LITURGICAL NOTES

In this installment of my revised series of liturgical notes, I would like to elaborate on the second characteristic of sacred music as enumerated in Pope St. Pius X's *motu proprio* "Tra le Sollecitudini." As discussed in the previous series, sacred music must possess **holiness, goodness of forms, and universality**. Digging deeper into the idea of "goodness of forms," Pius X is not only speaking of a piece of music's artistic merit but how that artistry draws out a particular aspect of the Mass. When he referenced Gregorian chants as the models par excellence of sacred music, it is because their very musical construction is meant to facilitate different kinds of prayer and participation at Mass.

For the Mass, there are two bodies of chant in the repertory: the **Ordinary** of the Mass and the **Propers** of the Mass. The Ordinary are those parts of the Mass that remain the same from week to week, namely the **Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei**. The reforms of the Vatican Council added the **Memorial Acclamation** after the consecration to that list. Since the acclamation is so short and meant to be a simple response, we will be focusing on the historical Ordinary.

The first thing to note about the Ordinary is that it contains the most "singable" of the chants. They vary considerably in difficulty, but overall, they are very well suited to congregational singing. That is because the Ordinary historically belonged to the Faithful. It was their way of exercising their universal priesthood received at baptism in the context of Mass. As Western music history developed, we see a proliferation of Mass Ordinaries that become increasingly choral, and therefore inaccessible to outward participation of the Faithful. Pius X and the Vatican Council after him sought to restore the Ordinary chant repertory to wider use in parishes. **"The Church acknowledges Gregorian chant as specially suited to the Roman liturgy: therefore, other things being equal, it should be given pride of place in liturgical services" (Sacrosanctum Concilium 116).**

WHY THE SORROWS OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Part IV

“This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your heart”

Luke 2:34–35

“Historically, devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows began at the crucifixion as St. John stood with Mary at the foot of the Cross and comforted her, but it wasn't until Good Friday in 1239 that the practice gained in popularity. Our Lady appeared to seven holy men who lived in solitude on Mount Senario in Italy and instructed them to form an Order dedicated to her Sorrows. The men formed the Order of the Servants of Mary (or Servites) and their mission was to meditate on and propagate the Seven Sorrows of Mary. The men, all of whom are canonized saints, introduced the Chaplet (little Rosary) of the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary.”

“It is easy for me to think of Mary as always having had knowledge of her Son and that somehow this made it easier for her. Yet the loss of Jesus in the temple shows us that she did not always have that knowledge. She too suffered when she did not understand what He was doing and when she could not find Jesus” – *like any parent in a situation like that!* “Her son was hidden from her, and this brought her spiritual darkness. As Christians, we suffer a loss

of God when we sin. To have him and then lose him by our own doing is a great suffering for us. Mary, although without sin, also knew the pain of losing her Son, and it is she who teaches us to go in search of Him. **“Mary lost Jesus only in a mystical darkness of the soul, not in the moral blackness of an evil heart,”** says Sheen. **“But she does teach us that, when we lose God, we must not wait for Him to come back. We must go out in search of Him; and, to the joy of every sinner, she knows where he can be found!”**”

“There is another painful moment when Jesus met His mother as He was being led to his execution. Mary did not protest at that moment, which would have been an understandable thing to do. She did not yell or scream or lash out at the soldiers and tried to prevent them from torturing her Son more. Instead, she met his gaze with sorrow that revealed a deep knowledge of the truth of that hour. This is the same knowledge that she brings to us. We can draw comfort from her because she has an intimate knowledge of Jesus. Not only in the moment of his great suffering, but in our own sufferings, big and small, she meets our gaze with the love and compassion of a mother who knows our grief and who offers us the only true consolation: her Son. **“Seeing his mother there with the disciple whom he loved, Jesus said to his mother, 'Woman, there is your son.' In turn he said to the disciple, 'There is your mother.' From that hour onward, the disciple took her into his own home...(Jn 19:25-27).”**”

“Pope Saint John Paul II had a special devotion to the Virgin Mary, who he said was a gift which Christ Himself makes personally to every individual. He made this profound statement which we can meditate on: **“There, at the foot of the cross, begins that special entrusting of humanity to the mother of Christ, which in the history of the church has been practiced and expressed in different ways...Entrusting himself to Mary in a filial manner, the Christian, like the apostle John, welcomes the mother of Christ 'into his own home' and brings her into everything that makes up his inner life.”**”

Truly the Mother of Sorrows is our mother who shares our grief and inviting us to share in her sorrows that we may hate sin, avoid sin, repent our sins, thus wiping her tears.

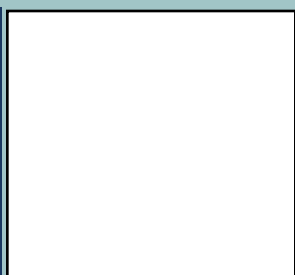
