NEXT WEEK'S READINGS EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15 The Lord feeds the Israelites with man Responsorial Psalm Psalm 78:3-4, 23-24, 25, 54 A song of praise to God for his deeds to Israel.

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: God is in his holy dwelling place; the God who causes us to dwell together, one at heart, in his house; he himself will give power and strength to his people.

Offertory: I will extol you, O Lord, for you have drawn me up, and have not let my foes rejoice over me. O Lord, I cried unto you and you healed me. **Communion:** Honor the Lord with your substance and with the first fruits of all your produce; then shall your barns be filled with abundance, and your presses shall run over with wine.

The Communion Antiphon beautifully synthesizes the message in today's readings. As with all the Psalms, there is both a literal and spiritual component. The latter is the most important because what the Holy Spirit is asking of us through the psalmist is to give God our very best by, for example, performing our daily responsibilities intentionally with the love of God in our hearts and the desire to please him. This applies to all areas of life and is why the Church has such a rich cultural heritage. Artists, sculptors, and musicians whose memory lives on today in their great works sought to honor God by giving their very best. When we endeavor to do something extraordinary or ordinary with the love of God in our hearts, our efforts, whether they fail or succeed, are blessed abundantly. The interior joy we experience will overflow and touch the lives of others, extending the kingdom of God. Let us strive to follow this "little way," so beautifully expressed by St. Therese of Lisieux, and do all things with extraordinary Daniel Kirkland, Director of Liturgy and Music love!



COME LET US ADORE HIM PART I Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"Come to Me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" Matthew 11:28

On the solemnity of Corpus Christi Sunday in 2022, the Bishops of the USA set in motion the Eucharistic revival movement where we are invited to grow in faith and love of our Lord with us, the Eucharist. One of the ways of deepening our relationship with Jesus is praying before our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Eucharistic Adoration is a posture of love, the placing of oneself in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, whether reposed inside the tabernacle, or exposed inside a special stand called a monstrance. Adoration allows for a personal encounter with Jesus Christ, who is truly and physically present in a special way in the Eucharistic liturgy, and in the Eucharistic species.

While many people pray privately in in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, Adoration can also be performed as communal prayer and worship. This is usually done in the context of a "Holy Hour" that is structured so as to give time for specific communal prayer

as well as private silent prayer. Thus, communal Adoration becomes a beautiful way to help a parish or group grow together to become a truly Eucharistic community. In view of that here at Holy Comforter we have set days (<u>Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays</u>) to have that time of adoration. During adoration we watch and wait, we remain silent in His presence and open ourselves to His graces which flow from the Eucharist. By being present during Adoration, we become what God wants us to be. Like a magnet, Jesus draws us to Himself and gently transforms us.

Jesus is counting on you because the Eucharist is the center of life. "The Church and the world have a great need of eucharistic adoration. Every member of the Church must be vigilant in seeing that the sacrament of love shall be at the center of the life of the people of God so that through all the manifestations of worship due him shall be given back 'love for love' and truly become the life of our souls" (Pope St. John Paul II). Our Lord is hidden there in the Blessed Sacrament, waiting for us to come and visit Him and make our requests to Him. "When Our Lord sees pure souls coming to visit Him in the Blessed Sacrament, He smiles on them. They come with the simplicity that pleases Him so much" (St. John Vianney). The same saint continues to say, "When we are before the Blessed Sacrament, instead of looking about us, let us shut our eyes and open our hearts; and the good God will open his. We will go to him, and he will come to us, the one to give, and the other to receive. It will be like a breath passing from one to the other. What delight we find in forgetting ourselves that we may seek God."

So, if we really love the good God, we should make it our joy and happiness to come a few minutes to adore Him and ask Him for the grace of forgiveness. We should regard those moments as the happiest in our lives. I therefore invite you and encourage you to come and at least spend an hour before the Blessed Sacrament, and you will see the good things happening in your life, in your family, and in our community. Indeed, we ought to visit Him often. How dear to Him is a quarter of an hour spared from our occupations or from some useless engagements to come and pray to Him, visit Him, and console Him for all the ingratitude He receives! When He sees pure souls hurrying to Him, He smiles at them.
