

## LITURGICAL NOTES

**Entrance:** Be unto me a protecting God and a house of refuge, to save me; for you are my support and my refuge; and for the sake of your name you will lead me and nourish me.

**Offertory:** Blessed are you, O Lord, teach me your commandments. O Lord, you are blessed, teach me your commandments. With my lips have I declared all the judgments spoken by your mouth.

**Communion:** They ate and were fully satisfied; the Lord gave them all that they desired; they were not deprived of their wants.

*On this last Sunday before Ash Wednesday, we see more hints of the spirit of penance in the Entrance Antiphon, which calls for God to protect us on our way, giving the sense that our reliance on Him is complete, as if we were wandering in a land that provided no nourishment, i.e., the desert. Reading the Antiphon in this light renders the Communion Antiphon as a fitting bookend, recalling how God provided for Israel in the desert with the Manna. Our spiritual life needs to reflect this duality of humility (recognizing our need) and hope (trusting in God's loving care for us). Cultivating these two virtues could go a long way in helping our Lent be more fruitful this year. As you prepare yourself for this most holy season, come and celebrate Mardi Gras with us on Tuesday at 5:30. We will continue the old custom of burying the alleluia (written on a banner), which disappears ("dies") during Lent and returns ("resurrects") at Easter, emblematic of the Church's divestment of her signs of joy and festivity in order to prepare herself through acts of charity for the forthcoming glorious mysteries of our salvation.*

**Fast and Abstinence (USCCB):** Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18-59. A person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards.

# FROM THE PASTOR



## CLOSE YOUR EYES AND OPEN YOUR EARS TO THE HOLY SPIRIT

Part VI

**“When the angel entered Mary’s home, he greeted her and said, “You are favored by the Lord! The Lord is with you.”  
Luke 1:28**

For many of us, when we sit down to PRAY, we are bombarded by constant distractions. It could be anything from the ticking of a clock on the wall, the crying of a baby, the honking of a horn outside, or even the bombardment of thoughts about various people or relationships in our lives. It can be difficult to focus our attention on God and remain in a conversation with him. However, sometimes these distractions aren’t “distractions” at all: they are thoughts introduced by God that are aimed at our spiritual benefit. Consider the wisdom of the saints and the Church:

St. Therese of Lisieux wrote the following about being distracted during prayer: “I have many distractions, but as soon as I am aware of them, I pray for those people, the thought of whom is diverting my attention.”

St. Alphonsus Liguori said: “The Devil is never busier trying to distract us than when he sees us praying and asking God for

grace. And why? Because the enemy sees that at no other time do we gain so many treasures of heavenly goods as when we pray.”

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (2729), it is said: “The habitual difficulty in prayer is distraction. It can affect words and their meaning in vocal prayer; it can concern, more profoundly, him to whom we are praying, in vocal prayer (liturgical or personal), meditation, and contemplative prayer. To set about hunting down distractions would be to fall into their trap, when all that is necessary is to turn back to our heart: for a distraction reveals to us what we are attached to, and this humble awareness before the Lord should awaken our preferential love for him and lead us resolutely to offer him our heart to be purified. Therein lies the battle, the choice of which master to serve”.

I would then say that It’s natural to become distracted during prayer sometimes. If you can, simply acknowledge the distracting thought and let it go. However, what at first may seem like a distraction can sometimes become an opportunity for a graced encounter with God, leading you in a different direction to enrich your encounter with God. So, if the distracting thought continues, then carefully discern whether it’s really a distraction or something you need to pray about. We should not hesitate to pray over the “open book of our lives”, if we think that God is trying to get our attention through what we initially thought was a distraction.

In contrast, some thoughts are unnecessary preoccupations; we can tend to them later. Review the suggestions for preparing for and structuring your prayer time. Following these long-tested counsels can help focus your prayer. If distractions persist, talk with a spiritual director or guide about them. If you tend to fall asleep when you pray, adjust your posture or time of prayer. Sometimes it can seem that nothing is happening, but deep down, God is stirring up something—we just haven’t realized it yet. As you grow in the habit of prayer, avoid the temptation to judge or rate your prayer: “Today was good prayer; yesterday was just okay” (Imagine rating each time you spent with a friend or loved one!).

God can put anything to good use, even distractions and preoccupations. In the end, heed the encouragement of St. Francis de Sales: If all you do is return to God’s presence after distraction, then this is very good prayer. Your persistence shows how much you want to be with God. Whether the EYES are closed or not, the ears of your HEART must be open.




