

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice; seek the Lord and be strengthened; seek his face for evermore.

Offertory: O Lord, grant me life according to your word, so that I may learn your commandments.

Communion: We shall rejoice in your salvation; and in the name of the Lord our God shall we place our pride.

The Communion Antiphon reflects a truth deeply held by the likes of St. Therese of Lisieux, the so-called "Little Flower": God's love for us is so great that we can approach Him with complete confidence in His Providence for our wellbeing. She believed with childlike zeal that God heard every prayer of hers and infinitely desired her happiness, and she centered her relationship with Him on this foundational truth, "rejoic[ing] in [His] salvation" and "placing [her] pride" in the name of God. Our Lord outlines this kind of love in today's Gospel, reminding us to love God with our whole mind, heart, and body. When we trust that God loves us radically and unconditionally, it naturally follows that we are compelled to share that love with others. So, let us "seek his face for evermore" with joy in our hearts because each of us are, have been, and always will be loved by Him from all eternity before time existed.

<u>HAITI:</u> Keep Haiti in your prayers, especially St. Michel and the people of Saltadère. Unfortunately, Father Asmith's visit to Charlottesville is unlikely at this time due to ongoing Haitian border closures. The U.N. estimates that 80% of the Port au Prince area (25% of Haiti's population) is currently under gang control. Djimson, a young man who has been our interpreter for years, is missing – please keep him in your prayers. Father Asmith shared that the young are desperate and fleeing to Nicaragua, then trying to get to the U.S. Two weeks before the Feast of St. Michel, the biggest event of the year in the village, the church's inverter was struck by lightning. DigitalKap was able to get the replacement and repair completed before the big celebration. We have not yet received final numbers from the golf tournament.

"IT IS THE LIVING WHO GIVE THANKS TO THE LORD..." (IS. 38:19)

THE MONTH OF THANKSGIVING Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"What can I offer the LORD for all he has done for me? I will lift up the cup of salvation and praise the LORD's name for saving me." (Ps. 116:12-13).

We are looking forward to November 22nd 2023, when we Americans will be celebrating the Thanksgiving holidays. Even though these times are full of uncertainty, we will have the urge to gather for sumptuous meals highlighted by turkey and pumpkin pie, traveling to and from our ancestral homes, enjoying family, feasting on leftovers, and perhaps even watching football. I invite you to look forward with excitement to that day and take these twenty-four days before this celebration as an opportunity to thank God for the GIFT OF LIFE as we remember *our brothers and sisters who have died*. In other words, this time around, I invite you to celebrate the whole month of November – dedicated to the Faithful departed – as a thanksgiving for the life we live with one another in the communion of the living and the dead.

In 1 Thessalonians 5:18 we find these words: "in everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." While that may seem overwhelming to accomplish, the Bible provides directions on how to achieve that level of complete gratitude. Never forget the One who gives life. There's no greater sign of appreciation than to be remembered in any and every thing you do. Think of it like the feeling you get when somebody remembers your birthday or that one time you won an award for something.
