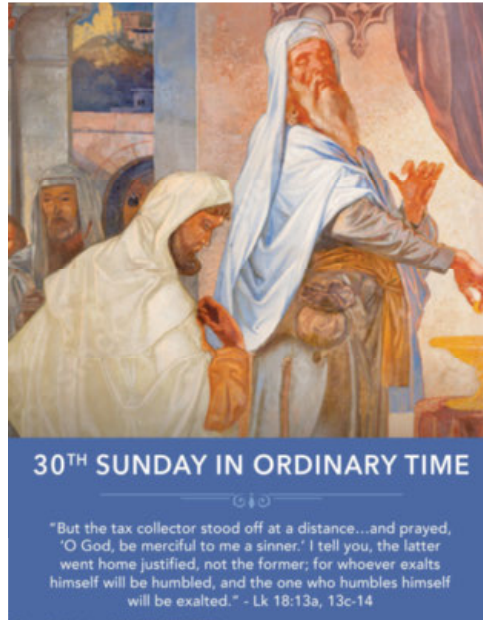

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice; seek the Lord and be strengthened; seek his face for evermore.

Offertory: O Lord, grant me life according to your word, so that I may learn your commandments.

Communion: We shall rejoice in your salvation; and in the name of the Lord our God shall we place our pride.

Today's Propers reveal an interesting dimension in the readings. The first reading and the Gospel clearly highlight God's regard for the lowly since they often have no one to speak up for them. His perfect justice demands that their cries be heard. We often think of the poor as those who are without means and a voice, which is true but incomplete. The Entrance Antiphon invites us to rejoice when seeking the Lord; the implication once we hear that first reading is that we are called to adopt a spirit of poverty since "the Lord hears the cry of the poor". True poverty is detachment from the good things of this world in order that they not hinder us in our pursuit of God: "O Lord, grant me life[...] so that I may learn your commandments." Those who are "poor in spirit" learn to love the things of God, which disposes them to pray for those things that are good for them and their neighbor. We conclude with the Communion Antiphon, which offers a wonderful disposition in prayer: rejoicing with faith in God's Providence. We should always give thanks with joy in our prayers, making an act of faith that God will take care of all our needs in His good time and in the most perfect way imaginable. Let us therefore imitate the Virgin Mary in her joyful humility and detachment, for God "has looked on His lowly servant" and He "raises up the lowly".

FROM THE PASTOR



OUR LIFE AND STRENGTH IN THE EUCHARISTIC JESUS

Part VI

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

“Mary can guide us toward this most holy sacrament, because she herself has a profound relationship with it.”

Ecclesia de Eucharistia, Pope St. John Paul II

Mary’s primary and foundational role in the area of motherhood is that of Mother of God, or in the Greek, Theotokos. This doctrine proclaims that the Virgin Mary is the true Mother of Jesus Christ who is God the Son made man. This is found in Luke’s Gospel when Mary is addressed by the Angel who says, **“you will conceive in your womb and bear a son,”** and later on adds, **“the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God.”** If, then, Mary is the Mother of Jesus and Jesus is God, Who is the Bread of Life really present in the Eucharist, then in a way we can conclude that Mary “mothered the Eucharist”.

Through her Immaculate Conception, Mary was created to be the perfect tabernacle for Our Lord. *“And from Mary, therefore, Jesus comes to be given to us day by day; and in Jesus is always the Immaculate flesh and Virginal blood of His Most Holy Mother, which penetrates our hearts and ‘intoxicates’ our souls.”* So, not only in virtue of her Divine Motherhood is Our Lady connected to the Blessed Sacrament, but also as Mother of the Church.

In her apparitions, the Blessed Virgin Mary encourages the presence of the Eucharist in her shrines. When Our Lady came for the first time in her apparition at Rue du Bac in Paris in 1830, she told St. Catherine Laboure to come to the foot of the altar where great graces would be bestowed on all who ask for them. Our Lady asked

that a church be built on the site of her apparitions at Lourdes, which of course indicates that she wanted the Eucharistic Sacrifice to be celebrated there as well as Christ's Presence in the tabernacle. In every one of Mary's great sanctuaries, she is not venerated in isolation. She brings all the pilgrims to the foot of the altar where they may gain grace from her Divine Son. This is particularly true at Fatima and Lourdes, as it is at these great Marian sanctuaries that there are large processions in which the Eucharist is carried, and in which a bishop as a rule blessed the sick. On these occasions tremendous miraculous cures are brought about, both physical and spiritual.

At Fatima it is a well-known fact that an Angel of Peace came first to Francisco, Jacinta, and Lucia in 1916. He prepared the way for the later apparitions of Mary Immaculate. When he appeared for the third time in dazzling beauty before the three seers, he held in his left hand a chalice, and in his right – over the chalice – a host from which drops of blood could be seen falling into the chalice. Leaving the host and the chalice suspended in mid-air, he prostrated himself, touching the ground with his forehead. Then he said the following prayer three times: *“Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Ghost, I adore you profoundly. I offer you the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for all the outrages, sacrileges and indifferences by which He is offended. By the infinite merits of His Most Sacred Heart and through the intercession of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I pray for the conversion of poor sinners.”* The Angel then rose and took the chalice and host into his hands. He communicated the host to Lucy, and the contents of the chalice he gave to Jacinta and Francisco, saying: *“Take and drink the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, horribly outraged by ungrateful men. Make reparation for their sins and console your God.”*

How seriously Francisco took these words to heart is illustrated in the remaining years of his life. When the seers were sent to school, Francisco, realizing that he had but a short time to live, did not have any desire to go to school, but told his sister and cousin to go ahead while he would remain in church where he could make reparation for the outrages, sacrileges, and indifferences by which our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament is offended. So penetrated was Francisco with the love of what he called “the hidden God” that he often spent many hours on his knees in silent adoration before the tabernacle. How about you?
