### LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Incline your ear to me, O Lord, and hear me; O God, save your servant who trusts in you; have mercy on me, O Lord, for unto you do I cry all the day.

Offertory: With expectation I have waited for the Lord, and he has cast his look upon me; he has heard my supplication and he has put a new canticle into my mouth, a song to our God.

Communion: The earth will be satisfied by the work of your hands, O Lord, as you bring forth bread from the land and wine to gladden the heart of man; oil to make his face shine, and bread to strengthen man's heart.

It is characteristic of Entrance Antiphons to begin with supplication, providing us with a wonderful reminder that Mass is in fact a prayer, and that we are offering, through and in union with the priest, Jesus Christ to the Father in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world. We begin Mass today with a plea for mercy, and the Collect after the Gloria nicely concludes the petition begun at the entrance: "[G]rant your people to love what you command and to desire what you promise, that, amid the uncertainties of this world, our hearts may be fixed on that place where true gladness is found." With our petitions fully articulated, the Offertory responds with contented confidence that "he has heard my supplication", modeling the attitude of faith that we need to adopt in our own lives. The Holy Spirit stirs within us prayers to the Father because "we do not know how to pray as we ought", so we should be confident that those same prayers placed in our hearts will truly be answered. Receiving the Eucharist will strengthen us in that conviction especially as we navigate our daily trials. Let us keep our hearts "fixed on that placed where true gladness is found" and trust that Jesus will be our strength and solace amid the toils of this life, for as Peter said, "Lord, to whom shall we go? # FROM THE PASTOR



#### IN CONVERSATION WITH GOD: Part II

Prayer is the lifeline of the soul – it is how we communicate with God. He waits for us to come to Him and even helps us through providing the grace of desiring to pray. When we knock, He opens the door, but we must first knock. St. Alphonus Liguori highlighted the necessity of prayer in a rather stark way: "All souls in hell are there because they did not pray. All the saints sanctified themselves by prayer." That is to say, prayer can be likened to oxygen for the soul. If you stop doing it, you asphyxiate.

We do not feel the effects of the lack prayer as immediately as the body suffers from lack of oxygen or nutrition, but the effects are just as real. One might fall into a particular sin with some regularity, might feel a deepseated unhappiness with life, etc. Just as we go to a doctor every so often to monitor the health of our bodies, so should we also examine our practices of faith and ask ourselves if we are taking good enough care of our souls.

The first thing to do in fostering a good prayer life is to be consistent. The catechism says the following (2710): "The choice of the time and duration of the prayer arises from a determined will, revealing the secrets of the heart. One does not undertake contemplative prayer only when one has the time: one makes time for the Lord, with the firm determination not to give up, no matter what trials and dryness one may encounter. One cannot always meditate, but one can always enter into inner prayer, independently of the conditions of health, work, or emotional state. the heart is the place of this quest and encounter, in poverty ant in faith."

In holding ourselves accountable to quiet prayer time with God every day, we dispose ourselves more and more easily to receive those gifts that He is so ardently desiring to share with us. The regularity of coming to God in prayer builds anticipation within us for a deeper encounter with Him. It is so important that we resolve to persevere, especially when it seems like nothing has happened, God hasn't heard us, or we found ourselves distracted. Faith is tested by fire, as St. Paul says.

While consolations and illuminations in prayer are the work of God, we can still do things to help us grow in the art of praying. We can train ourselves to listen attentively by using things of this world to help us learn attentiveness, such as listening to a beautiful piece of music, reading a good piece of literature, or fixing our gaze on a great work of art. The arts in particular, because of their ability to transmit in a concrete way truth, beauty, and goodness, can help us cultivate attentive listening, which trains the soul in a kind of stillness that is receptive to grace.

So, start by finding ten or fifteen minutes of your day where you can ideally fix your gaze on a holy image – at church or home – and greet Jesus, your brother and friend, and tell Him, "Hear I am Lord, I come to do your will." Then just sit and listen. Maybe you might even start that time with a favorite hymn and listen to it and think on it, making it the subject of your prayer time with God. Just start somewhere....like after reading this! "Let all mortal flesh keep silence..."
