

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Behold, God is my helper, and the Lord is the upholder of my soul; turn back all the evil against my enemies, destroy them in your fidelity, O Lord, the Protector of my life.

Offertory: The ordinances of the Lord are right, bringing joy to all hearts, sweeter than honey or the honeycomb. Therefore your servant will observe them.

Communion: You will accept a sacrifice of righteousness, oblations and burnt offerings, placed on your altar, O Lord.

Once in a while we will see an "imprecatory" Psalm, i.e., a Psalm that calls for retribution against one's enemies. We are taught that all the Psalms are fulfilled in Christ, so what are we to make of this opening verse for Mass? St. Paul teaches us that we struggle against the "powers" of this age, which is to say the powers of hell. The warfare that was common in the Old Testament serves as a type (a symbolic parallel) for the spiritual warfare that we as the Church Militant endure every day. It is fitting, then, that we call upon God to "turb back all the evil" on the enemies of our souls (the Devil and all his hosts). This Antiphon presents a complementary vision of the spiritual life to that offered in the readings. In the battle life, we need a leader. Christ as presented as the Shepherd Who will quide us in our tribulations. All these various images of Our Lord are at play in the rich tapestry of our spiritual lives, and we should embrace them all, for they touch on every aspect of our existence with its joys, sadnesses, trials, failures, and victories. Jesus wears many hats (military leader, Shepherd, Savior, etc.) because our lives are not a linear journey from unholiness to holiness. We rise, fall, get up again, proceed further, fall back a little, fall back a lot, and then move forward again. We need Jesus in all the richness of His divinity to guide us to our eternal homeland where we shall finally rest from our labors with no fear of ever damaging our relationship with God again.

FROM THE PASTOR



Love your Priests

According to recent studies, a great number of priests quit each year. They don't quit because they have a lack of faith in God. They don't quit because they don't believe in the calling God has placed on their life. Most don't even quit because of financial reasons. Priests quit because they are overwhelmed with mental exhaustion.

Until you're a priest you'll never fully understand what it's like to carry spiritual burdens for people. Getting up in the middle of night, praying for your family of faith. Awakened in the middle of night with someone on your heart. Overwhelmed with concern by a person's absence or distance. Your mind continually occupied with the presentation of the upcoming Sunday messag...how to preach it, what to teach on, how do we apply it. Getting critiqued on a continual basis. Being told you need to do better or that some areas of the church simply need to be better.

Priests invest their whole life into people and yet people will turn their backs on their pastor at the first sign of a storm, usually without a conversation. Priests stand in the middle of disputes. Priests stand in the middle of gossip. Priests council broken marriages. Priests comfort those who have suffered loss. Priests navigate the waters of imperfect people with a desire to see each one thrive in their faith.
