

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: The Lamb who has been slain is worthy to receive power, and divinity, and wisdom, and strength, and honor; let glory and dominion be his for ever and ever.

Offertory: Ask of me, and I will give you the nations as your inheritance and the utmost parts of the earth as your possession.

Communion: Amen I say to you: in as much as you have done it to one of the least of these, my brethren, you have done it to me. Come, O blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the beginning of the world. *The Entrance and Offertory Antiphons touch on the two aspects of Christ's kingship: eschatological and social. His eschatological kingship is elaborated in the Entrance Antiphon where He will come at the end of time to subject all creation to Himself, fully realizing what has already begun in the hearts of believers. Christ's kingship over all creation is the focus of the today's feast day, which was moved to the end of liturgical year in the calendar that was promulgated with the New Mass in 1970, which is fully named, "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe". In the pre-1970 calendar, Christ the King was celebrated on the last Sunday of October, and the Offertory Antiphon captures the essence of this feast day, which emphasized Christ's social kingship. "I will give you the nations as your inheritance" is a reminder that Jesus must be the king of all hearts NOW. We must strive to live in such a way that it is clear to those around us that Jesus has the final word over everything we do or say, and we must strive within our own circles to extend that reign to other hearts. This kingship over our lives extends to everything, including the books we read, the TV we watch, the votes we cast in various elections, the way we treat others, etc. Jesus speaks to us through our consciences, which are to be well formed by the teachings of the Church. May the glorious reign of our Lord and Savior take its rightful place at the center of our society and dispel the darkness of error and sin. Christus vincit, Christus regnat, Christus imperat! May Christ conquer all, reign over all, and rule all!*

FROM THE PASTOR



"IT IS THE LIVING WHO GIVE THANKS TO THE LORD..."

Isaiah 38:19

Part V

THE MONTH OF THANKSGIVING

**"It is the living who give thanks to You, as I do today;
a father tells his sons about Your faithfulness"**

Isaiah 38:19

God is good! The goodness of God keeps us alive to see another day. He heals our sicknesses and diseases. He daily loads us with benefits. God is not only good, but He is also full of wonders – He is called Wonderful. Let us give thanks to God for all His goodness to and great wonders for us and our families, our Church, and our friends.

Remember, it is only the living – I mean the living in Christ – that render acceptable praise and thanksgiving to God. **The living, the living—they shall thank and praise You, as I do this day (Is. 38:19).** The living – the soul that loves God, that has genuinely received Jesus as a gift from God the Father and embraced the gospel values – shall thank and praise God. The soul that sins shall die spiritually or physically, so those who are dead in sin and wickedness can only render acceptable praises and thanksgiving to God when they turn away from their sins and wickedness. For God to accept our praises and thanksgiving, we must turn away from all appearances of

evil. I am sure every wise fellow should desire that God accepts his or her praises and thanksgiving.

In Genesis we have the two brothers Cain and Abel bringing to God their offering. God accepted only one of the offerings: **"And the LORD had regard for Abel and his offering, but for Cain and his offering he had no regard" (Gn. 4:4-5).** When we continue with the story of Cain and Abel, we discover that Cain was angry, and the Lord asked: **"Why are you angry? Why is your face downcast? If you do what is right, will you not be accepted? But if you do not do what is right, sin is crouching at your door; it desires to have you, but you must rule over it"**. I wish Cain would have known that a life of repentance is the fountain of thanksgiving. A life of repentance is hearing God's holy law, taking it to heart, recognizing and being sorry for that sin, and in faith receiving the forgiveness of sin Jesus won for us on the cross and His holy, perfect righteousness.

The story above serves us as a warning and a call for us to examine honestly our own hearts and lives as we give thanks to God. Are we giving thanks to the Lord what He is rightly due—proper thanksgiving and praise, shown not by lip service, a few words that mean nothing, but truly from the heart? Do we think that because God is gracious and merciful that we can live a life of sin, serve self, show up at church or throw up what we think is a prayer and then continue in that same sin without fighting it? Unless we hear God's holy law and take it to heart, applying it to ourselves, we will never live a life of repentance and give God the fear, love, thanksgiving He is rightly due. Let us live a life of thanks to God from our hearts and give glory to his name by our gifts.


