LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: All nations, clap your hands; shout unto God with a voice of joy. **Offertory:** As a holocaust of rams and bullocks, and of thousands of fatted lambs, so let our sacrifice be in your sight on this day, that it may be pleasing unto you. For there is no shame for those who put their trust in you, O Lord.

Communion: Christ, rising from the dead, dies now no more, alleluia; death shall no longer have an-y dominion over him, alleluia, alleluia. *Easter makes a brief appearance this weekend with St. Paul reminding us that in dying with Christ we shall rise with Him. The Communion Antiphon, also an Easter chant, alludes to this in its declaration that Christ is no longer dead. This grounds us in hope as we take up our daily crosses as mentioned in the Gospel. The Offertory offers us a beautiful prayer from the Psalms as a meditation in response to Christ's call in the Gospel. Trusting in the power of His resurrection, we can bear our trials with serenity, offering them to God in union with that saving Cross that paid the debt of our sins. Let us therefore "shout unto God with a voice of joy", giving thanks for the nourishment we will receive today in the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus. Jesus, I trust in You!*


HAITI: There will be a Haiti Craft Fair table at "Finally Home Animal Haven," 7251 Blenheim Rd, Scottsville on Saturday, July 8th from 9p.m. The rain date is July 9th. We have had many accomplishments this past year that we should all be proud of. We had a complete school year with eighteen graduates and over 650 students being fed and educated. The medical team had over 3,000 patients, a plethora of healthy newborn and a vaccination program for the school and village youth. We had solar batteries replaced in the clinic and a complete solar grid for rectory and church providing 24/7 power. We repaired a quarter mile of two major Saltadare water lines and moved them in the process to prevent future damage. The list goes on. ALL OF THIS WAS ACCOMPLISHED BY THE KINDNESS AND GOODNESS of the Tri-Parish parishioners through student sponsorship, and donations. You have fed the hungry, cared for the sick, and provided hope. The antithesis of this is that the school and clinic programs will cease this fall. We need your financial support. The anticipated enrollment is double our current sponsorship of around 350 students, the financial foundation of the ministry. Please remember to keep St.Michel, Saltadare, and Haiti in your prayers. FROM THE PASTOR



IMMERSED IN THE LIFE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT Part IV

"You, however, are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if in fact the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him" Romans 8:9

How do I know if the Holy Spirit is in me? While certain ministries of the Holy Spirit may involve a feeling, such as conviction of sin, comfort, and empowerment, Scripture does not instruct us to base our relationship with the Holy Spirit on how or what we feel. Every baptized person has the indwelling Holy Spirit. Jesus told us that when the Comforter comes, He will be with us and in us. "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever—the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you" (Jn. 14:16-17). In other words, Jesus is sending one like Himself to be with us and in us. We know the Holy Spirit is with us because God's Word tells us that it is so.

Every baptized person is indwelt by the Holy Spirit, but not every believer is controlled by the Holy Spirit, and there is a distinct difference. When we act according to our flesh, we are not under the control of the Holy Spirit even though we are still indwelt by Him. The apostle Paul comments on this truth, and he uses an illustration that helps us to understand. **"Do not get drunk on** wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit" (Eph. 5:18). Many people read this verse and interpret it to mean that the apostle Paul is speaking against wine. However, the context of this passage is the walk and the warfare of the Spiritfilled believer. Therefore, there is something more here than just a warning about drinking too much wine. When people are drunk with too much wine, they exhibit certain characteristics: they become clumsy, their speech is unclear, and their judgment is impaired. The apostle Paul sets up a comparison here. Just as there are certain characteristics that identify someone who is controlled by too much wine, there should also be certain characteristics that identify someone who is controlled by the Holy Spirit.

We read in Galatians 5:22-24, about the "fruit" of the Spirit. This is the Holy Spirit's fruit, and it is exhibited by those baptized who are under His control. Ephesians 5:18 ("...Instead, be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit"), indicates a continual process of "being filled" by the Holy Spirit. Since it is an exhortation, it follows that it is also possible not to be filled or controlled by the Spirit. The rest of Ephesians 5 gives us the characteristics of a Spirit-filled believer. "Speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs. Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ" (Eph. 5:19-21).

We are not filled with the Spirit because we feel we are, but because this is the privilege and possession of the Christian. Being filled or controlled by the Spirit is the result of walking in obedience to the Lord. This is a gift of grace and not an emotional feeling. Emotions can and will deceive us, and we can work ourselves up into an emotional frenzy that is purely from the flesh and not of the Holy Spirit. **"So I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh...Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit" (Gal. 5:6, 25)**.

Having said that, we cannot deny that there are times when we can be overwhelmed by the presence and the power of the Spirit, and this is often an emotional experience. When that happens, it is a joy like no other. King David **"danced with all his might" (2 Sam. 6:14)**, when they brought up the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem. Experiencing joy by the Spirit is the understanding that as children of God we are being blessed by His grace. So, absolutely, the ministries of the Holy Spirit can involve our feelings and emotions. At the same time, we are not to base the assurance of our possession of the Holy Spirit on how we feel.
