LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Hail holy Mother, the Child-Bearer who has brought forth the King, the ruler of heaven and earth for ever.

Offertory: Blessed are you, O holy Virgin Mary, and worthy of all praise; for from you has come forth the sun of justice, Christ our God. **Communion:** Exult, O daughter of Zion, sing praises, O daughter of Jerusalem; behold, your King is coming, the Holy One, the Savior of the world.

We celebrate the Octave (eighth) day of Christmas today, which traditionally commemorated the circumcision of Christ as prescribed by Jewish law. The passage remains in today's Gospel, but the Church has added the preceding verses, which highlight Mary's motherhood of the Messiah and her contemplation of the mysteries unfolding. It is fitting that we crown the sacred Christmas Octave by proclaiming Mary's divine maternity since it is so intimately tied up with Christ's identity. If she is not the mother of God, then it follows that Christ is not God. Contrariwise, if Christ is God, then Mary is the mother of God. This is an honor like no other in all creation, so we praise her for her "yes" to the messenger Gabriel in choosing to accept the privilege of giving flesh to the invisible God and the responsibility of raising the "Savior of the world". With Mary, let us keep all these things in our hearts and reflect on the stunning beauty of God's humility in choosing to subject Himself to time, space, and all manner of limitations for our sake.

FROM THE PASTOR





"JOY TO THE WORLD"

Part 1

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"The whole earth is filled with awe at your wonders; where morning dawns, where evening fades, you call forth songs of joy."

Psalms 65:8

Every year at this season of Christmas, we hear "Joy to the World" played in many places and we sing it ourselves at Church. But a skeptic might rightly ask, "How can you sing 'Joy to the World' when the world is so messed up? When some bad guys are competing to see who can murder the greatest number of innocent people. Think of all devastation in the Ukraine. Also, there are natural disasters around the world, such as earthquakes and floods. Our inner cities are overrun with drug trafficking and gang violence. Sex trafficking of children and the vulnerable women is a thriving industry. And we are singing 'Joy to the World" and wish each other a Merry Christmas?

My suggestion is to take some moments to meditate on Psalm 98. Then you will have the reason to truly sing "Joy to the world". This psalm portrays God as the victorious warrior, bringing salvation for the whole world, but conquering and judging all who oppose Him. *The coming of Jesus Christ as Savior, King, and Judge is a cause of great*

joy for all the earth. God's people should rejoice because God has revealed His salvation through Israel in the sight of the nations. God's victory in bringing salvation should cause us to sing a new song.

Jesus was born in Bethlehem, in fulfillment of prophecy of Micah; "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times." (Micah 5:2) And the angel proclaimed to the shepherds "Do not be afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of great joy which will be for all the people; for today in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." When the psalmist tells us to sing "a new song," it isn't restricted to composing a new song or singing the new song that he has just composed, although those options are included. But beyond that, it refers to singing to the Lord when He does something new in our lives or when we have a new experience of His grace. And there is no greater experience of God's grace than the new birth that brings salvation to those who were in spiritual darkness and death. Zechariah prophesied regarding his promised son, John the Baptist, who would prepare the way of the Lord, that his role would be the Messiah...To give to His people the knowledge of salvation, by the forgiveness of their sins. Because of the tender mercy of our God, the Sunrise from on high will visit us, to shine upon those who sit in darkness and the shadow of death. To guide our feet into the way of peace."

So, the point is, when God works the miracle of salvation in your heart, forgiving all your sins, and shining His light into your darkness, He gives His eternal life to your dead soul. All because of His tender mercy, you should sing a new song to Him, praising Him for His great salvation! (Luke 1: 76) God's holy arm saved us, then He is sufficiently powerful to keep us and to provide all that we need for life and godliness.
