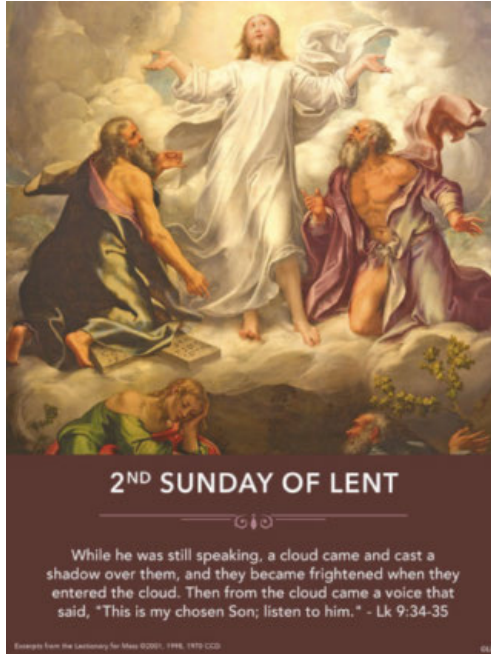

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance (*Reminiscere*): Remember your mercies, Lord, and your love which is from all eternity. Do not let our enemies triumph over us; deliver us, O God of Israel, from all our tribulations.

Offertory (*Meditabor*): I shall meditate upon your commandments which I greatly love; I will extend my hands towards your commandments which I love.

Communion (*Visionem*): Tell no one about the vision you have seen until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.

Today the Lord reveals His Divinity to the inner circle of the apostles, preparing them for the atrocities that are to unfold in Jerusalem during Holy Week. I think the most interesting musical response to this Gospel is the Offertory chant, which touches on a theme hinted at by Peter, “Lord, it is good to be here.” It is the life of prayer that will sustain us in tribulation. The Offertory draws this out with an exceptionally horizontal feeling melody, elongating important words like “dilexi” (“which I great love...”) on the same note. One gets the sense that the melody constantly returning to this particular note is like the life of prayer, a rising up and persevering. Let us recommit ourselves to greater prayer this week and for the rest of Lent (and our lives!).

HAITI: Belgian missionaries from the Congregation of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (CICM) began work in 1953, founding the original church, rectory, school, and clinic in Saltadere. After the Diocese of Hinche's establishment in 1972, parish priests assumed responsibilities, but by the late 1990s, the clinic had fallen into disrepair. In response, the Tri-Parish Haiti medical team spearheaded the construction of a new clinic in 2017, funded by Hope for Haiti Dinner and Auction organized by Drs. Sanusi, Nasel, and Daniero. The clinic now serves St. Michel's school, Saltadere, and nearby villages, staffed by dedicated healthcare professionals. With a modern birthing room and affordable medicines, it addresses critical health needs. Medical team visits are expected to resume once travel is deemed safe. FROM THE PASTOR



LENT – THE WAY TO VICTORY WITH CHRIST

Part III

“I discipline my body like an athlete, training it to do what it should. Otherwise, I fear that after preaching to others I might be disqualified.” 1 Corinthians 9:27

The season of Lent opens the ground of “Discipline” to help us be in union with Christ’s way of accomplishing the will of the Father. The word “discipline” is an interesting word to consider as we take on this journey of Lent. I think most people hear or read the word and immediately associate it with something negative or painful. We are disciplined as children when we disobey our parents or behave poorly in school or other social settings. We are disciplined when in school we violate rules or policies or if we have been found to have cheated on an exam or project. As adults, discipline comes in the form of traffic tickets or being written up at work for poor performance. “Discipline” is a hard word to like. Yet, the Church invites us to embrace discipline as we desire to grow in holiness of life.

As is evidenced by the Scripture text cited above, Paul emphasizes the need for self-discipline and training in the Christian life. Paul himself also serves as our example in such things that could help us to be more united to Christ and his way of life. Having called the Corinthians to discipline themselves so that they may inherit the prize of eternal life, Paul notes that even he disciplines and trains himself (1 Cor. 9:24-27). Aware of his own sin and potential for self-deception, Paul worked diligently to learn and practice self-control, to not practice his Christian freedom in such a way that would hurt

other believers (vv. 1–23). The Apostles did not stand apart from the church as those who had no need to discipline themselves; rather, they were fellow believers who had to work hard to persevere in the Christian faith. Under the grace of God, they worked out their salvation in fear and trembling (Phil. 2:12-13).

Paul did this so that he would not be disqualified even after leading many people to faith in Christ (1 Cor. 9:27). He well understood that all those who have true faith in Christ persevere to the end and only those who persevere to the end have true faith in Christ. He did not use his ministry success as an excuse to neglect discipline. He trained himself to persevere. I propose that we need to consider discipline positively as it relates to our observance of Lent. In saying this, I am saying that we ought to love fasting or sacrificing personal time to tend to the needs of others and spending more time in prayer but without neglecting our obligations in our state of life. We must be aware that the discipline of Lent is not meant to be a punishment imposed on us by God or the Church. Rather, the discipline in Lent is meant to help us refocus on what is most important in our lives as we follow Christ and his way of living.

Though food, recreation, and entertainment are not necessarily bad things, they can become so important to us that we are living only for them. That is not the way of a disciple. We fast and sacrifice in Lent to remind us that **“life is more than food and the body more than clothing” (Matt. 6:25)**. The disciplines of Lent help us to turn our hearts and minds back to the source of all blessings and graces—God. So, what should our discipline look like? I know all too well what often distracts me from keeping my eyes on the Lord, so I tend to embrace practices which cause me to spend more time “looking up” than looking around. Each one of us needs to consider carefully our lives and ask: *what is it in my life that most distracts me from keeping my life centered in the love of God?* If it’s entertainment, sports, or social media, then cut these things out of our lives for the 40 days. If it is an attachment to food and drink, then consider extending the fasts and abstaining of Lent to other days, not just Fridays.

To be disciplined does not mean we like the sacrifices in themselves, but we embrace them because of the greater good. As St. Paul wrote, **“athletes exercise discipline in every way. They do it to win a perishable crown, but we an imperishable one” (1 Cor. 9:25)**. Keeping our eyes on the true prize helps us realize that the disciplines of Lent are good because they lead us to imitate one who leads the way carrying the cross.

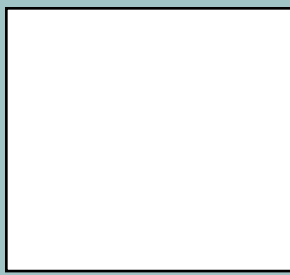
