

HOLY FAMILY SUNDAY

First Reading Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14

Responsorial Psalm 128:1-2, 3, 4-5.

LITURGICAL NOTES

Introit: Skies, let the Just One come forth like the dew, let him descend from the clouds like the rain. The earth will open up and give birth to our Savior.

This Sunday, the Church cries with the voice of ancient Israel in the days before the New Covenant, begging the heavens to **rorate** or "rain down" the Savior. Taken as a whole, this Introit stunningly illuminates Isaiah's passage: "So shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it" (Is. 55:11). God spoke in eternity, and the Word He spoke was Jesus. The Word came down from the heavenly realm and took root in the flesh of the Virgin Mary and returned to the Father after His course was run, having procured our salvation. Truly, he did not return "empty"! At the same time, the Church's cry for the Savior to come points to the end of time, though this meaning is more understated since we are so close to Christmas. Nevertheless, as we anticipate the historical coming of Jesus Christ in the lowly manger, let us stir into flame within our hearts the desire for union with God, ultimately fulfilled in heaven and fully realized at the resurrection of the dead when He comes again. WAITING ON GOD TO FULFILL HIS PROMISE Part III

"So shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it" Isaiah 55:11

It is very important that we acknowledge that we are not the first of God's people to WAIT on His word to be fulfilled for our good and His glory. In Jeremiah, God raises up a prophet through whom He speaks to his people words of both judgment and salvation. It was Jeremiah's job to call God's people back to God. If they continued in unfaithfulness, they would face God's words of judgment pronounced in the Sinai covenant. If, however, they returned to God, they would once again experience God's covenant promises of living in His presence in a kingdom of justice, righteousness, peace, wholeness, and restoration. That is, they would dwell with God in a kingdom with no evil. Because Jeremiah was afraid to take on this ministry (1:6), the Lord not only promised to be with him (1:8) and to give him the words to say (1:7-9), He also promised to watch over His word to fulfill it (1:11-12). It is important to know that God would fulfill His word; it

would not fail. Because Judah continued in disobedience, God fulfilled his word of judgment against them in 587 BC. But God's word of salvation did not fail.

Through Jeremiah God also promised to restore his people on the basis of a new covenant that would provide all His people with new hearts, forgiveness, God's Spirit, and a personal knowledge of Him (Jer.31:31-34). This new covenant, Jeremiah declared, would be established by God's faithful shepherd who would gather God's scattered flock (23:1-8). We know this good shepherd to be Jesus (Jn 10:1-18), the Word of God who became flesh and dwelt among us (Jn. 1:14). Through Jesus's life, death, resurrection, and exaltation, God has already fulfilled His promises of both judgment and salvation, even as we await their full expression in His eternal kingdom.

There is coming a day when all who trust in Christ will experience no more evil, or sin but only righteousness, justice, and peace. On that day, we will face no more sickness, disease, or death but only healing and wholeness. More importantly, on that day we will dwell with God and He with us. * All of this is to be accomplished in God's time; we have to exercise WAITING. We may face sin, evil, and suffering in this world, but we need not lose hope. God's promises are meant to drive our faith into patient-WAITING.

God is watching over His word to perform whatever he intended to achieve. God is faithful, not one word will fail. You cannot outwait God – His lovingkindness is everlasting! He will be faithful to move in your life. He will not forsake you. And you will be blessed and transformed by the lessons you have learned through your seasons of waiting on Him. For sure our salvation is at hand.
