

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading Ezekiel 2:2-5 The Lord sends the prophet Ezekiel to the Israelites. **Responsorial Psalm**

Psalm 123:1-2,3-4 A prayer to God for mercy

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: All nations, clap your hands; shout unto God with a voice of joy. Offertory: As a holocaust of rams and bullocks, and of thousands of fatted lambs, so let our sacrifice be in your sight on this day, that it may be pleasing unto you. For there is no shame for those who put their trust in you, O Lord.

Communion: Lend your ear and make haste to rescue us. The first reading today opens very strikingly, "God did not make death, nor does he rejoice in the destruction of the living." This adds a new level of depth to the Offertory Antiphon when it says that "there is no shame for those who put their trust in you, O Lord" because death does not have the last word. Let us consider the martyrs throughout history who gave up their lives for the Faith. Wisdom's counsel in the first reading and Jesus' raising of the young girl from the dead all point to God's desire that we have everlasting life. Through Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ, we now have access to this wellspring of life. Even though our bodies will perish, our souls will live on and soon thereafter be reunited with them gloriously restored. Let us therefore hold fast to what we profess, "shout [ing] unto God with a voice of joy" because of His steadfast love for His creatures, whom He created to love and be loved for all eternity. The choice is ours!

Please contact Garrett Smith at 434-960-7775, for more information. **HAITI:** From Bob Fromm: This week's Gospel invites us to reflect on our role in healing brokenness and I believe that is what our ministry is doing. During my recent mission trip to Haiti, a priority was the upgrading of the school's electrical system. With Father Asmith's recommendation, I supplied materials funded by a \$1,500 donation for the necessary updates, including a new fuse box and material. An electrician, hired by Father, completed the work, ensuring the school now has up-to-date wiring and grounding. Additionally, we discussed a necessary enhancement to the rectory/church's power system with extra batteries, funded by this year golf tournament proceeds, pending executive council approval. In this fiscal year we gained 219 new sponsors, short 119 of our 700-student goal, but still a notable achievement. Our next year fiscal focus is on renewals and new sponsors to reach 700 sponsorships in support of the children and improve their future. Thank you for your continued prayers & support

FROM THE PASTOR



THE HOLY SPIRIT AT WORK IN OUR DAILY LIVES

Part VI Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"And the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."" Luke 3:22

When we place our faith in Jesus, the Holy Spirit begins the process of making us more like Jesus, conforming us to His image. It has been said of the Holy Spirit that he comforts the disturbed and disturbs the comfortable, transforming us into the image and likeness of Christ! Invitations of the Holy Spirit welcome total upheaval and the disturbance of everything...Beware! This ought not really to surprise us, for growth is about change and the characteristic of life is movement. That which doesn't move, or change is dead – that's the difference we immediately notice between beef and cow!

Suppose you were to write down the changes that have taken place in your life since you were six years old... If that list entails virtually every aspect of our lives, we must not be surprised when Christian growth touches virtually everything also. If we do not fully grasp that Christian growth - growing in the Spirit - is something total, we will not see or understand the Holy Spirit's working in all the different areas of our lives. If we expect His transformation to be restricted to merely "spiritual" things, we shall lack the awareness to cooperate with his growth-changes at the levels of relationships, memories, habits, priorities, possessions, etc.

Growing in the Holy Spirit is the process of becoming more and more like Jesus Christ. Spiritual growth is perhaps best described in 2 Peter 1:3-8, which tells us that by God's power we have **"everything we need"** to live lives of godliness, which is the goal of spiritual growth. Notice that what we need comes **"through our knowledge of Him,"** which is the key to obtaining everything we need.

When the transformation of salvation takes place, spiritual growth begins. The Holy Spirit indwells us as John 14:16-17 says: **"And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever...the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you."** We are new creatures in Christ (2 Cor. 5;17). The old, sinful nature begins to give way to the new, Christlike nature (Rom. 6-7). Spiritual growth is a lifelong process that depends on our study and application of God's Word (2 Tim. 3:16-17) and our walk in the Spirit (Gal. 5: 16-26).

As we seek spiritual growth, we should pray to God and ask for wisdom concerning the areas He desires us to grow in. We can ask God to increase our faith and knowledge of Him. God desires for us to grow spiritually, and He has given us all we need to experience spiritual growth. With the Holy Spirit's help, we can overcome sin and steadily become more like our Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ.
