

# LITURGICAL NOTES

**Offertory:** Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. We bless you from the house of the Lord; the Lord God is our light, alleluia, alleluia.

The Baptism of the Lord is the second manifestation (or "epiphany") of Jesus' identity as our Divine Savior. Traditionally, the Epiphany season consisted of a trifecta of manifestations: the first and most well-know is the one in the manger to the Magi; the second is today's feast and the third will be commemorated next Sunday (only on Year C), the wedding at Cana. The Baptism is a particularly interesting feast because not only does Our Lord reveal a little about His identity, but He also reveals the nature of His mission. Having a divine nature as well as human, He was sinless. By allowing Himself to be baptized, however, He made an act of repentance for sins He did not commit, revealing that He came to take on our quilt and offer us complete pardon. It is a magnificent display of God's Justice and Mercy walking handin-hand in perfect unity, well beyond our human understanding. This feast also marks the end of the Church's Christmas festivities. We return to the liturgical color green (representative of hope among other things) tomorrow and being the process of awaiting the holy preparations of Lent. # FROM THE PASTOR



## WE ARE PILGRIMS OF HOPE

Part II

"Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you!" Isaiah 49:15

"The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; He has sent me to bring glad tidings to the lowly, to heal the brokenhearted, To proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners, To announce a year of favor from the Lord". (Is.61:1 & Lk.4:18-19). Of all the profound truths written by the prophets in the Old Testament, why did Jesus choose this verse from prophet Isaiah for this time? Because Jesus had a purpose. A mission about to begin and his mission is valid up to our generation. Isaiah spoke prophetic words of encouragement and admonition to his people. Isaiah's name meant, "the Lord saves," which so perfectly proclaimed the message God used him to deliver. We must rely on God alone. Putting our hope in any other source will only lead to disaster. Isaiah offered a voice of truth in a time when God's people sometimes strayed from the Lord's ways. Yet these Godinspired words would hold more significance than Isaiah could possibly know. As Isaiah was authorized and directed to proclaim liberty to the Jews in Babylon, so was Christ, God's messenger, to publish a more joyful jubilee to a lost world. And

such a message is very appropriate to us the "the Pilgrims of Hope".

Jesus moved among people offering healing, mercy, and grace to all people. He continues to give unconditional love to all, regardless of where we came from or what we'd done. What a life -giving message. Having given such an opportunity, we must also step up to do our part to accept that unconditional love other wise we face what the letter to the Thessalonians points out, when we refuse to follow Christ. "He will punish those who do not know God and do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. They will be punished with everlasting destruction and shut out from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of his might."(2Thes. 1:8-9).

When Jesus told the world the Spirit anointed him to proclaim the good news, he also told us who he came to save. The poor, brokenhearted, captives, and prisoners. He came for you and me. So this year of favor is relevant for us. Are you poor in spirit today? Has the baggage you've carried for years crippled you under its weight? 2025 is here to take away such a baggage from you. "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Mt. 5:3).

Has loss or grief left you brokenhearted? Do you feel alone, like no one cares? This opportunity of grace 2025 is for you. "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me"(Jn. 14:1).

Have you been bound by addiction? Or felt like you're suffocating, overwhelmed, and can't break free? This time around you are to be set free. "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free" (Gal.5:1).

We should also keep in mind the words of the promise from our Lord that: "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you" (Jn. 14:26). So as *pilgrims of hope*, we can rejoice today knowing the Holy Spirit guides us, just like He did with Jesus. Whether we face daily struggles or life's most difficult challenges, the Holy Spirit empowers us to keep moving forward. He will be our strength, our guide, and our comfort. All we need to do is ask him.
