer me". That we had such faith when praying to God! This directly hearkens to the Gospel parable in today's readings about the unjust judge. If he will capitulate to the cries of the widow, how much more will God, Who loves us, answer our prayers! The first reading also reinforces God's Providence for His beloved people when granting them the victory through the intercession of Moses. For our part, we must strive to be faithful to His commandments, which are found to a great extent in the Word of God. We shall find that, if we do so, He will work everything towards our salvation. St. Paul exhorts us to faithfulness to the Word and to use it as a means of instruction and correction. So, trust in His mercy and meditate upon His commandments, which are given for our benefit, and we shall find peace in the soul and strength against our enemies (namely, the powers of hell). Thanks be to God!

FROM THE PASTOR





OUR LIFE AND STRENGTH IN THE EUCHARISTIC JESUS

Part V

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"At the root of the Eucharist is the virginal and maternal life of Mary, because every Mass puts us into intimate communion with Mary, the mother, whose sacrifice 'becomes present' just as the sacrifice of her Son 'becomes present' at the words of consecration." Pope St. John Paul II, 1983

It is said that the Eucharist is by far one of the greatest gifts of Mary. Man is entirely dependent on God. By his natural instinct he looks for God, and when he does not find Him, he makes a god for himself with his own hands, just as poor pagans do with their idols. God has given us the grace of satisfying this need – first, through the Incarnation and, then, through the Eucharist.

The Lord came down from heaven to earth to become one of us, and in this way we can see Him, know Him, and love Him. Yet this was not enough. He wanted more and so chose to humble Himself to the point where we could touch Him, eat Him, and nourish ourselves with Him – and not just for a few days or a short while, but forever. Through the Incarnation He assumed a human body and lived among men, though for a short time. He only lived in Palestine for some thirty-three years. But what is this for all of humanity?

By His wisdom and power, He devised the way to be truly present to each and every person, to be so intimately united

to us through the most perfect union that exists, that is, by way of nourishment in the Holy Eucharist. It is by nourishment that what we eat becomes one with us, forever until the end of time. In this way, the Eucharist is a continuous Incarnation. It is the practical application of the Incarnation for each and every person. It is the way in which God has chosen to satisfy the need for Him that we all have.

Now ask yourself: who gave us the gift of the Incarnation? It was the Eternal Father, but through Mary. Jesus was incarnate and was born through Mary. It was She who gave Jesus to the world. St. Paul says: "but when the fulness of the time came, God sent forth his Son, born of a woman, born under the law" Galatians 4:4. So, if the Eucharist is the continuation of the Incarnation, it is very clear that the Eucharist is the continuation of the gift from Mary. She continues to give Jesus to us daily, just like how She gave Him to us at the stable in Bethlehem. Adam lost everything for us by eating of the fruit that the woman gave him. "The woman that you gave me as a companion has given me the fruit and I have eaten it" Genesis 3:12. So, Adam sinned! Likewise, we can say, "Lord, the woman, whom you gave to us as a Mother, has given to us and is giving to us the blessed fruit of Her womb, and so we live through Him who nourishes us." This is what the Eucharist could be called—in the other sacraments. Mary does not have any part. In this sacrament, She does have a part, and a very principal part. The flesh of Christ, St. Thomas says, is none other than the virginal flesh of Mary. Therefore, She is the one who provided the matter for this sacrament. With Her fiat the Blessed Virgin brought the Son of God from the Heart of God to Her immaculate womb.

A priest, during the consecration at Mass, repeats a similar miracle, and the Son of God comes down to his hands, already being the Son of Mary. The words of the priest are then like a repetition of those of Mary. The phenomenon that occurs is like the miracle and continuation of the wonders of Nazareth. So, it can be said and is said that the Eucharist is a continuation of the work of Mary.


