

## LITURGICAL NOTES

**Entrance:** Behold, O God our protector, and consider the face of your Anointed; for one day in your house is better than a thousand elsewhere.

**Offertory:** The Angel of the Lord shall encamp round about those who fear him and shall deliver them; taste and see how good the Lord is.

**Communion:** He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood, abides in me, and I in him, says the Lord.

*Communion is literally ‘union with’ another person. Our Lord Jesus Christ desires not only union with us but a most intimate kind in which we consume Him and are nourished by Him. This is one of the many reasons He chose bread and wine as vehicles of His precious Humanity and Divinity: they nourish us and enliven us. So too does Jesus nourish our souls and vivify them with lifegiving grace when He “enters under our roof” during Holy Communion. Before we were baptized, our souls were dead because of Original Sin. We rose from spiritual death upon being baptized and keep our souls “alive” so to speak by partaking in a worthy manner of the banquet prepared for us at each and every Mass. We partake of the Paschal Lamb – slaughtered to free us from slavery to sin – and are strengthened to carry out the work that needs to be done for the kingdom. But the most important thing to remember is that Jesus simply longs to be with us; Communion is not simply a meal to strengthen us – it is a foretaste of heaven. We were created for Him, that He might delight in our company and we in His. Spend some time in prayer thanking Him for the greatest gift ever – the gift of Himself!*

# FROM THE PASTOR



## IN CONVERSATION WITH GOD: Part I

Father has asked me briefly to discuss the subject of Eucharistic adoration in his absence. This is such an important facet of our faith that it merits a review every now and then. Such giants as St. John Vianney preached on it constantly; Pope St. John Paul II was also a strong proponent of Eucharistic adoration. It is Providential that the Sunday readings throughout much of August are focused on Christ's teaching on the Eucharist as His flesh and blood, scandalizing His contemporaries and showing us that what the Church teaches about the Real Presence in the consecrated bread and wine is actually true. God is surely calling us to reflect on this greatest of mysteries more intently and with renewed zeal. What is Eucharistic adoration, for starters? We already have a general idea of what (or rather, WHO) the Eucharist is, but what does the Church mean by "adoration?" The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes it thus: "Adoration is the first attitude of man acknowledging that he is a creature before his Creator. It exalts the greatness of the Lord who made us and the almighty power of the Savior who sets us free from evil. Adoration is homage of the spirit to the 'King of Glory,' respectful silence in the presence of the 'ever greater' God. Adoration of the thrice-holy and sovereign God of love blends with humility and gives assurance to our supplications." (CCC 2628).

Adoration, then, is an attitude of reverential awe before God, an acknowledgement that there is an infinite chasm between the Creator and the created, and that we as creatures are perpetually indebted to and reliant on our Creator. This leads to praise of God's power, majesty, goodness, mercy, and all His perfections. His infinite goodness and love inspire us to give thanks for the gift of our existence, which He actively sustains and will sustain for all eternity. Realizing this dependence on Him gives us the ability to trust that we can bring our needs before Him, and they will be taken care of. Without adoration, then, we cannot approach these other three dispositions of praise, thanksgiving, and petition.

These four taken together happen to constitute the "four ends" of Mass, or the four attitudes that we are to adopt when praying at Mass.

Eucharistic adoration is therefore a continuation of the Mass in a way. We continue the "prayer of awe", worshipping in the presence of the transcendent God Who has deigned to encapsulate Himself within the form of bread (the wine having been consumed at Mass) in order to remain with us, to hear our woes, to console us, and most especially to love us. It is a dialogue of reverent love, of the soul coming before Jesus and placing herself and all her troubles before Him, of listening to Him, of simply loving Him.

St. Catherine Labouré said: "Whenever I go to the chapel, I put myself in the presence of our good Lord, and I say to him, 'Lord, I am here. Tell me what you would have me to do' . . . And then, I tell God everything that is in my heart. I tell him about my pains and my joys, and then I listen. If you listen, God will also speak to you, for with the good Lord, you have to both speak and listen. God always speaks to you when you approach him plainly and simply."

And St. Theresa of Calcutta (Mother Theresa): "The time you spend with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the best time that you will spend on earth. Each moment that you spend with Jesus will deepen your union with Him and make your soul everlastingly more glorious and beautiful in heaven, and will help bring about an everlasting peace on earth."

As we await Father's return in September when adoration will resume at Holy Comforter, consider how you can arrange your daily life in order to free up an hour of your time once a week to come before Our Lord Jesus Christ to give thanks, to supplicate, simply to be with Him. 
