

# LITURGICAL NOTES

**Entrance** (*Iudica me, Deus*): Vindicate me, O God, and defend my cause against an ungodly nation; from wicked and deceitful men deliver me, for you are my God and my strength.

Offertory (Confitebor tibi, Domine): I will praise you, O Lord, with my whole heart; deal bountifully with your servant, that I may live and observe your word; revive me according to your word, O Lord. **Communion** (Nemo te condemnavit): Woman, has no one condemned you? No one, Lord. – Neither do I condemn you; go and do not sin again. The Entrance Antiphon this Sunday is very striking both textually and musically. Psalm 42 is referenced here, and it is Christ who speaks, begging the Father to deliver him from his persecutors. We see this change in tone because the readings in general start taking a dark turn with references to the pharisees plotting to have Jesus killed. Musically, we see this reflected in the mode (basically a scale) of the piece, which prominently features a "half step" (from one key directly to the next for you pianists out there!) at the beginning of the scale. As a result of this particular arrangement of notes, the melody sounds mournful. From a singer's perspective, the melody is also quite jagged, jumping around a lot, sometimes in unintuitive ways, as if to imitate the act of sobbing. Not only is our Lord suffering from a human fear of what is to come during his Passion, but he is also deeply saddened at the hardness of heart of the people whom he loves so dearly. Let us strive more and more to purge those sins and vices from our lives that harden our hearts to Jesus, present in the Blessed Sacrament and in our neighbor. Callousness, jadedness, and indifference all stem from the numbing effects of sin in our lives, making us less human and less capable of receiving God's love in our lowliness. # FROM THE PASTOR





LENT – THE WAY TO VICTORY WITH CHRIST

Part VI

"When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him there, along with the criminals— one on his right, the other on his left" Luke 23:33

Allow me to acknowledge with you and reflect on the fact that Jesus' journey to the cross was difficult. This might seem so obvious that it is hardly worth saying, but I think it is good that we carefully consider the difficulty of Jesus' journey as we take up our cross to follow him. I suppose it can be said that the whole of Jesus' life was difficult. He was born in poverty. He was constantly opposed. Members of his own family did not at first believe him. He was often a man on the run. The whole of Jesus' life was characterized by difficulty. But here I wish to emphasize that Jesus' final journey to the cross was exceptionally difficult.

We speak often of the fact that Jesus came to die for sinners. Notice that the death he died was not what we would call a natural death. He did not die of natural causes. He did not grow old for us. He did not succumb to illness for us. His life was not ended by way of, what we would call, an accident. No, he was put to death by sinful men.

As we consider Jesus' journey to the cross – the false trial, the brutality with which he was treated, the crucifixion itself – we should

be struck by the irony. Here is Jesus, the eternal Word of God come in the flesh, the one through whom and for whom the universe was made, the giver and sustainer of life. He comes to man, not to judge, mind you, but to accomplish

salvation. And what does man do with him? Their natural impulse is to kill him. Can you imagine? Isn't it also ironic that it was the high priest who condemned Jesus to death?

Picture Caiaphas, the high priest of Israel, and Jesus standing before him. Don't you find it ironic that – though the office he held was intended to serve as a kind of placeholder until the true high priest would come, and though the work he did was packed with symbolic significance which pointed forward to the true lamb of God who would take away the sins of the world – when the true high priest, who is also the true lamb of God, stood before him, he did not recognize him. Caiaphas didn't get it. Not even close. He was arrogant, unjust, and ignorant. He was ignorant as to the true significance of the position he held. He was ignorant as to the significance of the man who stood before him. And he was ignorant as to the significance of the moment.

So here is the irony: Caiaphas was high priest, and one of his responsibilities was to offer up sacrifices to God on behalf of the people for the forgiveness of sins. This he in fact did. He offered up Jesus, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins, not only of the Jews, but of all the peoples of the earth. He did so in ignorance and in sin. But he did it according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God.

The point of all this is that Jesus' journey was indeed a difficult one. He was falsely accused, falsely tried, and mistreated. Can you imagine being the guy who slapped Jesus when he answered back to Caiaphas? He slapped Jesus! And for what? Jesus simply replied to Caiaphas' questions about his teaching saying, "'I have spoken openly to the world...I have said nothing secretly. Why do you ask me? Ask those who have heard me what I said to them...' When he had said these things, one of the officers standing by struck Jesus with his hand, saying, 'Is that how you answer the high priest?'" (Jn. 18:20–22). How blind these men were to the reality of things.

We tend to emphasize the physical suffering he endured, but consider the emotional, psychological, and spiritual aspects of all this. Think of the humility, the restraint, the submission to the Father that Jesus maintained in order to accomplish the Father's will. He suffered for you and me and for all who believe. What are you doing to thank Him?


