NEXT WEEK'S READINGS

Twenty-Seventh Sunday In Ordinary Time First Reading Isaiah 5:1-7 The Lord compares the house of Israel to a vineyard. Responsorial Psalm Psalm 80:9,12-16,19-20 The Lord protects his vineyard, the house of Israel.

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: At the name of the Lord let every knee bend, in heaven, on earth and under the earth; for the Lord became obedient unto death, even death on the Cross; that is why Jesus Christ is the Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Offertory: Upon the rivers of Babylon, there we sat down and we wept, as we remembered you, O Zion.

Communion: Be mindful of your word to your servant, O Lord, in which you caused me to hope; this has been my comfort in my affliction. The Entrance Antiphon for this Sunday crowns the entire month of September, which was dedicated to the Holy Cross and Our Lady of Sorrows. It was Christ's obedience unto death on the Cross that led to our redemption from the powers of hell. This idea of obedience is highlighted in the Gospel as well. At the same time, we see God's mercy at work because the disobedient son eventually did reconsider his actions and accomplished the will of his father. This should give us great consolation because our obedience to the Father isn't always easy; His mercy is the "word to your servant" that causes us to hope amidst our afflictions. As we wrap up the month of the Cross and enter the month dedicated to the Rosary, let us reflect on the need to take up our daily crosses and follow our Lord to Calvary where we shall die to self and learn to live for others. Here will we find our true happiness that will be a foretaste of the end of our exile in this valley of tears. Hail, faithful Cross!

FROM THE PASTOR



THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY The TABERNACLE PART II Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"For he has regarded the lowliness of his Maidservant, for behold, from this day all generations will call me blessed." Luke 1:48

The dignity that Mary has is because of the ONE SHE BROUGHT FORTH: our Lord Jesus, the SON of GOD, whom neither anybody nor anything can contain. The Blessed Virgin Mary, conscious of such an overwhelming honor, burst into the song known as "The Magnificat". This Magnificat as we have it in Luke 1, speaks of the spirit and the power of God. In this canticle, Mary speaks of how her soul magnifies the Lord and how God regarded His lowly maidservant. She informs us that generations to come will call her blessed. Upon visiting her cousin Elizabeth, Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit in the presence of this "Tabernacle" and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord."

The late Pope Benedict XVI explains that *"Mary bears him in her womb as in a sacred tabernacle and offers him as the greatest gift to Zechariah, to Elizabeth, his wife, and also to John the Baptist, the infant developing in Eliza-*

beth's womb". Archbishop Fulton Sheen said that Mary was the first person who received Holy Communion. At the annunciation, Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word" (Lk. 1:38). Immediately, "the Word was made flesh and tabernacle within Mary." Therefore, "Mary is the tabernacle of the Lord." Sheen also took the event of Mary's visit to Elizabeth to explain that John the Baptist jumped in his mother's womb when he met Jesus in Mary's womb, which means John worshiped "the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, he encountered in the 'Tabernacle' Mary".

We should stop right here and stand in awe. She is the tabernacle not made with human hands but by the hand of God to host the Son of God. Scriptures tell us that Mary is blessed among women. She found favor with God. Indeed, she is highly favored. That these things be said of us! Because of the high honor God grants to Mary, He chooses her to conceive the **"Son of the Highest"**, the inheritor of the **"throne of his father David"**, the One who shall **"reign over the house of Jacob forever"**, and of Whose kingdom **"there shall be no end" (Lk.1:32-33)**. As we do so, we must, with the generations before us and the generations to come, indeed call her blessed, for she was blessed to be the bearer of Christ. Because of this, she understands the personal intimacy that is God's love for His people in a way the rest of us can only wonder at—as a Son to His mother.

It is further noted in the Magnificat that Mary prophetically proclaims: "from this day all generations shall call me blessed". This prophecy is indeed fulfilled in the liturgy and in the prayers of the Catholic Church which honors Our Lady with feasts and shrines and special devotions. However, while we venerate Mary, we worship "The Fruit of thy womb" Jesus. Indeed, from the mouth of the Angel Gabriel she is "full of grace". So, our veneration of Mary is well placed because it leads us to intimate union with the One who is found in her.
