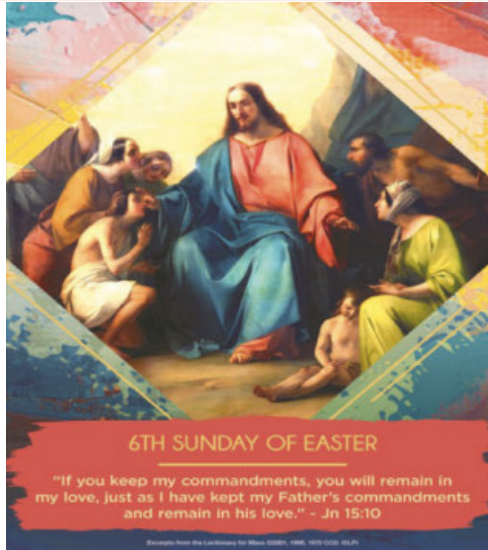

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Spread the news with a voice of joy; let it be heard, alleluia; speak it out to the very ends of the earth; the Lord has liberated his people, alleluia, alleluia.

Offertory: O nations, bless the Lord our God, let the voice of his praises resound; he has restored my soul to life and he has not suffered my feet to stumble; blessed be the Lord who has neither rejected my prayer nor turned his mercy away from me, alleluia.

Communion: I have chosen you from the world, in order that you might go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should last, alleluia.

We are nearing the end of that blessed period Our Lord spent with His apostles; He must now return to the Father, promising to send the Spirit of Truth to lead the nascent Church. We also see a change in scope of the apostolic mission to evangelize, both in the readings and antiphons. The Entrance Antiphon really encapsulates the entire message of this Sunday and Easter/Pentecost very nicely. The message needs to be sent to "the very ends of the earth" that God has "liberated his people". Not only has He liberated Israel but all of humanity from the slavery of sin and the finality of death. Baptism bestows the life of grace in the soul and banishes the punishment of all our past sins, and Confession is there to help us get up when we fail to stay free of sin. Most importantly, the Eucharist, given to us by the successors of the apostle (the bishops and priests they ordain to carry out this ministry), is Jesus' promise that He will never leave us until the end of time. What could be better than this? Let the truth of this message sink into our hearts so that we can go out into the world bearing joyful fruits that speak to our neighbors of the veracity and meaningfulness of the Christian message. Start by spending time with Our Lord during the upcoming 40 Hours Devotion. Come, Holy Spirit!

FROM THE PASTOR



CLOSE YOUR EYES AND OPEN YOUR EARS

TO THE HOLY SPIRIT

Part XVIII

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

“The LORD is my shepherd, I lack nothing. He makes me lie down in green pastures. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies”

Psalms 23:1-2 & 5

We may ask: What good is the Resurrection of Jesus to us? Most people used to think about resurrection as a New Testament doctrine rather than an Old Testament one. But would it surprise you to find out that the resurrection is well established in the Old Testament? Not only is resurrection taught in the Old, but the theology it teaches us is incredibly profound. There are many books throughout the Old Testament that shed light on the doctrine of resurrection. A careful examination of them will draw out a powerful message about resurrection that speaks to our lives today. I will mention a few incidents from the Old Testament.

Job is the book of the Bible that asks important questions that the rest of the Bible will answer. One of those questions comes from Job himself in Job 14:14: “If a man dies, will he live again?” Job knows that death is permanent (14:10–11), but he declares with the utmost confidence, “Even after my skin is destroyed, yet from my flesh I shall see God” (19:26). Job does not know how God is going to do it, but he believes in his heart that somehow God will raise him from the dead.

If resurrection is the solution to all evil that we experience in this life, it will require a heroic individual with the right credentials to make it happen. The book of Psalms introduces the Messiah as this person. Psalm 91:16 says, “With a long life I will

satisfy him and let him see My salvation.” God promises to give the Messiah long life, which is a technical phrase sometimes associated with resurrection (Ps. 21:4; 23:6). In Psalm 17:15, David expresses confidence that God will satisfy him as well with a resurrection, “As for me, I shall behold Your face in righteousness; I will be satisfied with Your likeness when I awake.” How does David know this will happen? He explains in Psalm 16:10: “For You will not abandon my soul to Sheol; Nor will You allow Your Holy One to undergo decay.” David is sure that his own resurrection is secure because he knows that God will not allow the Messiah, God’s Holy One, to undergo decay. The Messiah’s resurrection is the basis for David’s resurrection.

A couple of further proofs – Daniel 12:2 says, “And many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt.” And from Isaiah: “Your dead shall live; their bodies shall rise. You who dwell in the dust, awake, and sing for joy! For your dew is a dew of light, and the earth will give birth to the dead” (26:19).

The importance of the resurrection of Christ has an impact on our service to the Lord now. Paul, in one of his discussions on resurrection, said: “Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain” (1 Cor. 15:58). Because we know we will be resurrected to new life, we can endure persecution and danger for Christ’s sake (ibid. 30-32), just as our Lord did. Because of the resurrection of Jesus Christ, thousands of Christian martyrs of through history have willingly traded their earthly lives for everlasting life and the promise of resurrection.

The resurrection is the triumphant and glorious victory for everyone who believes in Christ. Jesus Christ died, was buried, and rose on the third day according to the Scriptures (1 Cor. 15:3-4). And He is coming again! The dead in Christ will be raised up, and those who are alive at His coming will be changed and receive new, glorified bodies (1 Thess. 4:13-18). We live and have hope in this life because “I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us” (Rm. 8:18). And the resurrection of Jesus demonstrates that God accepted Jesus’ sacrifice on our behalf. It shows that God has the power to raise us from the dead. It guarantees that the bodies of those who believe in Christ will not remain dead but will be resurrected unto eternal life.

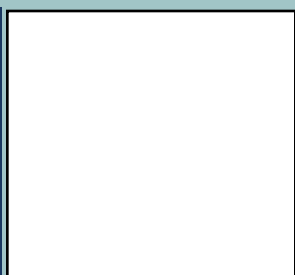
