

HOLY COMFORTER HAS EXCEEDED OUR ANNUAL DIOCESAN APPEAL GOAL! THANK YOU!!

In today's Gospel, Jesus reveals that a wonderful day is approaching. Of it, He says, "On that day you will realize that I am in my Father, and you are in me and I in you" (John 14:20). It can be easy to miss the magnitude of what He is saying, either because it's strange or because of our familiarity with His words.

He is describing oneness. God is Spirit, inviting us to spiritual oneness with him. The spiritual world can seem so delicate and perfect that it becomes synonymous with "practically irrelevant." Becoming one with God is possibly the *most* practical of all things. When Jesus is in you, possibilities are endless: "For God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26).

And God doesn't stop at spiritual oneness with us. He wants us to be one with each other, too. Our parish is here to facilitate both. Our Annual Diocesan Appeal needs you to succeed. God is alive in our parish, and we want others to taste and see. Please give to our Appeal so that we can help others experience the satisfying love of Jesus. He waits only for our "yes" to bring his transforming light into the lives of his children here!

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Spread the news with a voice of joy; let it be heard, alleluia; speak it out to the very ends of the earth; the Lord has liberated his people, alleluia, alleluia.

Offertory: O nations, bless the Lord our God, let the voice of his praises resound; he has restored my soul to life and he has not suffered my feet to stumble; blessed be the Lord who has neither rejected my prayer nor turned his mercy away from me, alleluia.

Communion: I will not leave you orphans, I will come to you again, alleluia; and your heart will rejoice, alleluia, alleluia.

With the Easter season nearly spent, the Church begins turning her gaze toward Pentecost with a greater emphasis on the gift of the Holy Spirit. The focus shifts from pure joy and praise to exhortations to share the Good News of Jesus' triumph over sin and death through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection. In the Offertory we see the use of "nations", which comes from the Latin gentes, which is where we get the English word gentiles, or non-Jews. It is easy to become overwhelmed by the thought of converting the world, though. Our Lord, in the depths of His tenderness, speaks to this fear, promising the apostles "I will not leave you orphans". What consoling words! Evangelization begins with the experience of God's love for us individually, which translates to wanting to share the peace and happiness we feel with others. May the Holy Spirit find a welcome place in our hearts and communicate to us the Love of God that never grows tired of pursuing us and never stales in the delights it produces in the soul. Consider spending time in adoration during our upcoming 40 **Hours Devotion** to encounter the love of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament!

FROM THE PASTOR





THE JOY OF THE RESURRECTION

Part VI

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy"

Matthew 25:23

As Christians, hanging on to the promise of eternal life with our Savior can bring an infinite Joy and hope to our lives. The Hope of Eternal Life is a human yearning that is both deeply personal and widely shared. For Christians, that hope is confessed regularly. As we declare in the Apostles' Creed, "I believe in . . . the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting." Likewise, in the Nicene Creed, we and the whole Church confess, "We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come."

The story of a life that will culminate in joy consists of two parts. First, it's about the fidelity we are called to have in this life to the service of the will of God. Second, it's a promise of Jesus' fidelity back to us, both here on Earth

and, ultimately, when we meet Him at the time of our death.

What a blessing it would be to hear Jesus say these words to us upon the completion of our lives here on Earth: "Well done, good and faithful servant...Come, share your master's joy." This begs the question: if you were to die today, what would our Lord say to you? If you are not immediately confident that in His mercy He would say these words above, then today is a good day to make some changes in your life.

A good spiritual practice is to live today in such a way that we are consciously preparing for that glorious meeting with Jesus. What "responsibilities" has He entrusted to you in this life and what are you doing with them? Are you seeking to place all your gifts at the service of the Gospel and the spreading of charity? Are you diligent in giving of yourself to God and His holy will? Hopefully there is no hesitation in your answer. If there is, this is a sign that God may want more of you here and now.

One of the biggest problems we often struggle with in this world is the temptation to seek worldly satisfaction here and now, "the instant joy" like our "instant coffee" or "fast food", at the expense of building up Heavenly treasure. But why? Why seek momentary and superficial satisfaction here and now and risk losing eternal joy?

I invite you to reflect upon the ultimate goal that you should have in life — of being fully prepared for that glorious encounter with our Lord as you pass from this life to the next. Heaven may seem a bit intangible right now, but when the time comes to meet Jesus face-to-face, it will not be intangible in the slightest way. Instead, you will immediately be made aware of every detail of your life here on Earth. Your fidelity, day in and day out, or the lack of fidelity, day in and day out, will become either the source of your eternal joy or the source of eternal regret.

We pray: Lord, Free me from selfish and momentary goals in life so that I can seek to serve You only in the way that produces joy in Your Sacred Heart. Help me to keep my eyes on Heaven and to prepare daily for that eternal joy with you. Jesus, I trust in You.
