LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance (31st Sunday): Abandon me not, O Lord my God, do not depart from me; come to my assistance, O Lord, mainstay of my deliverance.

Offertory (All Souls): Lord Jesus Christ, King of glory, deliver the souls of all the departed faithful from the sufferings of hell and from the deep pit; deliver them from the mouth of the lion, may they not be swallowed up by hell, may they not fall into darkness; but may Saint Michael, the standardbearer, present them in holy light as you promised long ago to Abraham and his descendants.

Communion (All Saints): Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God; blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God; blessed are those who suffer persecution for the sake of justice, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

I think this past week's holyday Propers can offer some interesting insights on this Sunday's readings. In the first reading and Gospel, we see a stern warning about using God-given authority for one's own personal gain. The Levitical priests were condemned for their "partiality" in their dealings with Israel, and the Pharisees were condemned by Our Lord for using the authority of the "Chair of Moses" (similar to the Chair of Peter, i.e., the Pope) to impose burdens on Israel that they themselves would not perform. Because of our obligation of obedience to them in moral matters even when their conduct is reprehensible ("do as they say, not as they do"), it is an absolute travesty when that obedience is manipulated to serve them and not God. Souls are scandalized and often led away from the Church, left to wander this life without the aid of the Sacraments. We must therefore earnestly pray for holy priests, deacons, and bishops, that they might not be trapped in "the mouth of the lion" nor "swallowed up by hell". May they be "pure of heart", "peacemakers", and sufferers for justice. Offer your rosaries, Divine Mercies, Masses – or whatever – for Fr. Joseph Mary, Bishop Barry, and our Holy Father, Francis. May God preserve them and us!

Are you looking for ways to experience God? We see Christ in our friends in need and, when we see Christ, we experience God. Members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul invite you to share in their ministry of experiencing God in serving people living in poverty. If you would like to help, please join us at 7pm on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays each month at the Church of the Incarnation. For more information about our ministry, please visit our website at www.svdhp-ht.org or email us at info@svdp-ht.org. Vincentians share hope. We've been busy! Most of our friends need help with rent. This past October, we assisted 26 households, some who have young children, some who are elderly, and some who are disabled. On average, we spent ~\$760 per household. One of the families we met is from Honduras. They speak only Spanish. A father, mother, 3-year-old girl and her 2 older brothers had no place to stay, few belongings, and no money. Working with other agencies in Cville, we helped with food and a temporary place to stay. Their hope, courage, and perseverance truly inspires us! Your support and donations make a difference for those whose lives are defined by struggle. Those we visit share in God's blessings from the charity of our Catholic Community. Thank you!

OUTREACH: During the 3rd Quarter of the year, we handed out 475 food bags to 1,219 individuals and served 1,175 lunches during Soup Kitchen. We value and appreciate your generous support of Outreach though your donations and contributions. Thank you and God Bless. This institution is an equal opportunity provider, employer, and lender.

HAITI: Keep Haiti in your prayers, especially St. Michel and the people of Saltadère. Father Asmith was able to make his trip to the U.S. and will visit with Holy Comforter on Sunday, Nov. 19th. A Haiti Arts and Crafts Fair after Mass that weekend is tentatively scheduled, as well as a sponsorship fair; this is the primary means of funding this ministry—a gift of \$150 goes a long way toward providing education, hope, and nourishment for a whole year. For some children, the nutritious meal provided by their sponsorship may be their only meal of the day. According to the most recent school roster, nearly 500 students are enrolled at St. Michel for the 2023-2024 year, and we anticipate anywhere from 25-100 additional students will enroll before Christmas. A young girl in pre-K, Davilma, will likely lose her thumb after it was crushed by the heavy steel door of her classroom, which suddenly blew shut from a wind gust. Please pray for her, her family, and the children in her class. Thankfully, Djimson (our interpreter who has been missing) was confirmed to be in Mexico—please continue to pray for him as he works to secure entry into the U.S. We have not yet received final numbers from the golf tournament.

FROM THE PASTOR



"IT IS THE LIVING WHO GIVE THANKS TO THE LORD..." (IS. 38:19)

Part II

THE MONTH OF THANKSGIVING

**"What can I offer the LORD for all he has done for me? I will lift up the cup of salvation and praise the LORD's name for saving me."
(Ps. 116:12-13)**

We have so much to be grateful for in this life. Each and every day! But the reality is that sometimes life's constant demands, struggles, and worries overwhelm and defeat us, leaving little to no room in the heart for gratitude. Or maybe we forget, in the midst of busyness and pressures, just to pause and give thanks for all that God has done and continues to do in our lives.

First, consider the gift of life from God. Marcus Aurelius, a philosopher in the Roman empire, said: *"When you arise in the morning, think of what a precious privilege it is to be alive; to breathe, to think, to enjoy, to love"*. In fact, acknowledging the good that you already have in your life is the foundation for all abundance. I don't know about you, but sometimes life is very hard; sometimes it is hard to keep on moving forward especially when you are facing challenges such as illness, feeling depressed or sad to the bones, or you have been affected by your job or the pains of inflation. The truth is life throws us curve balls. But what has helped me in all these painful journeys is to have a heart full of gratitude to my God who keeps me alive. In all situations I have chosen to be intentional in my gratitude to the ONE who gives me life to acquire all that I need.

Every day when we wake up, we must thank God for all the blessings he has given us. Start your day off right by giving thanks to God! Think about it – the GIFT of life! Be

thankful to God for your birth, your body, your family, your privileges, all of which came to us as gifts which we sometimes take for granted. Life is a gift from GOD, my friends. We have it and can hold it because God, who created us and the world, chose to give it to us. God withholds no good thing from his children, and today is a day to give thanks for all that you have in life: your favorite people, your hobbies, and anything that makes your heart glad simply for the fact of having it.

Thanking God for the gift of life is a choice that you must intentionally make each new day. You must plan, or it won't happen. You must develop a routine through discipline, or it won't last. The Psalmist says, **"I praise you Lord, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Marvelous are Your works, and I know this very well"** (Ps. 139:14).

When Paul was invited to speak before the philosophers of Athens, his limited opportunity forced him to focus on matters of extreme importance. One of these was his emphasis on the origin of life. He confidently affirmed that it is the true God who **"gives to all life, and breath, and all things"** (Acts 17:25). Later, in a letter to Timothy, he reminded him that the Creator is the one who **"gives life to all things"** (1 Tim. 6:13).

Solomon, in his exploration of the meaning of his existence in the waning days of his life, ultimately concluded that the purpose of life is to reverence God and submit to his commands (Eccl. 12:13). Consequently, please treasure your gift of life. Use it to extol your Creator. In such a pursuit you will discover that which is blessed—both in time and in eternity.

Thank you, Lord, for the blessings you have bestowed on my life. You have provided me with more than I could ever have imagined. You have surrounded me with people who always look out for me. You have given me family and friends who bless me every day with kind words and actions. Thank you, Lord.
