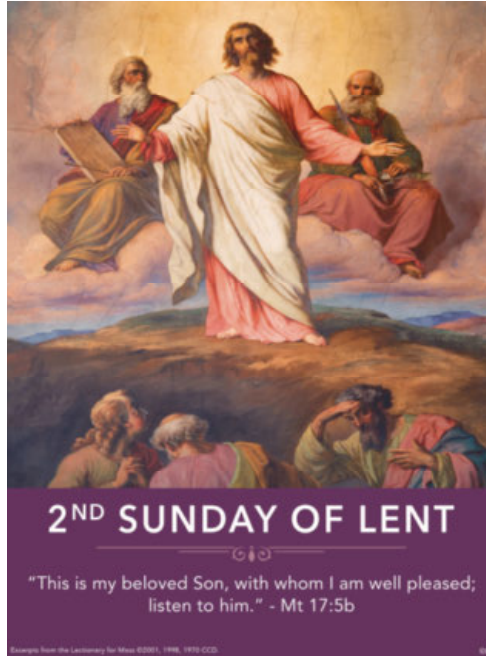

ANNUAL DIOCESAN APPEAL

In a profound moment, Jesus offered a taste of his divinity to Peter, James, and John in the Gospel today. Jesus made known the glory he had with the Father before the world began. These three disciples were privileged to witness the manifestation of the Transfiguration.

As powerful as the Transfiguration must have been (Peter was so awed, he didn't even know what he said), that encounter can't equal receiving the Eucharist! Receiving an image of God through one's eyes can't rival the privilege of taking God himself into one's body through the Eucharist.

Our community needs to know about this. When you support the Annual Diocesan Appeal, you help our parish can get the word out: God is here! He lives in our little tabernacle! It's a secret that shouldn't be kept. God doesn't want to overpower us with his transfigured divinity every day. LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Remember your mercies, Lord, and your love which is from all eternity. Do not let our enemies triumph over us; deliver us, O God of Israel, from all our tribulations.

Offertory: I shall meditate upon your commandments which I greatly love; I will extend my hands towards your commandments which I love.

Communion: Tell no one about the vision you have seen until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.

"Lord, it is good to be here." What a delight it must have been for the apostles, albeit overwhelming, to behold the transfigured Lord. It really gives us a neat perspective on the Offertory Antiphon in particular. Why would the psalmist delight in God's commandments if He hadn't possessed a personal knowledge of God? To take delight in doing what we are told (and to do more!) comes from a profound love for the person telling us to do whatever is being asked of us. It is one thing to work for a supervisor and do what is expected of you; the Scripture, "what good are servants who do what they are told?" comes to mind. God wants a wholehearted response from us – He wants our entire being poured into doing what needs to be done for the Kingdom. This is because there is no other way the Kingdom will gain traction against the world. People crave happiness and the world promises happiness. Christ's witnesses need to have experienced His Presence in their lives and partaken of the delight of His company in order to truly make Him known to others and prove that the happiness in such a relationship infinitely exceeds the fleeting joys of worldly pleasures. Let us take time this Lententide to be with Jesus daily in silent prayer and allow Him to reveal Himself to us!

FROM THE PASTOR



WELCOMING LENT 2023:

Part II

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

“Go, show your love to your wife again, though she is loved by another man and is an adulteress. Love her as the LORD loves the Israelites, though they turn to other gods and love the sacred raisin cakes” Hosea 3:1-2

GOD LOVES YOU, EVEN WHEN YOU DON'T LOVE HIM! He's inviting you to a party, a celebration of the lost finally being found—a love being restored. **Will you accept his invitation?** This God who loves you is waiting for your answer this Lent. *We cannot escape the message of God's undying love. In the book of the Prophet Hosea, the story of restoring Gomer, his unfaithful wife, to his side is an unbelievable story of the love and forgiveness we experience from our loving Lord. Hosea believed that God was great enough to do it for the people he loves. One day, word came by way of the grapevine gossip that Gomer had been deserted by her lover. She had sold herself to slavery and had hit bottom. Certainly, now Hosea would forget her. But his heart said “No”; he could not give her up. Then God spoke to him: “Go again, love a woman who is loved by her husband, yet an adulteress, even as the Lord loves the sons of Israel, though they turn to other gods” (Hos. 3:1). Can you think*

of a situation where your love and life were taken over by things other than your Savior and Redeemer, Jesus the Christ?

*Gomer was still beloved of Hosea even though she was an adulteress, and God wanted him to seek her out and prove his love to her. How could anyone love that deeply? The answer was right there in God's instructions to Hosea, “**even as the Lord loves.**” Only one who knows the love and forgiveness of God can ever love this perfectly—and one who has experienced His loving forgiveness cannot help but love and forgive others. Christian husbands are commanded to love their wives as Christ loved the Church (Eph. 5:25), and Hosea is an outstanding biblical example of that kind of love.*

How many times should a husband or wife forgive? Some argue, “If I keep forgiving, I simply affirm him in his pattern of sin.” Or “If I keep forgiving, she'll think she can get away with anything she wants.” Others say, “If I keep forgiving, it's like putting my seal of approval on his behavior.” Or “I can't take another hurt like that. If he does that one more time, I'm leaving.” Those are human responses. Listen to the response of the Lord Jesus. Peter had asked the Lord this same question: “**Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me and I forgive him? Up to seven times?**” The Lord's answer was, “**I do not say to you, up to seven times, but up to seventy times seven**” (Matt. 18:21, 22). That is a great deal of forgiveness. In fact, Christ was simply saying in a charming way that there is no end to forgiveness.

Sometimes it's just the little slights and daily agitations that need forgiveness—the occasional sharp word or angry accusation. But we harbor them, let them eat at us, and build up bitterness and resentment which erode our relationship. Maybe it's a major offense, like Gomer's, and we can never forget it. We stew on it and fret over it, and we keep bringing it up in a subconscious attempt to punish our spouses for the hurt we have suffered. We try to forgive, but a few days later it's right there again, preying on our consciousness. Big wounds sometimes take longer to heal. They will come back to our minds. There is no way to avoid it. But every time they do, we must first remind ourselves that we really did forgive, then rehearse how much God has forgiven us, then ask Him to take the destructive, unforgiving thoughts out of our minds. We are blessed to have this season of Lent to help us open ourselves to learn to forgive and let go of any resentment and anger. Please don't give up on anybody because God has never and will never give up on you. Our Father... forgive us as we forgive...
