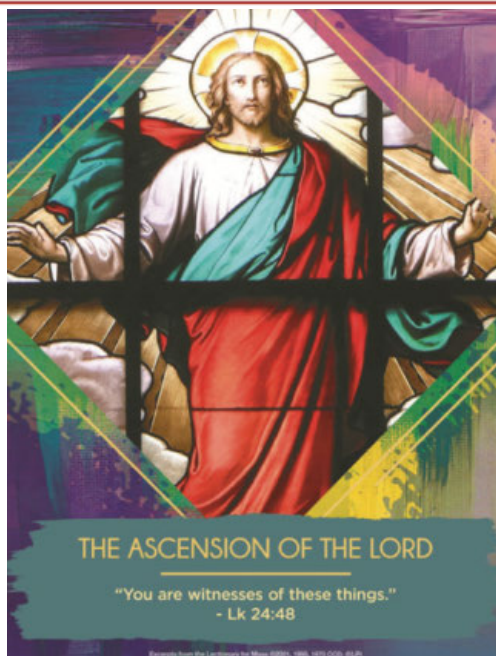

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance (*Viri Galilaei*): Men of Galilee, why are you gazing in astonishment at the sky? alleluia; just as you have seen him ascend into heaven, so, in like manner, shall he return, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

Offertory (*Viri Galilaei*): Men of Galilee, why do you gaze at the sky in astonishment? This same Jesus who was taken up from you into heaven, will come by the very way in which you saw him go into heaven, alleluia.

Communion (*Psallite Domino*): Sing to the Lord who has ascended the highest heavens, towards the East, alleluia.

It is always interesting when the Church presents us with the same text several times in her Propers. We have the opportunity to see the text realized in different yet enriching ways. The Entrance Antiphon sets the text using a major sounding mode (often described as “angelic” or “perfect”). The joy of the angels is evident from the mood created by the melody, emphasizing the virtue of hope (“so, in like manner, shall he return”). The overall shape of the chant is an arc, ascending during the first part of the narration and generally descending during the second narrative portion. The alleluias themselves frolic with angelic alacrity all over gamut of the piece. On the other hand, the Offertory setting of the text is very melismatic (many notes on a single syllable), creating a much more contemplative mood. This is further emphasized by the character of the mode or scale, which is more minor and solemn. One gets the sense that we are experiencing a musical lectio divina. There is a strikingly moment when the chant breaks out of its relatively somber mood with an explosion of rapturous notes on the word “ascendentem” (“Jesus[...] will come by the very way in which you saw him ascending into heaven). We are called to stop and ponder with wonder at the mystery of His departure, which ushers in the era of the Holy Spirit. The Master has left us in order to dwell with us in an infinitely more intimate way – through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit and the reception of the Blessed Sacrament. Come down, O Love Divine! FROM THE PASTOR



THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY and THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS

Part IV

“Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene” John 19:25

After Jesus' death and resurrection, little is recorded in the New Testament about Mary's activities. While Jesus entrusted to the apostles the duty of evangelizing the world, what did Mary do? Was she involved in the early days of the Church? The New Testament gives us a few clues as to Mary's role among the apostles. First, it is generally accepted that at the time of Jesus' death, his foster-father Joseph had already passed away, leaving Jesus as the family member primarily in charge of his mother. We know that when Jesus was about to die on the cross he appointed John to take care of her: **“When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, “Woman, behold, your son!” Then he said to the disciple, “Behold, your mother!” And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home.” (Jn 19:26-27)**

Initially it appears that John took care of her in Jerusalem, as mentioned in the book of Acts: **“Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away; and when they had entered, they went up to the upper room, where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot and Judas the son of James. All these with one accord devoted themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brethren” (Acts 1:12-14).** No doubt, Mary was

clearly present among the apostles in the early days of the Church and joined with them in prayer. Her presence was likely very peaceful and helped encourage the apostles in their mission. St. Luke narrates that, **“When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came a noise from the sky like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them” (Acts 2:1-3).** While not explicitly mentioned, it is believed that Mary was there at Pentecost among the apostles, witnessing the descent of the Holy Spirit upon all those present. After that, Mary's activities are not mentioned in the New Testament and what happened next is not exactly known.

After Pentecost it is reported that the Apostle John spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ first with Peter in Judea and later in Asia Minor, serving many years as the Bishop of Ephesus. According to tradition, Mary accompanied John to Ephesus and lived there for several years. It is possible, then, that Mary spent the rest of her life in quiet, contemplative prayer, keeping all these happenings in her heart! Another tradition claims that **St. Luke interviewed Mary for his Gospel**. He does affirm that he interviewed people for his account but does not mention Mary by name (Luke 1:1-3). One piece of evidence that this might have been true is that Luke's Gospel has many references to Mary, including stories that would have only been known by her.

In the end, we know little about Mary's role among the apostles, but we do know that she was there, and being the mother of the Messiah, she likely had a privileged place. It is not without merit that the Church now invokes Mary as **Queen of the Apostles**. From a number of testimonies of the Church we know that Mary was assumed bodily into heaven and now tastes the Resurrection for which all Christians hope. This teaching is one of the four dogmas, or truths, of Mary held by the Catholic Church. All I can say is that Mother Mary is still on mission taking care of “the disciples of Jesus.”

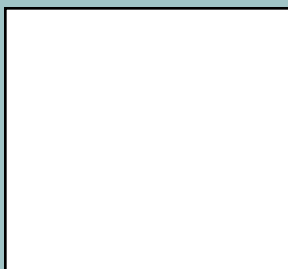

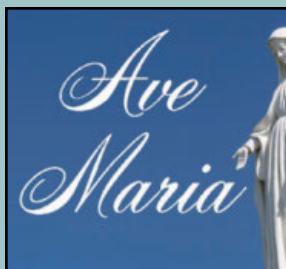
