

# LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance (Invocabit me): When he calls to me, I will answer him; I will rescue him and hon-or him; with long life will I satisfy him.

Offertory (*Scapulis suis*): The Lord will overshadow you with his pinions, and you will find refuge under his wings. His faithfulness will encompass you with a shield.

**Communion** (*Scapulis suis*): He will overshadow you with his pinions, and you will find refuge under his wings. His faithfulness will encompass you with a shield.

Psalm 90 (91) features prominently and, truth be told, exclusively in today's Propers. The Entrance, Gradual/Responsorial Psalm, Tract (an extended psalm that replaces the Alleluia), Offertory, and Communion all focus on the protection that God affords to his faithful Servant, which is fulfilled in Christ. It is this very same psalm that the devil tries to manipulate to force our Lord to test the Father's faithfulness. By asking Jesus to throw himself off a column to test the veracity of the passage - "For you has he commanded his angels to keep you in all your ways. They shall bear you upon their hands, lest you **strike your foot against a stone."** – would imply that Jesus does NOT trust the Father and needs to make sure by doing something insane as proposed by Satan. That trust is built into the Entrance and Offertory in a special way. The "mode" or scale used is described as "angelic" because of its perfectly contented ethos. The central note in the melody is Sol, the fifth note of the Do Re Mi scale. HAITI: The Haiti ministry originated with Bishop Sullivan who championed the concept of "twinning" with impoverished Haitian parishes. The departure of Belgian missionary priests left Haiti in deeper spiritual and financial despair. Holy Comforter twinned with the St. Michel Parish, a remote mountain village, in the early 1990s focusing on spirituality and education. As enrollment exceeded 400 by 2013, a separate preschool on campus was built. Beginning in 2014, the decision to add one school year annually was approved. By 2020, St. Michel attained college accreditation, with its inaugural Philo class (13th grade) achieving a 100% pass rate on the National Exam. Your \$175 annual sponsorship provides over 600 students with meals, books, clean water, a safe environment, and an excellent education. Contributions via Parish Giving, check (memo line Haiti Sponsorship), or marked envelopes ensure this work continues. Thank you for your generosity and prayers. # FROM THE PASTOR





LENT – THE WAY TO VICTORY WITH CHRIST

Part II

# "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me" Matthew 16:24

The season of Lent is a natural time to think about the practice of turning toward Jesus. During Lent, we ask forgiveness for the times we have left Jesus' ways of truth, justice, and love, and seek strength and quidance to turn back to those ways as we grow closer to Jesus. It's a time to work on discipline. The 40 days of Lent are also a good time to work on personal discipline in general. Instead of giving something up, it can be doing something positive. "I'm going to do more spiritual exercises. I'm going to pray more. I'm going to be nicer to my family, friends, and coworkers." It's about dying to yourself. The more serious side of Lenten discipline is that it's about more than self-control – it's about finding aspects of yourself that are less than Christ-like and letting them die. The suffering and death of Christ are foremost on our minds during Lent, and we join in these mysteries by suffering, dying with Christ, and being resurrected in a purified form.

**Don't do too much.** It's tempting to make Lent an ambitious project of personal success, but it's best to keep it simple and focused. There's a reason the Church works on these mysteries year after year. We spend *our entire lives* growing closer to God. Don't try to cram it all in one Lent. That is a recipe for failure.

Lent reminds us of our weakness. Of course, even when we set simple goals for ourselves during Lent, we still have trouble keeping them. When we fast, we realize we're all just one meal away from hunger. In both cases, Lent shows us our weakness. This can be painful, but recognizing how helpless we are makes us seek God's help with renewed urgency and sincerity.

Be patient with yourself. When we're confronted with our own weakness during Lent, the temptation is to get angry and frustrated. "What a bad person I am!" But that's the wrong lesson. God is calling us to be patient and to see ourselves as he does, with unconditional love.

**Reach out in charity.** As we experience weakness and suffering during Lent, we should be renewed in our compassion for those who are hungry, suffering, or otherwise in need. The third part of the Lenten formula is *almsgiving*. It's about more than throwing a few extra dollars in the collection basket; it's about reaching out to others and helping them without question as a way of sharing the experience of God's unconditional love.

Learn to love like Christ above all else. Giving of ourselves in the midst of our suffering and self-denial brings us closer to loving like Christ, who suffered and poured himself out unconditionally on the cross for all of us. Lent is a journey through the desert to the foot of the cross on Good Friday, as we seek him out, ask his help, join in his suffering, and learn to love like him.
