

HAITI: There will be a Haiti Craft Fair table at "Finally Home Animal Haven," 7251 Blenheim Rd, Scottsville on Saturday, July 8th from 9p.m. The rain date is July 9th. We have had many accomplishments this past year that we should all be proud of. We had a complete school year with eighteen graduates and over 650 students being fed and educated. The medical team had over 3,000 patients, a plethora of healthy newborn and a vaccination program for the school and village youth. We had solar batteries replaced in the clinic and a complete solar grid for rectory and church providing 24/7 power. We repaired a quarter mile of two major Saltadare water lines and moved them in the process to prevent future damage. The list goes on. ALL OF THIS WAS ACCOMPLISHED BY THE KINDNESS AND GOODNESS of the Tri-Parish parishioners through student sponsorship, and donations. You have fed the hungry, cared for the sick, and provided hope. The antithesis of this is that the school and clinic programs will cease this fall. We need your financial support. The anticipated enrollment is double our current sponsorship of around 350 students, the financial foundation of the ministry. FROM THE PASTOR



IMMERSED IN THE LIFE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT
Part V

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"Now it is God who makes both us and you stand firm in Christ.

He anointed us, set his seal of ownership on us, and put his Spirit in our hearts as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come.

2 Corinthians. 1:21-22

We have been anointed to love and serve the living God – the Savior who liberated us from the slavery of sin, death, and Satan. Jesus was anointed with the Holy Spirit to fulfill the mission his Father sent him to accomplish. We are called Christians, which means "those who belong to the Anointed One." God has anointed us with the same Holy Spirit who came upon Jesus when he was baptized by John in the Jordan River. We have been anointed for the King's service, to live for his pleasure and glory. This is the noblest of callings – to serve the living God and to offer our lives to him as a living sacrifice of praise. But how do we go about this serving the living God? That is where the gifts of the Holy Spirit are needed for us to carry out this noble duty.

One of the many benefits of being a Catholic is that you gain the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit when you undergo the Sacrament of Confirmation. You may have heard of these seven gifts before, but what exactly are they and how do they manifest in our lives? Receiving the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit not only improves our spiritual life, but they may also improve our overall living if we make them part of our character. If you are a confirmed Catholic, pondering whether to proceed with your Confirmation, or curious about the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, here is how you can apply the seven gifts in your daily life.

Wisdom: Be as wise as Solomon when you receive the gift of wisdom. This gift manifests by making us more capable of making choices based on our Christian faith and virtues. With the Holy Spirit's wisdom, we are able to decide, speak, think, act, and pray like Christ. "Gold and glass cannot equal wisdom, nor can it be exchanged for jewels or vessels of fine gold." - Job 28:17. Understanding: Next to wisdom, the Holy Spirit also gives us understanding as a valuable gift. "But aren't wisdom and understanding the same thing?"

While they may be closely related etymologically, wisdom and understanding manifest in different ways. Wisdom is a process that occurs entirely in thought; understanding, on the other hand, is a gift of the Holy Spirit that dwells in your heart. When you 'understand' a situation the same way Christ would, you 'think' with the goodness of your heart. The manifestations of understanding do not end there. The gift of understanding also grants you the ability to further understand miracles, verses, signs sent by God that may not be immediately obvious to someone who has not received Christ, the mysteries of our faith, and many others. There is so much to understand in the environment that God has given us-- and we will easily understand them when we accept the second gift of the Holy Spirit. "But there is a spirit in man; and the inspiration of the Almighty gives them understanding." - Job 32:8.

Counsel/Right Judgement: The gifts of the Holy Spirit do not manifest only in our hearts and minds: the third gift encourages us to discern based on our Christian faith and to consistently choose good over evil. The gift of counsel or right judgment manifests in the ability to do what is right, and to make decisions that would benefit the Lord. "And they said unto him, "ask counsel". We pray to you, oh God, that we may know whether our way shall be prosperous." - Judges 18:5.
