

NEXT WEEK'S READINGS

In Ordinary Time

First Reading Ezekiel 18:25-28

It is possible to turn from sin and preserve one's life.

Responsorial Psalm *Psalm 25:4-9*A prayer to God for mercy.

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: I am the salvation of the people, says the Lord; from whatever tribulations they cry out to me, I will give heed to them; and I will be their Lord for ever.

Offertory: If I walk in the midst of tribulation you shall preserve my life, O Lord; you shall stretch forth your hand against the fury of my enemies; your right hand has delivered me.

Communion: You have ordered that your commandments be kept diligently; O that my ways may be guided towards the keeping of your statutes. Isaiah's inspiring yet chilling opening words set the tone for everything today: "Seek the LORD while he may be found, call him while he is near." There is great confidence in this statement, backed up by the Entrance and Offertory Antiphons, which boldly proclaim that God will listen tot hose who call out to Him for help in their troubles. Their lives shall be preserved from the "fury of [their] enemies", i.e., the Devil and the power of Hell who seek to destroy our souls and enslave us for all eternity. God WANTS to save us and infinitely, insatiably desires us to call upon Him because He perfectly respects our free will and will never impose. He is the consummate lover! Yet, the confidence in these passages is tempered by a warning: "while he may be found...while he is near". Obviously, the implication is that the time of mercy is limited. For most of us, the "Day of Mercy" ends when we die and have to account for our lives. Let our ways "be guided towards the keeping of [His] statures" so that when that moment of death arrives, we will have created the habit of saying "Yes!" to God and will be ready to meet Him with confidence and never-ending joy.

FROM THE PASTOR



THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY The TABERNACLE

PART I

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

The Word became fresh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

John 1:14

These six weeks from September 24th until October 29th, 2023, I invite you to take a journey with me reflecting on the Blessed Virgin Mary as *The Tabernacle*. Consider the tabernacle, that place of awe and wonder described often in the Old Testament, especially in the book of Exodus. From cherubim stitched into towering curtains to pillars overlaid with gold, the size and beauty of the tabernacle would have taken our breath away. Yet, inside all of that artistry and engineering was something (or Someone) even more spectacular: "They are to make a sanctuary for me so that I may dwell among them" (Ex. 25:8). But as spectacular as the tabernacle must have been and as breathtaking as it would have been to see the cloud of God's presence descend (Ex. 40:34), it was only a shadow of a coming, greater reality.

In the Old Covenant, God's presence or glory had dwelt in the tabernacle according to the instructions given to Moses. But access to God's tabernacle was prohibited, with the exception of the high priest, who could approach it only on the day of atonement after many sin offerings. Because of Israel's sin, the tabernacle was lost and God's concrete dwelling among His people was taken away in the exile, which continued up to Jesus' day. But with Mary's *fiat* at the Annunciation, God reestablished, in a greater and more intimate way, His dwelling among

Israel. Rather than dwelling in a tabernacle made of gold and lined with precious gems, God made His dwelling within the flesh and blood of a human person: the Blessed Virgin Mary. She is the ultimate tabernacle, gilded not by gold but by the grace of God. She is adorned not with gems but with virtues, and an abundance of graces, particularly humility and love. The Catechism notes that, in Mary, God the Father finally finds a proper dwelling place among men for His presence.

Jesus did more than descend in a cloud. He wrapped Himself in human flesh in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mry and walked among the people He had made. Through Jesus, man experienced fellowship with God undivided by poles and curtains. Yet even as we read about the Son of God walking and talking with man in the Gospels, we're still just seeing shadows. God's desire to dwell among the Israelites in the portable tabernacle and Christ's willingness to take on flesh and live among mankind both point forward to the ultimate, full union of God and His people.

Since Eden, God has desired to dwell among His people, and now "in Mary, the Holy Spirit fulfills the plan of the Father's loving goodness" (CCC 723). What we know is that after the Annunciation Mary bears God in her womb. Just as the ark contained the tablets of the old law, the manna, and the staff of Aaron, Mary holds in her womb Jesus Christ the Messiah, who is the new law, the living bread from heaven, and the true high priest who offers His own life for us.

By the overshadowing of the Holy Spirit, Mary becomes the new and paramount ark. Just as the ark of the covenant was made holy by its precious contents, so Mary is made holy by the Son of God made flesh within her womb and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. If the ark (the Tabernacle) of the covenant was rightfully revered in Israel's liturgy, it should be no surprise that the ark of the New Covenant, Mary, has a place of great honor in the liturgy and life of the new Israel, the Church. After all, God has placed Mary in the midst of His heavenly temple and has crowned her with a crown of twelve stars. The Catechism declares: "Mary, the all-holy ever-virgin Mother of God, is the masterwork of the mission of the Son and the Spirit in the fullness of time" (CCC 721). As God's "masterwork," it is no wonder why all generations call her blessed.
