### LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Behold, O God our protector, and consider the face of your Anointed; for one day in your house is better than a thousand elsewhere.

Offertory: The Angel of the Lord shall encamp round about those who fear him and shall deliver them; taste and see how good the Lord is.

**Communion:** My house will be called a house of prayer, says the Lord; everyone who asks here, will receive, and he who seeks will find, and to him who knocks, it will be opened.

Faith is the gateway to a fruitful spiritual life – to everything, really. The faith of the Canaanite woman overcame the obstacle of her nationality ("I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel"). There are many such stories with both Jews and Gentiles. We can only receive with the measure that we believe. When the Communion Antiphon proclaims to us Christ's promise that "everyone who asks[...] will receive, and he who seeks will find", it means to say that our asking and seeking needs to come from a place of true prayer, from a real desire to assistance to our overall Parish operations and to better know and love God. Such a disposition often needs to be tested to prove its genuineness. Let us persevere in prayer with the knowledge that God knows our deepest desires even before we speak them and wishes to bless us superabundantly. Jesus, I Trust in You!



### FROM THE DIRECTOR OF LITURGY & MUSIC



### EUCHARISTIC MUSINGS PART II Daniel Kirkland

As we enter into the second year of the Eucharistic Revival, which is focused on renewed devotion to the Eucharist at the parish level, it is important to consider a Latin phrase that is popular in theological circles but is also quite practical: *Lex orandi lex credendi*. The law of prayer is the law of belief, or in other words – our (public) prayer affects our belief. This is especially true regarding the Eucharist.

Think about it. If we approach Mass in a casual manner both in how we prepare ourselves and in the liturgical choices we make, there is a grave danger that our belief in the Eucharist will be undermined. The Pew Research Center did a study in February 2019 that indicated only 31% of Catholics in this country believe that the bread and wine used at Mass become the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ. The rest believe that the Eucharistic bread and wine are merely symbolic. Why is this the case? While there is no simple answer, I would venture to say that liturgical practices played a significant role based on the aforementioned Latin phrase. Eucharistic renewal, then, goes hand-in-hand with liturgical renewal. This renewal must begin with the *experience* of the sacred. Fr. Robert Skeris, a great liturgical scholar and musician, very interestingly described religion as **"perception of the fundamental lack of symmetry between the Divine and the Human, as well as the possible establishment of a peaceful relationship between both which is included in that perception." We must experience God in His transcendence if we are to appreciate His infinite condescension to our human state and savor the intimacy of His Presence in the Eucharist, all of which lead us to true worship.** 

How do we rediscover this "sense of the sacred"? We must start by embracing our Catholicism. To be Catholic is to be rooted in history and tradition. Continuity with our past is essential to the preservation of our beliefs because the Church has always viewed the Liturgy as an expression of apostolic faith. Any changes made to our worship should be careful and modest. The Vatican Council sought exactly to do that!

Sacrosanctum Concilium, the Council's document on the Liturgy, establishes many useful principles for true reform, one of the most important being the education of the Faithful to promote the exterior and interior active participation that is so essential to fruitful worship. In short, our experience of the sacred needs to be rooted in our greater understanding and embracing of our Roman tradition, which has a sacred language – Latin (SC 36§1)– and a sacred music – Gregorian Chant (SC 116). The document leaves many other things unchanged such as *ad orientem* ("toward the east") worship, with the priest and people both oriented toward the Eucharist, and altar rails, which highlight the wedding banquet of the Lamb where heaven and earth meet.

All these practices endured through the centuries because they helped the Faithful experience that asymmetry between God and Man. The centrality of the Eucharist in our worship cannot be overemphasized because it is the Second Person of the Trinity Who is made present in the Sacrament. If we convince ourselves that God is satisfied with mediocrity in our worship, it becomes easy to trivialize the Divine Presence and undermine our ability to be grateful, which leads us to forget the Gift that was given for our salvation and its great cost.

Let us, then, approach Holy Mass with a renewed sense of awe at the supreme selflessness of Christ in pouring Himself out to save us from sin and death and His incredible vulnerability in choosing to remain with us in the world under the hidden forms of bread and wine. St. Thomas Aquinas beautifully spoke of the Real Presence in a hymn: "Truth Himself speaks truly; else nothing is true."
