#### NEXT WEEK'S READINGS

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY **First Reading** *Proverbs 8:22-31* Wisdom was born before the earth was made.

**Responsorial Psalm** *Psalm 8:4-9* O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth!

### **LITURGICAL NOTES** *i*): The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole

**Entrance (Spiritus Domini):** The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole world, alleluia; and that which contains all things, knows every language spoken by men, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

**Offertory** (*Confirma, hoc Deus*): Confirm, O God, that which you have accomplished in our midst; from your holy temple which is in Jerusalem, kings shall offer presents to you, alleluia.

**Communion** (*Factus est repente*): Suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, in the place where they were sitting, alleluia; and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and announced the great things God had done, alleluia, alleluia.

Pentecost is as ancient a feast day as Christianity itself, having been observed since apostolic times. There is much fanfare and beautiful music that has developed around this feast, including the beautiful hymn "Veni Creator Spiritus". Today we will focus briefly on the Communion Antiphon, which recalls the narrative of the descent of the Holy Spirit on the apostles. One of the many beautiful things about liturgy is that it has the ability to convey more than one sense of a text. We hear readings proclaimed by the priest, and those same readings are often meditated upon musically. That is the case with the Communion Antiphon Factus est repente. It is primarily narrative yet containing musical elements that themselves are heraldic. The opening notes span the interval of a fifth, which is a common interval in brass instruments. The coming of the Spirit, then, is highlighted in the same way that we might hear of the arrival of a monarch or a head of state: with fanfare. Another feature of the melody is its sense of winding about in imitation of the coming of the Spirit in a great wind. Happy Feast Day! Daniel Kirkland, Director of Liturgy & Music

### FROM THE PASTOR





#### LIVING IN THE JOY OF THE HOLY SPIRIT Part I Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi

"For the kingdom of God is not a matter of food and drink, but of righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit" Romans 14:17

Our Triune God is a God of joy. God the Father is our joy, Christ is our joy, and there is joy in the Holy Spirit, for God wants us to enjoy Him, and He gives Himself to us to be our enjoyment in our spirit, soul, and body. I invite you to walk with me in the joy of the Holy Spirit as we reflect on the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives and what impact His presence can make in our lives if we are open to Him.

The whole point of Pentecost was that Jesus would send his Holy Spirit to his people, and yes, he did. First, beams of light and tongues of fire settled on the disciples. Next, they were enabled to preach the words of God in languages that they did not know. Even more amazing is that there were people in the audience that could understand these words. Some people were amazed, but others claimed that the disciples must be drunk. To combat this, Peter followed the Holy Spirit's prompting, getting up in front of the crowd and explaining why this was an act of the Holy Spirit and not of drunkenness. Finally, 3,000 people heard Peter's message and decide to follow Jesus by repenting and being baptized. Wow!

For three years these men had been with Jesus, and at every turn one could observe the contrast between the Master and the disciples. After the event of Pentecost, they were acting

very much like Jesus Himself. The change was extremely unbelievable, and it was immediate. And it was not only them – the whole community of Christ's followers was transformed.

Everyone kept feeling a sense of awe, and many wonders and signs were taking place through the apostles. "And all those who had believed were together and had all things in common; and they began selling their property and possessions, and were sharing them with all, as anyone might have needed. And day by day continuing with one mind in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they were taking their meals together with gladness and sincerity of heart, praising God, and having favor with all the people. And the Lord was adding to their number day by day those who were being saved" (Acts. 2:43-47). Do you realize what the Holy Spirt can do?

What happened to the Twelve? What happened to these original believers? What happened to change them? It was Pentecost. It was the coming of the Holy Spirit as recorded in Acts 2. If we hold these two models before us: the disciples before Pentecost and the disciples after Pentecost, which do you identify with more? which does your life fit in with most?
