

Now begins the time of expectant waiting for the coming of the Lord, manifested firstly in a lowly manger in time and then as the triumphant King of all creation at the end of time. At the beginning of this season, the Church calls us to persevere in doing good as we await that glorious Second Coming at the end when the good will be rewarded with beatitude and the wicked with damnation. We must take care of our souls and cultivate an abiding trust in God's Providence, even when we do not see Him clearly acting in our lives. Hence the Church offers us Psalm 24 (25) in the Entrance and Offertory Antiphons as a prayer of the heart: "let me not be put to shame[...]for none[...]awaiting you will be disappointed." Let us learn to rely on God in all things and let Him be our strength in weariness because His very Self will be the reward of the Blessed. If He is everything to us now when we have so many other things pulling at our hearts, how much happier will we be when all tribulations fade away in eternity as dreams and we are left with the One Who satisfies every good desire of our hearts and INFINITELY more! FROM THE PASTOR



ADVENT 2023 **LET US GET READY FOR THE SAVIOR**Part I

"Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" John 1:29

Advent is a very special time of the year that sometimes gets lost in the bright lights of the Christmas season it precedes. The first day of Advent is the first day of a new Liturgical (or church) year and begins a four-week period of preparation for the nativity of Jesus Christ at Christmas. It prepares us to be open to the gifts that come with this season, particularly hope and expectation. We encounter what happens when we taste our longing and can say, "Come, Lord, Jesus" at a deeper and more personal level.

There is more to Advent than just preparing for Christmas, however. More than simply preparing us to be in a state of readiness, Advent can also draw us into the mystery of being one who is called to prepare the way for Jesus, in our world, for others. The Advent Season is all about reflecting on how we can prepare our hearts and homes for Christ's birth in the world as it is today. It is a time for faith communities and families to remember, through prayer, reflections, special music, and good deeds what the true meaning of Jesus' birth is. There are many different Christian traditions associated

with the season, which I may not get into details.

While we reflect on this gift of God to humanity, "His coming to dwell among us", like John the Baptist, we don't call attention to ourselves. We point the way to Jesus. We say, "Look, there he is." "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world!" When we point the way to Jesus, Who is mercy, we become ambassadors of His mercy. One of the most effective ways we can do this is to let ourselves not only be filled with the good news personally but to let ourselves fall in love with Jesus – to fall in love with His story, His example, His way of being, His trust in the Father, His parables, His healing presence. Everything about Jesus becomes more and more attractive to us. We come to Him and learn from Him. Our very being "proclaims the greatness of our God".

Advent points us to Jesus, the fulfillment of the Messianic era, the Kingdom of God. At His first coming, which we celebrate at Christmas, Jesus showed us His humility, His love for us, and His heart of grace toward sinners and those who suffer. At His second coming, which we look forward to in Advent, He will complete what He started at his birth, bringing a final end to suffering, sin, and death, restoring His creation, and setting up a new kingdom of righteousness and peace. "God keeps his promises" indeed. He comes to deliver us from every evil that upsets our relationship with God and with one another.

Let us open our hearts to Jesus. May we not be like the innkeeper who had no room for Jesus. May our focus not be on the busyness and rushing in the holiday season or on buying and receiving gifts. Instead, let's focus our minds on the miracle of when our Savior was born in a lowly stable and held in the arms of His virgin mother and the eternal peace that was ushered in along with His birth. May Christ give us a longing for His renewed presence among us.
