

NEXT WEEK'S READINGS

FOURTH SUNDAY IN EASTER First Reading Acts of the Apostles 13:14,43 -52 Paul and Barnabas preach the good news among the Gentiles and are expelled by the Jews. Responsorial Psalm Psalm 100:1-2,3,5

A song in praise of God who shepherds us.

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance *(Iubilate Deo)*: Shout joyfully to God, all the earth, alleluia; sing a psalm to his name, aleluia; praise him with magnificence, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

Offertory (Lauda, anima mea): Praise the Lord, O my soul; I will praise the Lord throughout my life; I will sing to my God for as long as I live, alleluia. Communion (Simon Ioannis): Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these? Lord, you know all things, you know, O Lord, that I love you, alleluia. Here we have this week two different psalms of praise at the Entrance and Offertory, and the modes or scales chosen for them reflect different aspects of that praise. The Entrance is set to a mode that settles on Sol (the fifth note of the Do Re Mi scale), which is described as both "angelic" and "perfection". It is the most contented and joyful of the Gregorian modes, pivoting back and forth between Sol and Do in an upward motion reminiscent of brass signaling the beginning of a festival or the arrival of royalty. The Offertory on the other hand, is set to a mode grounded in Mi (third note of the Do Re Mi scale), which features a half step at the beginning of the scale, giving it sometimes a mournful quality, sometimes a mystical quality. I think the particular chant brings out some of the more major (i.e., happier) sounds of the scale, creating a sense of sober yet ecstatic wonder at the goodness of God. A perfect choice for an Offertory chant, which generally calls us to offer our prayers, petitions, and lauds to the Father in union with the Sacrifice of the Son. May the joyful and mystical selections of the Church for this Sunday transport us into a state of gladdened gratefulness for what Jesus wrought for our salvation, undeserving as we are. In John 21:1 -19, Jesus emphasizes renewal and mission, while Revelation 5:11-14 celebrates hope and redemption. Your assistance in the Haiti ministry support means the world. In northern Haiti, our twinning region, violence and food insecurity overwhelm communities. Diesel fuel costs \$5 per gallon in the Dominican Republic but \$50 in Haiti—if available. Food shipments often languish in ports, unable to reach those in need. Contingency funds are urgently needed to act on fleeting opportunities. 
