

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: The Lord says: "I am pondering thoughts of peace and not of affliction; you shall call upon me, and I will hear you; and I will bring you back from all the lands where you are held captive."

Offertory: Out of the depths have I cried to you, O Lord, Lord hear my prayer; out of the depths have I cried to you, O Lord.

Communion: Amen I say to you, whatever you ask in your prayers, believe that you shall receive it, and it shall be granted unto you. The Entrance Antiphon is one of the most beautiful texts in the chant repertory, crowning the end of the liturgical year with God's express desire to free us from sin and its destructive effects ("I will bring you back..."). The resurrection of the dead at the end of time will be a glorious thing for the blessed because they will no longer have to strive against their bodies and the world to remain pure. Knowing this, the Offertory Antiphon quotes the heartfelt Psalm 129, calling to God "out of the depths" that He might hear our pleafor deliverance. The Communion Antiphon offers us the consoling words of Our Lord, who assures us that prayers made with true and simple faith will be heard. Ultimately, God does not desire affliction, only permitting it to draw us out of our sinful ways. Throughout history, visions of Jesus, Mary, and (in more recent days) St. Joseph that have been found to be supernatural are always calling us to repentance and promising the negation of chastisements in proportion to our (humanity's) turning back to God. As we draw near to the end of all things, liturgically and historically, let us renew our faith in God's Providence and beg Him for the grace to remain steadfast and to fear only the loss of His friendship through sin.

KEEPING DEATH BEFORE OUR EYES IN THIS MONTH FOR THE SOULS IN PURGATORY (& BEYOND)

Part II

"We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body"

2 Corinthians 4:10

In Plato's Apology, Socrates argues that he does not fear death; "indeed, to fear death is a sign of ignorance. It is to claim to know what one in fact does not know" (Ap. 29 a-b). Perhaps, Socrates suggests, death is not a great evil after all, but "the greatest of all goods". At the end of the dialogue, after the judges have voted on the final verdict and Socrates has received the death penalty, the philosopher considers two common views of death: that death is a long dreamless sleep, and that death is a journey to another place (Hades). According to Socrates, either

of these views of death would be acceptable to him – the one, because he would receive a wonderful rest with no dreams to disturb him, and the other, because he would be able to talk philosophy with those who had gone before with impunity.

Saint Ambrose says, "Death must be active within us if life also is to be active within us. 'Life' is life after death, a life that is a blessing. This blessing of life comes after victory, when the contest is over, when the law of our fallen nature no longer rebels against the law of our reason, when we no longer need to struggle against the body that leads to death, for the body already shares in victory" (Treatise on death as a blessing by Saint Ambrose, Bishop). Paul, writing to the Corinthians, teaches us to seek out a kind of death even in this life, so that the death of Christ may shine forth in our lives — that blessed death by which our outward self is destroyed and our inmost self is renewed. Our earthly dwelling crumbles away and a home in heaven opens before us.

The Lord allowed death to enter this world so that sin might come to an end, but he also gave us the resurrection of the dead so that our nature might not end once more in death. Death was to bring guilt to an end, and the resurrection was to enable our nature to continue forever. "Death" in this context is a Passover to be made by all mankind. We must keep facing it with perseverance. It is a Passover from corruption, from mortality to immortality, from rough seas to a calm harbor. We can even go as far as to say, "thanks be to God for death, for through death we enter into complete union with our God".
