

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Let your forbearance be known to all men. The Lord is at hand. Do not be anxious over anything; but in all manner of prayer, let your requests be made known unto God.

Offertory: O Lord, you have blessed your land, you have put an end to Jacob's captivity; you have forgiven the guilt of your people.

Communion: Say: Take courage, you who are fainthearted, and do not fear; behold, our God will come and he will save us.

This is a day of rejoicing! The first word of the Entrance Antiphon in Latin is "Gaudete", which is the name the Church gives this Sunday. While it is still a time of penance, the sobriety of the season is tempered with the expectant joy of Mary, as she awaits her child, and the hopeful joy of the entire Church, as she awaits her Savior's return. Therefore, we are to "take courage" because "our God will come and he will save us" at His Second Coming when He shall judge the living and the dead, revealing all the happy consequences of the good works of the saints and uncovering all the secrets, misdeeds, and conspiracies of the damned to their condemnation. What will be remarkable about all this is that God's mercy will be plainly evident even in the case of the wicked. Jesus suffered and died that ALL might have the chance at salvation, and it is solemnly taught by the Church that God provides EVERYONE with the graces necessary for salvation. The choice is ours to respond to those graces. To quote from an old English carol, let us "foil [our] foe with joy" and choose to place our hope in the glorious resurrection of the dead that is to come, standing firm until then in the face of adversity. 

FROM THE PASTOR





A JOURNEY OF ADEVENT -TRAVELING FROM HOPE TO JOY Part II

"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." Isaiah 9:6

"Blessed are the peacemakers," the Lord taught us in the Sermon on the Mount, "for they will be called children of God" Matthew 5. So, seeking to grow in faithfulness to the Lord, we set about making peace, working for its fruition in every dark corner of the world. In our Advent series, we find out that Isaiah gave many prophecies about the Messiah bringing peace to the world. He tells us that not only will the Messiah save Israel but that people from among all nations would be drawn to his kingdom. Many people will desire to live according to God's righteousness, to receive God's judgments, and to live at peace with one another, Isaiah. 2:1-5. In the messianic kingdom, God will settle disputes between people and nations. Armed conflicts will cease. "They shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore." Isaiah 2:4.

When the Messiah comes, he will heal people of their disease and afflictions: "Then will the eyes of the blind be opened and the ears of the deaf unstopped. Then will the lame leap like a deer, and the mute tongue shout for joy" Isaiah 35:5-6. The Messiah will save people from their sins, restoring peace with God. "But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the

punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed." Isaiah 53:5.

In light of Isaiah's prophecy, we are called to confess how we have not been peaceful in various aspects of our lives. We take the time to confess because we need to acknowledge violence was never a part of God's ideal for the world, and yet it afflicts us. Isaiah uses other metaphors to illustrate just how foreign violence and death should be to our world. In Isaiah 11, he prophecies of the wolf living with the lamb, lions with calves, leopards with goats, and lions eating straw like the ox. He also prophesies a child leading these predatory animals—feeding bears and playing near cobra dens. Of course, right now, trying this might not be the best idea. But what a thought! Not only will peace reign in human affairs, but across the entirety of creation, including ALL God's creatures. I cannot help but wonder what the relationship between humanity and the animal kingdom will look like. If there are no more swords, no more violence, no more death, could there be no more killing between peoples from different nations too?

The reign of peace and flourishing across all creation—what Hebrews call "shalom"—seems to have been God's original intention for the created order. Christ entered this world to begin bringing that heavenly kingdom to bear on our broken, violent, sword-wielding, and wartorn world. I believe this peace will affect humans and animals alike. I see this in other places in Scripture that point to a future peace as well. Repeatedly, Scripture underscores how deeply God cares for creation: "In that day I will make a covenant for them with the beasts of the field, the birds in the sky and the creatures that move along the ground. Bow and sword and battle I will abolish from the land, so that all may lie down in safety" Hosea 2:18.

We know that Christ came to establish this new Kingdom of God, yet it is something ongoing and not fully realized. This is the tension in which we now live. We celebrate Christ's first coming, yet we hope for Christ's second coming to bring fullness of joy, love, and peace. Even though we live in this tension, I believe we can still put into practice some of the aspects of the Kingdom of God. Even as we pray the Lord's prayer, we can remember that even now, we can begin living and acting in ways that cause small breakthroughs of peace into our world.


