

## LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance (Quasimodo geniti infantes): As newborn babes, alleluia, long for pure spiritual milk, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

Offertory (Angelus Domini descendit): The Angel of the Lord came down from heaven and said to the women: "The One whom you seek has risen, as he said he would", alleluia.

Communion (Mitte manum tuam): Stretch forth your hand, and feel the place where the nails were, alleluia; and be not doubtful but believing, alleluia, alleluia.

We have just celebrated eight days of Easter Sunday. The "Easter Octave" suspends liturgical time because Easter is so central to who we are that the Church has seen it fit to celebrate it eight times with all due solemnity and joy. Easter is in fact the reason we have octaves because the Church very early in the history of the Church understood the Day of Resurrection (Sunday) to be the "eighth day of creation" when Christ wonderfully remade human nature by His resurrection – the Firstborn of a new creation. Seven represents completeness and eight represent eternity; hence, liturgical octaves suspend time, giving us a foretaste of the unending Easter joys of heaven. It is eminently fitting that the octave ends with an emphasis on the Mercy of God, which was shown to the apostles locked away in the upper room who were afraid at the sight of Jesus because they had abandoned Him. He dispels their fears with the warm greeting, "Peace be with you" and shows St. Thomas the apostle mercy in the face of his utter doubt of the resurrection. Join us for the great hour of Divine Mercy (3pm Sunday) where we will sing the Chaplet in the presence of the Sacrament and the image commissioned by St. Faustina at the request of Jesus Himself. Christ is risen! Alleluia!

# FROM THE PASTOR





### TO VICTORY WITH CHRIST

Part II

"I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me."

Galatians 2:20

Victory in Christ...it's what many Christians want. It's what we've been promised by Christ himself. But do we understand the victory of Christ and the impact it makes on us? How do those victories come about? Do we have a formula that we can all apply to achieve such victories?

We rejoice in Jesus' victory every Easter. The church triumphantly sings, "He arose a victor from the dark domain, and he lives forever with his saints to reign." But do we appreciate the extent of what we celebrate? Scripture calls the resurrection a "victory" over death that Jesus wins for us; without it we would "perish" (1 Cor. 15:18, 57). Jesus has risen, vested by God with "all authority in heaven and on earth" to gather his church, defeat his enemies, and consummate his kingdom (Matt. 28:18-20). He accomplishes these goals by taking up his victorious rule as he moves forward from his resurrection triumph to ascend into heaven, sit at God's right hand, pour out the Holy Spirit on the church, and some day return as Savior and Judge. As we begin to understand the scope and spoils of his victory, we begin to grasp the great hope and joy that belong to us as the people of a risen Lord.

At one time, I assumed that "victory in Christ"—or living a victorious Christian life in the middle of our sinful, messed-up world—meant having victory in my own life, as I chose to define it. Because of my culture, I thought that having victory in Christ meant that I had to become increasingly self-sufficient. Americans are known for their independence, self-reliance, and willingness to "go it on our own." These qualities are tremendously helpful when homesteading or even starting up a business, but they are not great assets when trying to find true victory in Christ.

In 1 John 5:3–4, we read, "In fact, this is love for God: to keep his commands. And his commands are not burdensome, for everyone born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has overcome the world, our faith". So I believe that for me to become victorious, I need to grow in faith, in love, and obedience to Christ. I want to be like Him—and He was not an island. He was not a rebel who did whatever He wanted.

In John 8:28, Jesus said, "When you lift up the Son of Man, then you will know that I am He, and I do nothing on My own initiative, but I speak these things as the Father taught Me." Jesus lived in total dependence on God the Father. "Very truly I tell you, the Son can do nothing by himself; he can do only what he sees his Father doing, because whatever the Father does the Son also does" (Jn. 5:19). Besides that, he also chose to live in dependence on the kindness of others, and He depended on the disciples to spread His message after He was gone. That's a lot of dependence. I realize I need to be increasingly more dependent on God, and what I'm now learning is that I need to be more dependent on the Christians around me too. If I allow my life to become intertwined with Jesus Christ and with others—to let me know my weaknesses and failures, my struggles and hopes, and to understand theirs—I am following Jesus's example, and He will be honored in my victories.

As I do this, I grow. My catholic friends tell me things that I would not come up with on my own. Some of them are embarrassing, and some hurt. But sometimes my soul is encouraged and refreshed in ways it would never be otherwise. Responding well to these kinds of blessings—the ones that hurt and the ones that refresh—are one part of what "victory in Christ" looks like. But even though this idea is contradictory to my own instinct at times, pursuing this victory in Christ is more surprising and wonderful than I expected. Alleluia! the Lord is Risen.


