

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24 Death entered the world through the work of the devil.

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 30:2,4,5-6,11,12,13 A prayer of thanksgiving to God for having rescued us

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: The Lord is the strength of his people, and the guardian of salvation for his Anointed. Save your people, O Lord, and bless your inheritance; be their guide for ever.

Offertory: Render secure my footsteps in your paths so that my feet do not slip; incline your ear and hear my words; display your wonderful mercies, O Lord, Savior of those who place their hope in you.

Communion: I shall walk round about his sanctuary, offering a sacrifice of jubilation; I will sing and recite a psalm to the Lord.

The Propers this weekend provide interesting material for meditation that beautifully complements the readings. There is an obvious connection between the Old Testament reading and the Gospel with God reminding Job that His Providence is over all things (the sea is specifically mentioned) and Jesus exercising that authority in calming the wind and sea, proving at least in one way His divinity. However, there is a deeper lesson to be gleaned from this. The Entrance Antiphon teaches us that the "Lord is the strength of his people"; Jesus' rebuke of the apostles about their lack of faith touches on this. Our Lord is an unshakable foundation on which we can rest, rendering our "footsteps secure". We need to learn to trust in God's Providence in our lives because Christ has already won the war against the devil. If we remain true to our faith, persevering in doing good and strengthening ourselves with the sacraments, we will not fail. Christ always wins. Pray for strength against the storms in your lives! FROM THE PASTOR



THE HOLY SPIRIT AT WORK IN OUR DAILY LIVES

Part V Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"And the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."" Luke 3:22

Dead things don't grow; Only living things grow. Flowers grow, but rocks don't. How tragic would it be for parents if their children advanced in age but never grew bigger, stronger, or more capable? We'd all know something was drastically wrong. As **Christians we are meant to grow in our faith, if not then something** that needs to be checked on! Who makes us grow? The Holy Spirit helps us to growth and mature in our faith.

The apostle Peter urges us to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Pet. 3:18) By this, Peter means that we are to grow and mature in our understanding and experience of the grace we have received and in our knowledge about and experience of Christ. This is the way we enter more fully into the abundant life Jesus gives us (John 10:10). Unfortunately, many in the church receive God's grace in Baptism and Confirmation but for various reasons do not grow much in grace. As a result, they needlessly miss out on the great blessings God wants to bestow on them and run the risk of not fulfilling God's purposes for their lives.

It would be nice if we matured automatically in our life of grace, but God calls us to actively pursue growth in grace. Jesus, for example, tells His disciples to, "Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness" (Matt. 6:33). Paul says to the Philippians, "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you both to will and to work for his good pleasure" (Phil. 2:12–13). Again, active engagement is required of us.

This does not mean that through our own efforts we are the source of our own transformation, but it does mean that we have an important part to play in the process. Ultimately God is the source of our transformation, but He does it through a process that requires us to play a vital and indispensable role. In other words, God uses means—means of grace—to bring about our growth.

To Timothy Paul said this: "For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God (grace in the Holy Spirit), which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power, love, and self-control...." (2 Tm.1:6-7).

What are some of the means God uses to bring about our growth in grace? Although God can use various means at different times to help us grow, the primary and essential ones are listed in Acts 2:42. In this passage, we see how the Holy Spirit led the first church, composed of some three thousand newly converted and baptized people, to grow in grace: **"they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers."**


The context indicates that these activities were not a form of liturgy, but practices adopted so widely by individual believers that they characterized the entire three thousand. These four activities, taken together, formed the foundation of personal and corporate life in the early church. They weren't the only ones God used, but they were the essential ones.

The believers *devoted* themselves to these spiritually edifying and transformative practices. These people persevered in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, the breaking of bread and the prayers—not just one or two of these activities, as we might today, but all four of them.

And they discovered that these were the primary means by which God caused them to grow in His grace. This pattern has recurred in church history in times of renewal and revival, when the Spirit of God seeks to bring the church back to authentic spiritual vitality and discipleship. Keep in mind that, spiritual growth is the journey of growing in faith to know more about God and become the person that He created you to be.
