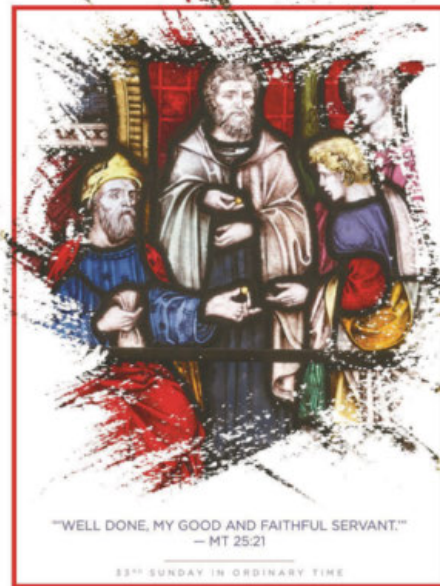

Entrance: The Lord says: "I am pondering thoughts of peace and not of affliction; you shall call upon me, and I will hear you; and I will bring you back from all the lands where you are held captive."

Offertory: Out of the depths have I cried to you O Lord, Lord hear my prayer; out of the depths have I cried to you, O Lord.

Communion: Lord, you delivered five talents unto me; behold, I have gained five more. Well done, good and faithful servant; because you have been faithful over a little, I will set you over much; enter in-to the joy of your Lord.

What a promise we have in the Entrance Antiphon! God wishes to draw us back from all the corners of the earth to dwell in peace. We see this reality seminally manifested in the Catholic Church, where all manner of divisions imposed by society melt away in the worship of the One True God. This peace will be fully realized in the life to come where God will be everything to the Blessed, and they shall lack nothing, leaving no cause for jealousy or strife. Until then, we are called to be good stewards of God's gifts, using them to spread the Kingdom. Amidst all this talk of the end of all things, the Offertory Antiphon stands out as a touchingly human reminder of our frailty. We all experience burnout sometimes, and the state of the world and the seemingly meager effect our efforts have on it give us much cause to despair. We must trust in God's promise that Christ has already won the victory and that those who work to spread the fruits of the victory will find rest in the end. Let us labor on while there is daylight and lean in God in our tribulations and triumphs. Come, Lord Jesus, and save Your people! Christ, Master of all!

Are you looking for ways to experience God? We see Christ in our friends in need and, when we see Christ, we experience God. Members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul invite you to share in their ministry of experiencing God in serving people living in poverty. If you would like to help, please join us at 7pm on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays each month at the Church of the Incarnation. This past October, we assisted 26 households, some who have young children, some who are elderly, and some who are disabled. On average, we spent ~\$760 per household. One of the families we met is from Honduras. They speak only Spanish. A father, mother, 3-year-old girl and her 2 older brothers had no place to stay, few belongings, and no money. Working with other agencies in C'ville, we helped with food and a temporary place to stay. Their hope, courage, and perseverance truly inspires us! Your support and donations make a difference for those whose lives are defined by struggle. Those we visit share in God's blessings from the charity of our Catholic Community. Thank you!

HAITI: Father Asmith will be at Holy Comforter's morning Services. Please take the opportunity to meet with him before or after Mass.

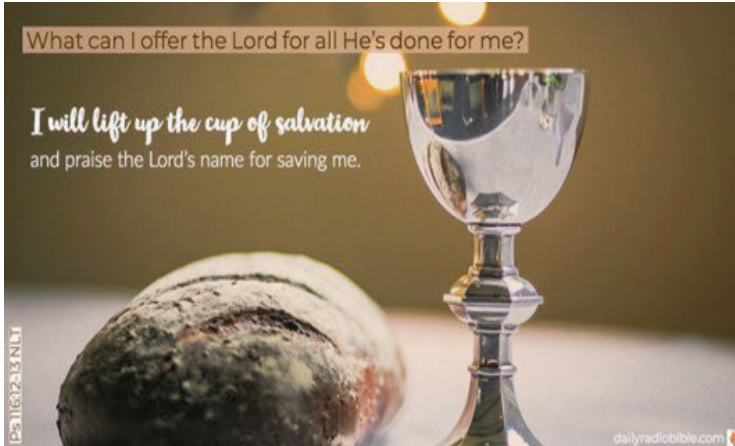

FROM THE PASTOR



"IT IS THE LIVING WHO GIVE THANKS TO THE LORD..."

Isaiah 38:19

Part IV

THE MONTH OF THANKSGIVING

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"What can I offer the LORD for all he has done for me? I will lift up the cup of salvation and praise the LORD's name for saving me."

Psalms 116:12-13

"Give thanks to the Lord..." One of the most basic elements of worship is giving thanks to God. Realizing that everything good that we have comes from God and thanking Him for it is key to a healthy spiritual life. Gratitude should be one of the first things we teach our children, and not just to "give thanks" in general, but especially to give thanks to GOD, acknowledging that HE is the source of everything good. Giving thanks before our meals is not just a "ritual"; it is a vital reminder that everything that we have comes from God, and we should be thankful for it. Teach it to your kids; model it for them. Teaching them to be thankful is one of the most vital, most life-changing things you can do for them.

Ingratitude was Israel's sin in the wilderness. Instead of thanking God for His provision, they grumbled that they were "tired of manna". It was at the heart of King David's sin; instead of thanking God for the wives he already had—and also the kingdom, and His favor and His blessings—he coveted what He did NOT have instead, committing adultery, which led to lying and murder. Herod, rather than thanking God for allowing him to be king and thanking Him

for sending a Messiah to the world, sought to kill Him instead. Jesus' disciples, rather than thanking God that they had even been chosen to be one of His apostles, grumbled about who might have been the greatest among them! We could go on and on... The point is that NOT thanking God is behind virtually every sin of mankind.

It is the same down to this day. The lack of giving thanks to God is behind adultery and SO many marital problems (you don't appreciate what you have). It is behind covetousness, and envy, and greed, and overspending, and idolatry—in short, putting other things ahead of God because you don't appreciate Him and what He has given you. It is behind grumbling and complaining; like Israel, instead of giving thanks for what we have, we grumble about it or wish we had something else. It is behind the sin of bitterness; rather than thanking God for the life of a person we had the joy of sharing some length of time with, we are bitter that they were taken from us when they were. You can apply this train of thought to virtually any sin of word, deed, or attitude. Nearly all of our sins could be curtailed if only we were truly thankful to God!

Do you want to be an entirely different person this month, this year 2023? One of the biggest steps you can take to change your life immediately is to start becoming a THANKFUL person! "Give thanks to the Lord"—for all that the Lord is to you, for all the blessings you have. Be like Abel who chose the best from his flock and sacrificed it to the Lord. The question is: ***what are you going to give to the Lord as an act of thanksgiving to the Lord?*** Psalm 100:4 says: ***"Enter His gates with thanksgiving, and His courts with praise; give thanks to Him, bless His name..."*** Give God thanks today! Give Him thanks for every blessing under the sun that He has freely bestowed upon you, because it is all from Him...every bit of it. But more than anything, give Him thanks: 1) that He is good, and 2) that His lovingkindness, His grace to you in Christ, is everlasting. Oh, what reasons we have to give God thanks!
