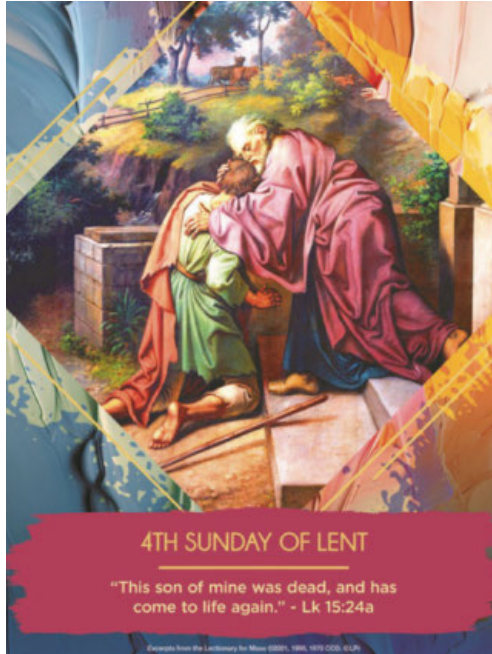

2025 Annual Diocesan Appeal: *Sharing His Love with Others*

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance (*Laetare Ierusalem*): Rejoice, O Jerusalem; and gather round, all you who love her; rejoice in gladness, after having been in sorrow; exult and be replenished with the consolation flowing from her motherly bosom.

Offertory (*Laudate Dominum*): Praise the Lord, for he is loving; sing in honor of his name, for he is gracious. He has accomplished whatever he resolved to do in heaven and on earth.

Communion (*Oporet te*): My son, you should rejoice; for your brother who was dead has come back to life; he was lost and he has been found. *Today's Gospel is one of the most beloved stories of reconciliation offered by our Lord Jesus Christ as representative of the Father's superabundant love for His creatures. The Communion Chant, which is typically a selection from the Gospel of the day, captures in a simple and beautiful way the joy of the Father as He is encouraging the Prodigal's brother of the necessity of rejoicing. It is in a "mode" (essentially a musical scale) that highlights intervals that sound major or pleasant to our ears. The ancients gave it the descriptor "perfectus" (perfect) because chants set to that mode often sound contented and settled. On the other end of the spectrum is the Offertory Chant, which also highlights the love of God, but does so in a solemn way, taking its cue from the first word "Laudate" (praise), which often has a more worshipful, and thereby formal, sense. The Entrance Chant, for which this Sunday is named (Laetare Sunday), uses a mode which the Medievals described as "laeta" (joyful) because the particular combination of steps in the scale gives it a particularly jubilant character. All in all, the chants this weekend provide a brief reprieve from the mournful character of the season, reminding us that God's love for us knows no bounds and is ready to receive us into communion with Him. We need but turn away from our sins with conviction and lean on Him with unshakeable confidence. Jesus, I trust in You!*

LENT – THE WAY TO VICTORY WITH CHRIST

Part V

“Then Jesus said to his disciples, ‘Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.’” Matthew 16:24

Lent is a time when we are taught to strive to “deny ourselves,” but what does that mean? What are we denying ourselves and why? Pope Francis tells us: **“Lent is a fitting time for self-denial; we would do well to ask ourselves what we can give up in order to help and enrich others by our own poverty. Let us not forget that real poverty hurts: no self-denial is real without this dimension of penance. I distrust a charity that costs nothing and does not hurt.”**

Thomas a Kempis, who wrote *The Imitation of Christ*, said: **“Learn to die to the world now, that then you may begin to live with Christ. Learn to spurn all things now, that then you may freely go to Him. Chastise your body in penance now, that then you may have the confidence born of certainty.”**

Some medieval theologians often interpreted self-denial in this “spurning the world” sense, arguing that the call of Christ is to move away from attachment to all earthly things

and that a good Christian should keep himself *as a stranger here on earth, a pilgrim whom its affairs do not concern at all.*

But is Christ's call to “deny” ourselves really a directive to shun all things in this world? In Mark 8:35, Christ says, **“whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it.”** Essentially, he is saying that whoever prioritizes his own happiness in this world will not find it, while the person who abandons this self-centered pursuit and puts Christ first will find happiness in abundance. There is nothing in there about disliking all the things in the world. There is nothing about denying all pleasures. It's simply a matter of priorities and obedience. Self-denial doesn't mean being imprisoned by unreasonable self-abasement; rather, it is freedom to let go of egotism and replace the primacy of our own will with that of obedience and dependence on Christ.

This is not to say that the Christian life is easy. In the book *The Cost of Discipleship* it is stated that there are demands to discipleship; that grace is not cheap, but rather costly:

“Costly grace confronts us as a gracious call to follow Jesus, it comes as a word of forgiveness to the broken spirit and the contrite heart. It is costly because it compels a man to submit to the yoke of Christ and follow him; it is grace because Jesus says: ‘My yoke is easy, and my burden is light.’”

We therefore must keep in mind that the Lenten season with its spirit of self-denial—so crucial to our Christian identity—isn't so much about our own valiant efforts to avoid things or “go without” as much as it is a call to passionately place ourselves in Christ, finding our identity in him, and letting him work through us for the sake of our neighbor and for the world. With the season of Lent underway, let us not once praise ourselves for the effort. It's not about us. It's about living our lives for another—for the sake of Christ and the Gospel and gaining true life in the process.

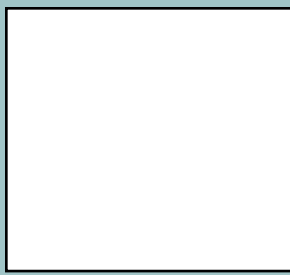
