NEXT WEEK'S READINGS

Transfiguration of The Lord

First Reading Daniel 7:9-10,13-14 The prophet Daniel describes his vision of one like the Son of Man who received dominion from God. **Responsorial Psalm** Psalm 97:1-2,5-6,9 A Song of Praise to God our King.

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: God is in his holy dwelling place; the God who causes us to dwell together, one at heart, in his house; he himself will give power and strength to his people.

Offertory: I will extol you, O Lord, for you have drawn me up, and have not let my foes rejoice over me. O Lord, I cried unto you and you healed me. **Communion:** The kingdom of heaven is like unto a merchant seeking fine pearls; having found one of great worth, he went and sold all that he had, and he bought it.

There is a harmonious relationship between Solomon's desire for wisdom in the first reading and the fulfillment of that desire in the Gospel, where Jesus, Wisdom Incarnate, reveals to us "little ones" the mysteries of the Kingdom. But it is not without cost. In fact – it costs us EVERYTHING. The fine pearl and the treasure in the field are bought after the merchant and person respectively sell all their possessions to have the necessary

funds. What is striking about the "person" buying the treasure in the fields PLEASE KEEP HOLY COMFORTER IN MIND DURING is that he does so "joyfully". When we see the Kingdom for what it is, i.e., abiding in the Presence of "the God who causes us to dwell together, one at heart, in his house", we want nothing else because deep down we know nothing will satisfy us more than intimacy with our Creator. Let us examine our lives and seek to remove those things that attach us to earthly living and make us forget heaven, lest "my foes rejoice over me". The Devil wants to distract us with short-term happiness, but God will "give power and strength to his people" if we but call upon Him in times of temptation. Keep the faith!

FROM THE PASTOR



OUR STRENGTH IS THE EUCHARIST Part II

"Jesus said to them, 'Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you'" John. 6:53

God was not content merely with giving us His only Son once for all, willing Him to take flesh in the womb of a Virgin – flesh like ours – so that He might suffer and die for us on the Cross; He wished Him to remain with us forever, perpetuating His Real Presence and His sacrifice in the Eucharist. And what does this mean for us? It means we must learn to discover that, without Jesus, our lives are unbalanced, unfocused, lacking in direction, lacking in purpose – We have no life. Christ is truly with us – only in him can we find the answers that we are looking for, only in him do we have life.

So then, have we opened our eyes and ears to see and hear Him? Is He truly the source of our life? Or is He merely another item on our list of activities? This is a challenge to be undertaken both at a personal level as well as a social level. But do you have a deeper understanding of the Eucharist? How many of our separated brothers and sisters hold false or biased conceptions of the Eucharistic *Jesus? How many of our friends are ignorant of the treasure we have in the Eucharist?*

In our problem-solving world, science and technology intensify our craving to discover more about the world. How about your yearning to know and love Jesus who is ever present to solve the "mysteries" we face today in our era? In this secular environment, many people have little time for God, and the Eucharist is not appreciated. As we search for deeper meaning, often not knowing where to begin, we open the door for an appreciation of the Eucharist. Opening it, we discover that the Eucharist is Love Incarnate — Jesus Himself, the source and summit of human love, in Whom there is life. The "more" that we seek is found here, where we experience His presence with wonder and awe and realize that human love springs from God who is love.

A loving relationship with Jesus leads us to the Eucharist and is climaxed in our union with Him in holy Communion. In turn, this union intensifies our love for Him and grounds the love we have for one another. We enter a unique union with Jesus, as we receive the host and become one with him. For a few precious moments, we experience His great love for us and admit our unworthiness. As we commit ourselves to follow Him, we enter the depths of this mystery and become one with Jesus, who was born into this world, died for us, and rose from the dead. Aware of His presence within us, we pledge to follow Him, atone for our sins, and live the life He modeled for us.

Yes, the Eucharist is more than a symbol reminding us of Jesus, for at Mass the bread and wine become Jesus Himself. To appreciate this great mystery requires faith and is greatly enhanced by the manner of our lives. Living a good life is our best preparation for receiving the Eucharist, which then strengthens us to continue living that way. No doubt the dimension of living a life patterned to the Eucharistic Jesus is highlighted at the conclusion of every Mass with the words, "Go in peace, to love and serve the Lord." Indeed, it is through our lives of faithful and generous service that the meaning of the Eucharist is completely revealed. Think about that!
