

Today Jesus specifically blesses "those who have not seen and have believed" (John 20:29). If you haven't seen Jesus, you have a special potential for blessedness. That's us!

It's a special joy that comes from hope. Confidently hoping for the fulfillment of our desire is a joyful state. Enduring in such hope *increases* our capacity for joy.

Oh, joy upon joy! Indeed, "All the way to heaven is heaven," as a saying attributed to St. Catherine of Siena goes. Please support our Annual Diocesan Appeal so we can help others access this joy. As a parish, we rejoice to have such a massive hope for one another. Please help us reach souls who labor in quiet despair because without you, we can't reach them. Pray, donate, and sacrifice for our Appeal. By giving with the confidence that "gifts will be given to you" (Luke 6:38). *Blessed* are those who have not seen and have believed. *Believe* in what Christ can do through our parish for this local community. Believe because "Hope does not disappoint" (Romans 5:5). Alleluia!

### LITURGICAL NOTES

**Entrance:** I am risen, and I am always with you, alleluia; you have placed your hand upon me, alleluia; your wisdom has been shown to be most wonderful, alleluia, alleluia.

**Offertory:** The earth trembled and was still, when God arose in judgment, alleluia. **Communion:** Christ, our Paschal Lamb, has been sacrificed, alleluia; therefore, let us keep the feast by sharing the unleavened bread of uprightness and truth, alleluia, alleluia.

Christ is risen! The exuberance of the Easter Vigil gives way to the awed contemplation of the Entrance Antiphon on this happy Easter Day: "your wisdom has been shown to be most wonderful". Shock over the Resurrection has now turned into happy wonderment. The Wisdom of God is far beyond our comprehension and brings things to completion in a way more perfect than all the greatest minds in the world trying to solve a problem. This sense of awe is beautifully captured in the Offertory Antiphon, which speaks of the trembling of the earth descending into stillness "when God arose". The Scripture of God "passing by" Moses in silence, preceded by the storms, fire, etc., comes to mind. St. Paul brings our prayerful considerations to a close by calling us to reform our lives based on this new reality. The Passover has always been understood by the Church to be deeply symbolic of the drama of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. St. Paul, in the Communion Antiphon, delves into this and speaks of the unleavened bread as a symbol of our Christian living. In context, he says to put away the "old leaven" of wickedness and malice; even the smallest amount of a leavening agent can change the makeup of bread, so we are being called to simplicity, embracing truth, which will set us free, and uprightness, or good deeds among other things, in response to the newfound freedom that Truth has given us. Let us rejoice this sacred week and let our joy pour over into our interactions with others. The world is STARVED for joy – let your "chalice" overflow for others! ## FROM THE PASTOR



### THE JOY OF THE RESURRECTION

#### Part II

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

### "And the disciples were filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit" Acts 13:51

Alleluia, the Lord is risen! In the gospel of Matthew in his account of the Resurrection experiences we find this statement: "Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went away quickly from the tomb, fearful yet overjoyed, and ran to announce the news to his disciples. And behold, Jesus met them on their way and greeted them" (Mt. 28:8-9). They went away "fearful" but also "overjoyed". What a fascinating combination! These two experiences do not at first seem like they go hand in hand. How is one fearful while also filled with joy? Wouldn't fear undermine joy? And wouldn't joy seem to cast out fear? This all depends upon what sort of "fear" these holy women were experiencing.

It seems that the fear these women were experiencing was one of the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit, the gift of holy fear. This is not a fear in the normal sense of being afraid. Rather, it's a fear that is better defined as a deep reverence, wonder and awe. It's a gift that enabled these women to recognize the depth of what they were presently experiencing. They were in awe, "holy shock", amazement and filled with joy all at the same time. They would have suddenly experienced the amazing realization and hope that Jesus had beaten death itself. They were most likely confused but also filled with a faith that left them with a conviction that something extraordinary had just taken place.

This is the experience we must have these days of Easter. This an opportunity for us when we should spend extra time trying to penetrate and experience the same experience these holy women had as they first discovered that Jesus was no longer in the tomb. We must let ourselves engage the mystery of the Resurrection. We must see it for what it is. We must strive to comprehend this gift and the amazing fact that in His Resurrection, Jesus destroys the effects of sin. He destroys death itself. Truly amazing! This gives us hope for when we die; we are bound for resurrection because of Jesus.

It is important to ask yourself: Do you understand the Resurrection of Christ? It's a humbling truth for each of us to admit that we need to understand the Resurrection more. We must not only let the truth of the Resurrection sink in, we must also allow the effects of the Resurrection to change us. We must allow the Resurrection of Christ to enter our souls and invite us to share in this new life today.

As these holy women left the tomb, the Scripture tells us that they met the Resurrected Christ on their way. It tells us that when they saw Jesus, they, "**approached, embraced his feet, and did him homage.**" This is no small act of adoration and love. This act of worship and adoration of Jesus shows that they not only believed, but also acted by worshiping Him. We must do the same. As you do this, let yourself come face to face with the Risen Lord and let Him begin to transform your life more deeply!

Lord, I believe You rose victorious over sin and

death. Allow me, especially during this season of Easter, to enter the great mystery of Your Resurrection. Help me to understand and experience this overwhelming glory in my life and be drawn to adore you and worship you.
