LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Let your forbearance be known to all men. The Lord is at hand. Do not be anxious over anything; but in all manner of prayer, let your requests be made known unto God.

Offertory: O Lord, you have blessed your land, you have put an end to Jacob's captivity; you have forgiven the guilt of your people.

Communion: Say: Take courage, you who are fainthearted, and do not fear; behold, our God will come and he will save us.

Today is a day of rejoicing! The first word of the Entrance Antiphon in Latin is "Gaudete", which is the name the Church gives this Sunday. While it is still a time of penance, the sobriety of the season is tempered with the expectant joy of Mary, so beautifully expressed in her Magnificat, and the hopeful joy of the entire Church, as she awaits her Savior's return. Gaudete Sunday is iconic of the entire Advent season, elegantly commixing the expectant longing for the coming of the humble Christ in the manger and the coming of the glorious Christ at the end of time. The call to rejoice in the face of adversity is a supreme act of hope, trusting in God's promise to save His people even when all seems lost outwardly. Let us therefore "take courage" because we believe that "our God will come and[...]save us" both in the intimacy of our inner hearts, if we are open to Him, and then at His Second Coming when He shall judge the living and the dead, revealing all the happy consequences of the good works of the saints and righting all wrongs. Let us "foil [our] foe with joy", to quote from an old English carol, and choose to place our hope in the glorious resurrection of the dead that is to come, standing firm until then with unwavering confidence. Rejoice and be glad!

FROM THE PASTOR



ADVENT 2023

LET US GET READY FOR THE SAVIOR

Part III

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

“Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!”

John 1:29

Throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light” (Rm. 13:12), You know that darkness stands for the powers of evil, as light is the fit emblem of the holiness of God, and of his infinite goodness and purifying grace. Well, now, whether we who are the children of light are busy or not, it is quite certain that children of darkness work. They are always working; there is no pause in their activity, the devil will never take a nap, and neither will all his henchmen. As they say; “the devil’s plough never rusts in the furrow, his sword never rests in its scabbard”. The work of the night goes on horribly, there is no pause to it; therefore, let us who are of the day work, too as we prepare for the coming of the Lord. God help us to counteract the working of the silent, hidden leaven of sin by our own struggling to produce in the world a better tone of thought and feeling, and by spreading the knowledge of God’s grace, and everything which will increase reverence to God and love to men!

What we must accept is that the works of the light are fruitful works, rich and sweet, and fit to be gathered, pleasant to God and profitable to men; but the works of darkness are fruitless, they come to nothing, they produce no good result. They are like the apples of

Sodom, which may appear fair to the eye, but he that plucks them shall find that he has nothing but ashes in his hand.

What then are we going to do? We must pray and acquire the virtue of FORTITUDE! The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines fortitude as “the moral virtue that ensures firmness in difficulties and constancy in the pursuit of the good. It strengthens the resolve to resist temptations ... to conquer fear” and “even to renounce and sacrifice his life in defense of a just cause” (CCC 1808). The Church’s many martyrs were asked to prove their fortitude by laying down their lives, and we look to them for very tangible examples of how this virtue can be made manifest. However, most of us are not called to give up our lives in such a literal way, but we are all still called to fortitude.

Fortitude helps us to reject evil and pursue good at all costs. To grow in fortitude, we must commit ourselves to practicing perseverance and courage in the daily battle against sin and works of darkness. But above all, growing in fortitude means constant conversion. We must be aware of our weakness and turn to the Father for strength, and especially go to him for forgiveness when we have sinned, so he can give us the graces we need to continue the journey to sainthood. With the season of Advent, a focus on fortitude encourages us to be heroic and steadfast from the outset. Advent is hard, partly because none of us likes waiting, but also because, as the three purple candles on our Advent wreaths express, it is a time for penance for our own sins as well as those of others. Let us live out the gift of fortitude with each small “yes,” to have a persevering spirit that is walking in deeper intimacy with our Father as we wait patiently for the joy of Christmas.
