

TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading Job 38:1,8-11 The Lord answers Job's complaints. . Responsorial Psalm Psalm 107:23-24,25-26,28-29,30-31 A song of praise to God for rescue

### LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Hearken, O Lord, unto my voice which has called out to you; deign to be my help, forsake me not, do not despise me, O God my Savior. Offertory: I will bless the Lord who has given me understanding. I have set the Lord always in my sight; since he is at my right hand, I shall not be shaken. Communion: One thing have I asked of the Lord, this will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life.

The first reading and the Gospel today bookend the Liturgy of the Word with references to the house or kingdom of God having humble beginnings (the tender shoot/the mustard seed) and blooming into magnificent plants (cedar/mustard plant) that give shade and rest to creatures. It is in weakness that God shows His greatest power. One lesson we can take from this is that we must become lowly in order to allow God to work in our souls. In praying for greater humility, we can then join our voices with the Psalmist and "bless the Lord who has given me understanding", for humility is nothing more than knowing who we are before God: creatures – sinners in need of His mercy. Our dependence on God must be like that of a child. This realization should lead us not only to acknowledge our constant need for God's providence but to long for that Providence ardently. "One thing have I asked of the Lord[...]that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life". In this month of the Sacred Heart, let us strive to imitate the Master, who is "meek and humble of heart". Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!

### HE HOLY SPIRIT AT WORK IN OUR DAILY LIVES

Part IV Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

### "And the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."" Luke 3:22

Since the beginning of creation, God has always desired fellowship with Man. Adam and Eve enjoyed this fellowship in the Garden prior to their fall. When they sinned, however, they lost that fellowship with God. In our times, this fellowship is restored when a sinner believes and trusts Christ. "Not only are we in relationship with Him *[i.e., connected and restored to Him]*, but we get to have fellowship with Him, where we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin" (1 Jn. 1:6–7).

The Holy Spirit comes into the new believer to take a permanent residence as the letter to the Ephesians says: "And you also were included in Christ when you heard the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation. When you believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit" (1:13). The believer does not have to do anything before being baptized by the Holy Spirit. This is the promise of Jesus Christ even before the cross: "Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them" (John 7:38-39). By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive. Up to that time the Spirit had not been given since Jesus had not yet been glorified.

Earlier in salvation history, King David could pray "Take not Thy Holy Spirit from me" (Ps. 51:11). In these times, however, no man who has the Spirit of God can offer that prayer without being guilty of ignorance, because the Holy Spirit, as an abiding presence in any man, is there as a seal, "sealing him unto the day of redemption" (Eph. 4:30). Men could ask the Father in the days of Christ to send them the Holy Spirit. But in this day no child of God can offer that prayer without confessing ignorance of the Word of God, because when the Spirit comes to take up His abode in the body, that body becomes the temple of the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul says: "Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own" (1 Cor. 6:19). Further: "At salvation, the Holy Spirit not only regenerates the sinner and imparts saving faith, but He permanently resides in the life of that new believer (Rom. 8:9). In a marvelous and incomprehensible way, the Spirit of God makes His home in the life of every person who trusts in Jesus Christ (1 Cor. 3:16).

There is also the aspect of being baptized in the Spirit. The baptism of the Spirit is not an experience that has to be felt when it occurs, nor does it require any physical or noticeable proof manifested by the one who is baptized. The indwelling Spirit will produce noticeable fruits of spiritual growth in the life of the believer. St. Paul lists the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: **love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (Gal. 5:22-23)**.

When we permit the Spirit to move in our lives, that is, by willingly submitting to Him, even our prayers will be guided by our desire to please God and not ourselves. This is what it means to pray according to the will of God. One of the benefits of praying in accordance with the will of God is that answers to the prayers are guaranteed. This is because you're asking for something that God already wants for you. May God help us submit to the leading of the Spirit in our lives.
