

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Skies, let the Just One come forth like the dew, let him descend from the clouds like the rain. The earth will open up and give birth to our Savior.

Offertory: Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst wo-men, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb.

Communion: Behold, a Virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and his name shall be called Emmanuel.

The symmetry found in the Propers this weekend is splendidly poetic. All creation cries out with the deepest longing for the coming of the Savior, begging Him to "come forth like the dew", which gently saturates the parched earth. It is a beautiful image of the meek manner in which God chose to dwell among us two thousand years ago, Whose Presence is perpetuated to our day in the Blessed Sacrament. The Communion Antiphon responds to the plea of our fallen world: "Behold, a Virgin shall conceive", and the boy's name shall be the answer to the most fundamental prayer of the human heart – "God is with us", i.e., you are not alone; I (God) shall not abandon you. Who is at the heart of God's mysterious plan? The Blessed Virgin Mary, whose immaculate conception we celebrated a few weeks ago. Her fiat ("let it be done") caused the clouds to open and "rain down" the Savior into her womb by the power of the Holy Spirit, and all of heaven marveled that the God of the universe should be contained in a tiny embryo. 

A JOURNEY OF ADVENT -TRAVELING FROM HOPE TO JOY

Part III

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is he."

Zechariah 9:9

There is joy because the Lord comes to fulfill and bestow salvation on His people. Isaiah declares, "With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation." (12:3). Psalm 16:11 states: "You make known to me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forever more." The angels appeared to shepherds on the night of Jesus' birth promising "good news of great joy" (Luke 2:10). The One promised to bring salvation had arrived. Jesus had been born. Advent is cause for joy – joy in the Lord; joy in His coming; joy in the salvation He brings; joy in the midst of wellbeing; joy in the midst of suffering; joy in all times and in all places. So, St. Paul declares, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Romans 8:31). This gives reason for an abundance of joy.

Joy is a rare commodity for many people who haven't been awakened to new life in Christ. I always say that the most unfortunate people on this planet are ones who don't have faith in God and the hope we have that one day we will see our living God. It's amazing how some of the most joyful people in the world are Christians living in some of the most desperate conditions. They have experienced what Jesus promised: "As the Father has loved Me, so have I loved you. Now remain in My love. ... I have told you this so that My joy may be in you" (John 15:9, 11).

Mother Teresa of Calcutta brought untold blessings and joy to the poor who lay unattended and forgotten on the streets of Calcutta. When she was asked the source of her joy, Mother Teresa replied: "Joy is prayer; joy is strength; joy is love and joy is a net of love. A joyful heart is the normal result of a heart burning with love, loving as He loves, helping as He helps, giving as He gives, serving as He serves, rescuing as He rescues, being with Him twenty-four hours, touching Him in His distressing disguise." When Advent arrived every year, Mother Teresa's life continued to witness this joy, which is the true hallmark of every Christian and the rightful inheritance of all the poor.

Our mission, as members of Christ's body, the Church, is to reflect Christ's joy to others, just as the moon reflects the light of the Sun. It is important during this Advent season to reflect Christ's love and unconditional forgiveness through our lives, thus bringing joy to those in misery! There are many people who live in darkness, fear, and poverty, who lack real freedom because of their bad addictions and poor choices. There are others who are blinded by cheap attractions and became slaves in this world. Many others feel lonely, unwanted, rejected, and marginalized. We may be able to find victims of this kind among us, around us, and maybe under the same roof where you and I live. We are called to bring glad tidings of joy and the true Light of Christ by illumining the lives of these brothers and sisters during this Advent Season.

Our sharing of love, overflowing mercy, unconditional forgiveness, and humble service will go a long way in the lives of others. We will be able to accomplish the witnessing mission of radiating Christ's joy by repenting of our sins, asking God's pardon, renewing our lives through our daily prayers, frequenting the Sacrament of Reconciliation, taking part in the Eucharistic celebration, reading the Holy Bible in a prayerful fashion, and performing the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. Let us remember that Christmas is not complete unless we show real generosity to those who have nothing to give us in return. Christmas is a time of joyful sharing, selfless caring, and compassionate giving, as Christ himself did for you and me.


