LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance (*Domine, in tua misericordia*): O Lord, I have placed my trust in your merciful love; my heart has rejoiced in your salvation. I will sing unto the Lord who has dealt bountifully with me.

Offertory (*Intende voci*): Harken to the voice of my prayer, O my King and my God, for it is you, O Lord, whom I implore.

Communion (*Narrabo*): I will relate all your wondrous deeds. I will be glad and rejoice in you; I will sing to the honor of your name, O Most High. *There is a striking line in today's Gospel that illuminates the Propers: "love your enemies and do good to them[...]and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked." We have all sinned and are therefore in need of mercy, so Our Lord exhorts us to show mercy as we have been shown mercy. How fitting a response, then, is the Communion Antiphon, which is a response of wonderment and a call to share what has been so freely given. The "mode" of the chant, which determines the most important note of the scale and giving the chant a particular quality, is a solemn one, befitting the opening word, "narrabo" (I will tell/narrate). We get the sense that something great is about to unfold, and it is in fact the wondrous mercy of God, of the Cross and how our sinful nature has been crucified with it. Musically, the melody rises on the words "mirabilia tua" ("your wondrous deeds"), extending the word "tua" to express importance rhetorically and joy musically. We therefore join the Offertory Antiphon and raise our voices in prayer, asking for God's mercy upon us and the strength to pass on that mercy to all whom we encounter. We know our prayer will be answered because God is merciful, and the chant emphasizes this again with its choice of mode, which is very settled and stable, and also by a drawing out of the words "quoniam ad te" ("for it is to you [that I pray]"). By choosing these words in particular to highlight, the music is telling us that, "of course your prayer will be answered because it is He Who is merciful whom you are praying to." Let us rejoice in the mercy of God and ask for pardon for those who do not know to ask it for themselves.*

HAITI: From Bob Fromm..."I recently returned from a mission trip to the Haiti border, assisting Medical Missionaries in delivering supplies to various medical facilities, including the border hospital in Banica, the Sisters of St. Joseph medical convent, border clinics, St. Joseph's Hospital in Thomassique, our clinic of St. Michel, and Our Lady of Altragrace clinic. We made nine trips across the border, that also included computers for the schools in the Diocese of Hinch. This mission support trip, was a work of the Tri-Parish ministry and other organizations. It provided hope and life to tens of thousands. The Grace of Our Lord blesses our communities for these accomplishments.

This weekend's readings encourage reflection on sources of hope, trust, and identity, fostering a deeper engagement with faith and relationship with God. FROM THE PASTOR



WE ARE PILGRIMS OF HOPE

Part VIII

"I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me."

Galatians 2:20

Paul made the cross a strong focus of his teaching because God had revealed to him the great power in the work of Christ at the cross. He understood that there was great power in understanding and relying on what happened at the cross. Our new identity in Christ, which should lead us to praise God for the new life we have in the risen Christ, should also lead us to praise God because our old selves died with Christ at the cross. Through the cross, God has provided us with the one way we can experience liberation from sin in our lives.

Our faith must rest on the fact that our old selves died with Christ at the cross. We must see ourselves as God sees us. The sinful nature that produces sin in us was condemned by God at the cross. We were judicially separated from it by God. We died to it. We have been freed from the old mas-

ter, sin, and are now alive to a new master, Christ! Do you now see the priceless value of the cross? The Cross indeed is our HOPE to reach our destiny, thus we stand as PILGRIMS OF HOPE.

As we rest in these spiritual realities based on our union with Christ, the Holy Spirit works in us to produce the godly character He desires for us. This is all the work of God through His amazing grace, obtained by the cross. We need not struggle, strive, or follow a rule system in order to have the life of Christ become more and more evident in our lives. That way leads only to frustration and failure! God's way is by faith—trusting in Christ increasingly to live out His life through us because He is our life!

St. Paul says: **"I have been crucified with Christ, and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me" (Gal. 2:20).** And he continues elsewhere: **"Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God" (Col. 3:1-3).**

Rest in these facts from God's word: Your old sinful nature was crucified with Christ at the cross 2000+ years ago. You have been separated from it. Christ has not only you saved you from your sins, but He has also delivered you from the power of their source, your sinful nature. You are now united with Christ and His life is living in you and through you! No doubt the power of the cross moves us from death to life. It starts us on our journey as a new creation, leading us to maturity and growth in Christ all along the way. It is a message so simple but so paradoxical; a message that contrasts man's wisdom against God's folly; a message we are entrusted to proclaim to the nations. What is this message that seems weak and foolish to the world but is indeed the power of God for those who are being saved? The power and joy in the cross.

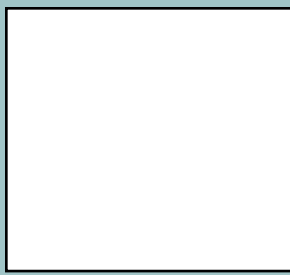


