### NEXT WEEK'S READINGS

Twenty-Fifth Sunday In Ordinary Time First Reading Isaiah 55:6-9 God's ways are far beyond the ways of human beings. Responsorial Psalm Psalm 145:2-3,8-9,17-18 God is near to those who call upon him.

### LITURGICAL NOTES

**Entrance:** Grant peace to those who are waiting for you, O Lord, so that your prophets may be proved trustworthy; hear the prayers of your servant and of your people Israel.

**Offertory:** Moses consecrated an altar to the Lord, and presented thereupon burnt offerings and sacrificial victims; he made an evening sacrifice as a fragrant offering to the Lord, in the presence of the sons of Israel. **Communion:** Bring up your sacrifices and come into his courts; adore the Lord in his holy temple.

We have yet again another interesting dialogue between the readings and the propers. Similar to last week, the Antiphons are exceedingly worshipful, acknowledging our need to offer sacrifices to the Lord in acknowledgment of His omnipotence. This never-ending power of God places Him in a position to exercise mercy. We have all sinned, and even the smallest of these is an infinite offense to God, Who is perfectly Just. Yet He is also perfectly merciful. The readings today tell us that instead of receiving what we deserve, we are judged by how we treat others. It is a wonderful invitation to participate in God's own work of salvation for humanity! So let us "bring up [our own] sacrifices" to Mass, uniting them to the One Sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross that atoned for all our faults, and we will find an abundance of mercy for ourselves and those in our lives in most need of it. Jesus, I trust in you!

Eucharistic Musings: Part The End By Daniel Kirkland

Many thanks to Dr. Bugbee for his contributions to this series on the Eucharist in Father's absence. I wish to end this with some considerations about bringing the Eucharist into our daily lives. The pre-eminent means of doing this besides attending daily Mass is *Eucharistic adoration*.

Reserving the Blessed Sacrament outside of Mass is a practice that goes all the way back to the beginnings of the Church. St. Basil (d. 379) was said to have divided the Eucharistic bread he consecrated into three parts: one part for his consumption, one for his brother monastics, and one to be kept for the sick. As understanding of what the Eucharist was grew, so too did people's inclination to remain in the Presence, offering adoration and thanksgiving.

In the year of Our Lord 1079, Pope Gregory VII required a prominent theologian who denied the Real Presence of Jesus in the bread and wine to make a confession: **"I believe in my heart and openly profess that the bread and wine that are placed on the altar are, through the mystery of the sacred prayer and the words of the Redeemer, substantially changed into the true and proper and lifegiving flesh and blood of Jesus Christ our Lord, and that after the consecration they are the true body of Christ."** This confession rekindled in Christendom a love for the Eucharist, inspiring people like St. Francis of Assisi to spread Eucharistic adoration throughout Italy. Pope Urban IV "sealed the deal" by instituting the feast of Corpus Christi in 1264. St. Thomas Aquinas was asked to write several hymns in honor of the Eucharist and even the Proper texts for the Mass! The last two verses of his *Verbum Supernum Prodiens* are the famous hymn, "O Salutaris Hostia", and the last two verses of his *Pange Lingua Gloriosi* the "Tantum Ergo", both of which are used at holy hours even today.

The USCCB tells us that adoration "is an extension of the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which occurs in every Mass: 'Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.' Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church."

Spending time with Jesus in front of a tabernacle or monstrance (the ornate display vessels used at holy hours) extends the saving consequences of the Mass even after it is finished, just as the Mass itself extends the consequences of the Sacrifice of Calvary. Truly, our Lord is

fulfilling his promise to remain with us until the end of time! He is always there in the churches waiting for us, longing for us, as we long to be reunited with a dear friend or a beloved family member who has been away. It is enough to be in His Presence and let Him love us.

This year of Eucharistic revival is focused on parish life. Let us then live out this call to renewal by increasing our sense of reverence at Mass by affirming our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the sacramental bread and wine through devoted attentiveness and efforts to add greater solemnity to the Liturgy. Finally, let us commit ourselves to more "visits" to the Sacrament either during prescribed holy hours where we can affirm our belief in a public way or by quiet, daily visits to be with our precious Savior, with Whom we hope to spend eternity in saecula saeculorum.
