

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: People of Zion behold, the Lord is coming to save all nations; and the Lord shall cause you to hear his majestic voice for the joy of your heart. Offertory: You will turn toward us, O God, and restore our life again, and your people will rejoice in you. Show us, Lord, your mercy and grant us vour salvation.

Communion: Arise, O Jerusalem, and stand on high; and behold the joy that shall come to you from your God.

The Advent mood this Sunday is shifting from the coming of Christ at the end of time to His first coming in the manger with the heralding of St. John the Baptist. Yet, the spiritual meaning of the Scriptures and Propers today remain salient to our times, weighed down as they are by our sins and weakness. "[T]he Lord shall cause you to hear his majestic voice" seems to hearken to the fulfillment of the Kingdom at the end of all things, yet the bit about saving "all nations" is already happening among us; the Church is catholic, or universal, opening her doors to all peoples who will hear the Gospel and receive its wonderful promise of the forgiveness of sins and adoption as the Children of God. At baptism and during confession, God indeed does "restore our life again", causing us to rejoice in him. Let us therefore heed the message of the Baptist and prepare the way of the Lord anew in our hearts, letting ourselves be molded in His likeness. As St. Agustine said: "Let us not resist his first coming, so that we may not dread the second." Jesus wants us to be free and to know the joy of that freedom. The way is a little narrow, but the end of the short path is neverending bliss and freedom from the power of the world, the flesh, and the devil, the beginnings of which we can experience NOW. Come, Lord Jesus!

FROM THE PASTOR



ADVENT 2023 LET US GET READY FOR THE SAVIOR Part II

"Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" John 1:29

There is a Hymn which begins thus: "Come, thou long expected Jesus, | born to set thy people free; | from our fears and sins release us, | let us find our rest in thee. || Israel's strength and consolation, | hope of all the earth thou art; | dear desire of every nation, | joy of every longing heart.", and so forth. Israel longed for the Messiah to come; we Christians now long for Christ to come again and bring about the fullness of his Kingdom. We lean into the "already—not yet" of the Gospel.

In Advent, we dwell on our longing for the Kingdom of God to come in its fullness. We long for the justice of the Kingdom, for the righting of wrongs, for the new heaven and the new earth. This longing isn't futile, wishful thinking for something permanently out of reach. This thirst for the coming of the Kingdom should inspire action, as a deer on a mountainside turns its head toward a stream and picks out a path forward to quench its thirst. Psalm 42:1 says: **"As the deer longs for streams of water, so I long for you, O God."** Indeed, <u>the</u> <u>deer's longing for water is a survival instinct, a stimulus</u> to action. A deer's longing isn't nostalgic thoughts of <u>"wouldn't it be nice if only..."</u> If a deer is thirsty, it doesn't sigh over its longing; it moves to seek out water.

I would then ask: "What might God be calling me to be active in through my longing for his Kingdom this Advent?" Psalm 130:6 offers us more insight on longing: "I long for the Lord more than sentinels long for the dawn, yes, more than sentinels long for the dawn." This longing is different: there's nothing that a watchman can do to make the sun rise any sooner. Does that mean their longing is futile? Will the Lord be always beyond the horizon? The guards cling to their faith that the dawn will come at some point...but meanwhile, there's the night. Meanwhile, our world is full of injustice, cruelty, hate, mistrust, and division.

And yet, sentries on duty aren't supposed to be waiting listlessly, sitting around "with their teeth in their mouth"—the longing of a sentinel isn't wistfulness because of boredom. Sentinels need to be active in their waiting—alert, scanning their surroundings with close attention even as they long for the safety of the dawn and release from their post. What might God be calling me to pay more attention to this Advent?

If the sentinels were to give up on the coming of the dawn, they wouldn't be able to continue their mission. If a deer were to surrender to its thirst instead of moving toward the water it longs for, it would die. Maybe the longing of Advent is part of the survival instinct of the Christian life, to keep us from being too easily satisfied with small goods (e.g. Christmas gifts). Maybe the longing of Advent is a posture of yearning that points us in the right direction, seeking God's presence among us—as it is, already here, and as it will come in greater fullness. May this Advent season see us seeking more of God's presence as we long for the fulfillment of his Kingdom and his justice.
