


2024 ANNUAL DIOCESAN APPEAL: Sharing His Love with Others

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: As newborn babes, alleluia, long for pure spiritual milk, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

Offertory: The Angel of the Lord came down from heaven and said to the women: "The One whom you seek has risen, as he said he would", alleluia. **Communion:** Stretch forth your hand, and feel the place where the nails were, alleluia; and be not doubtful but believing, alleluia, alleluia. We have just celebrated eight days of Easter Sunday. The "Easter Octave" suspends liturgical time because Easter is so central to who we are that the Church has seen it fit to celebrate it eight times with all due solemnity and joy. Easter is in fact the reason we have octaves because the Church very early in the history of the Church understood the Day of Resurrection (Sunday) to be the "eighth day of creation" when Christ wonderfully remade human nature by His resurrection – the Firstborn of a new creation. Seven represents completeness and eight represent eternity; hence, liturgical octaves suspend time, giving us a foretaste of the unending Easter joys of heaven. It is eminently fitting that the octave ends with an emphasis on the Mercy of God, which was shown to the apostles locked away in the upper room who were afraid at the sight of Jesus because they had abandoned Him. He dispels their fears with the warm greeting, "Peace be with you" and shows St. Thomas the apostle mercy in the face of his utter doubt of the resurrection. Join us for the great hour of Divine Mercy (3pm Sunday) where we will sing the Chaplet in the presence of the Sacrament and the image commissioned by St. Faustina at the request of Jesus Himself. FROM THE PASTOR





CLOSE YOUR EYES AND OPEN YOUR EARS TO THE HOLY SPIRIT

Part XIV

"I will be glad and rejoice in thy mercy: for thou hast considered my trouble; thou hast known my soul in adversities" Psalm 31:7

As we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday on the second Sunday of Easter, it is fitting to consider how the book of the Psalms helps us to embrace the Mercy of God. The book of Psalms contains many wonderful Psalms about mercy, love, and hope. The word "mercy" is often used in the Psalms when talking about God's love and care for us. One definition of mercy is God withholding the punishment we deserve. Is there any better description of love than that?

There are Psalms devoted to the praise of Divine Mercy. **Psalm 136**, for example, recounts all the merciful deeds of the Lord both in creation and in rescuing Israel from slavery, bringing the Chosen People to the Promised Land. This Psalm bears the refrain: "for His steadfast love endures forever." Psalms 105 and 106 are a summary of the proofs of the mercy of the Lord in leading Israel out of Egypt and into the Promised Land. **Psalm 106** begins: "Praise the Lord! O give thanks to the Lord for He is good; for his steadfast love (Mercy) endures forever." Psalm **107** gives thanks to the Lord for all of the many ways he delivers people from trouble and danger.

Secondly, several of the psalms define the very nature of God chiefly in terms of His merciful love. **Psalm 145**, for example, repeats and elaborates upon God's self-designation as the

Merciful One from Exodus (verse 8): "The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. The Lord is good to all, and His compassion is over all His works." Psalm 103 is perhaps the most comprehensive exposition of the multifaceted mercy of God: He forgives, He heals, He is dependable, He provides for His people, He is compassionate toward human weakness, patient and forbearing. The Psalms also tell us how we can see the mercy of the Lord. Psalms 112:4 states: "Light rises in darkness for the upright; the Lord is gracious, merciful and just." In other words, we can only see God's mercy clearly when we are upright ourselves: a merciless and unjust heart cannot see, experience, nor understand the mercy of the Lord. Psalm 111 reminds us that it is through remembering His "wonderful works" that we can best appreciate the Divine Mercy, for His mercy is no mere philosophical abstraction: it is proven in His deeds.

Many of the Psalms also encourage us to place our trust in the Lord and to hope in Him. Psalm 32:10 promises: "Many are the pangs of the wicked, but steadfast love (Mercy) surrounds him who trusts in the Lord." Psalm 33:18 makes a similar promise: "Behold, the eye of the Lord is upon those who fear Him, on those who hope in His steadfast love (Mercy)." Perhaps no Psalm says it better than Psalm 130, which is a cry for forgiveness and rescue from a soul cast deep into the darkness by trouble and sin: "Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord! Lord hear my voice! Let Thy ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications! If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee, that Thou mayest be feared..."

It is no wonder, therefore, that one of the favorite verses of Pope St. John Paul II comes from the Psalms (89:1): "I will sing of the mercies of the Lord forever, with my mouth I will proclaim Thy faithfulness to all generations." I ask you to consider making the Psalms your anchor when speaking to God; you will never regret it. The Lord is risen indeed. ALLELUIA!
