NEXT WEEK'S READINGS

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading Jeremiah 23:1-6 The Lord promises to shepherd his people Israel.

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 23:1-3,3-4,5,6 The Lord is our shepherd.

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: When I cried out to the Lord, he heeded my call against my assailants; he who is before the beginning of the world and who endures forever has humbled them. Cast your cares upon the Lord, and he will sustain you.

Offertory: Unto you, O Lord, have I lifted up my soul; O my God, I trust in you, let me not be put to shame; do not allow my enemies to laugh at me; for none of those who are awaiting you will be disappointed.

Communion: The sparrow has found herself a home, and the turtle dove a nest in which to lay her young: at your altars, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God! Blessed are they who dwell in your house, they shall praise you for ever and ever.

One of the things this weekend's readings point out is that God will take of those who abandon themselves to His will and the spreading of the Kingdom. This is especially evident in the Gospel where Our Lord instructs the disciples to travel lightly to the point of seeming humanly unprepared ("no food, no sack, no money in their belts"). The Offertory Antiphon echoes this sentiment, calling us to faithfulness amidst tribulation. The choice of antiphon is all the more interesting because it is the same chant from the first Sunday of Advent during which we find ourselves waiting confidently for the Second Coming. The Communion Antiphon reinforces this eschatological focus, reminding us that true happiness is found in Communion with God. That blissful communion in this life is a foretaste of the unfathomable joys that are to come in heaven. It is for our part to remain steadfast in doing good, nourished by the Sacraments, in order to attain to that end for which were specially created. Keep the Faith!

FROM THE PASTOR



THE HOLY SPIRIT AT WORK IN OUR DAILY LIVES

Part VIII Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"And the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."" Luke 3:22

God wants you to embrace the power of the Holy Spirit, which will help you walk in a more victorious, fruitful life as a disciple of Jesus. What we continue to learn is that each encounter with the Holy Spirit is unique and powerful in its own right. After Jesus was baptized in the Jordan River, he received the Holy Spirit as it descended on him as gently as a dove (Matt. 3:16). On the Day of Pentecost, the disciples received the Holy Spirit with amazing manifestations: "...all at once a pillar of fire appeared before their eyes. It separated into tongues of fire that engulfed each one of them. They were all filled and equipped with the Holy Spirit and were inspired to speak in tongues empowered by the Spirit to speak in languages they had never learned" (Acts 2:3-4). Later in Acts, as the Church experienced persecution but responded by coming together in unified prayer, we see the believers again being filled with the Holy Spirit. "At that moment the earth shook beneath them, causing the building they were in to

tremble. Each one of them was filled with the Holy Spirit, and they proclaimed the word of God with unrestrained boldness" (Acts 3:31).

Which unique way do you expect to be filled with the Holy Spirit? Most likely you may not have any clue how this might happen. The most important thing one needs to have is the proper disposition to receive the Holy Spirit. Every day, I must decide intentionally to walk in obedience to God. Scripture tells us that God freely gives the Holy Spirit **"to those who hear and obey Him" (Acts 5:32)**.

Now you must walk with Him, following His promptings and heeding His warnings. When you do something that the Spirit is warning you not to do, you grieve the Spirit (1 Thess. 5.19). When you don't do something that the Spirit is prompting you to do, you quench the Spirit, (Eph. 4.30). When you do what the Spirit is leading you to do, though, you are walking in the Spirit (Gal. 5.25). Then you are "filled with the Holy Spirit" (Eph. 5.18), and the power of the Spirit is released in your life—and of course, released for a purpose.

Being filled with the Spirit will make you a blessing to those who do not yet have knowledge of Jesus. Some describe the Holy Spirit's promptings as a small voice in the heart, an impression, a nudge, or a knowing. When the Holy Spirit is guiding someone toward something helpful, they may feel a sense of peace, joy, or eagerness. When the Holy Spirit is guiding someone away from something harmful, they may feel a sense of heaviness, intuition, or uneasiness. The communication from the Holy Spirit, who doesn't have a body, is with our spirit. So, while we may not usually hear a voice, we sense His prompting, though some would say that they hear a voice. While the manifestations of the Spirit are as varied as each of us is unique, we can all agree on this: let obedience to God's word guide our hearts to do what the Spirit prompts us to do.
