LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance (Caritas Dei): The love of God has been poured into our hearts, alleluia; by his Spirit which dwells in us, alleluia, alleluia.

Offertory (*Benedictus sit*): Blessed be God the Fa-ther, and the only begotten Son of God, and the Holy Spirit; for he has dealt with us according to his mercy.

Communion (*Benedicimus Deum*): Let us bless the God of heaven and utter his praises before all who live; for he has dealt with us according to his mercy.

Trinity Sunday is the most worshipful of all the Sundays of the year with music drawing on texts from Tobit and Daniel, This is the time that we acknowledge the truth of God's identity – that He IS in fact ruler of all creation, the generous Giver of Life to all, and the Reason for everything. Our lives are not our own but pure gift, and so the liturgy repeats over and over, "Blessed are you, O Lord." Sometimes the music is joyful, using Sol-based scales (usually major sounding); sometimes it is mystical, using Mi-based scales (minor and often eastern sounding). Another special feature of today's liturgy is the option to substitute the psalm between the readings with a hymn that is used frequently during lauds: Benedictus es, Domine. It is the song from the book of Daniel of the three children who were thrown into the furnace for their profession of faith and refusal to engage in pagan worship. Take the time this week to acknowledge God's dominion over your existence and give thanks to the Almighty for having given you absolutely everything. Blessed be God for Ever and ever. Amen . FROM THE PASTOR





LIVING IN THE JOY OF THE HOLY SPIRIT Part II Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi

"For the kingdom of God is not a matter of food and drink, but of righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit" Romans 14:17

The Scripture above teaches us that joy in the Holy Spirit is the deep, abiding sense of happiness and contentment that comes from the Holy Spirit's presence in the believer's life. This joy is not dependent on external circumstances but is rooted in the assurance of God's love, salvation, and ongoing work in our lives. In Romans 15:13, St. Paul says: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." This means that when we trust God, He fills us with joy and peace through the Holy Spirit. This joy isn't based on our circumstances but on the deep assurance that God loves us and is with us. It's a lasting happiness that stays with us no matter what we're going through.

By relying on the Holy Spirit, we can have a heart full of hope and joy, living the abundant life God wants for us. This is what the Apostles received, experienced, and lived. I always say to myself: *"I need the same thing the Apostles got. I need to be filled with the Holy Spirit every day."* It's so important for us to know and believe that the difference between us and the Apostles has only to do with the Holy Spirit. That's

all. They were no better than we are as humans. They were no better educated. They were probably no smarter. There is no indication that they were any more naturally talented than we are, or any more courageous, or more spiritually inclined. The Holy Spirit made the difference!

My question is: Have you been trying to change for years and years and still find that you struggle with the same sins and bad habits you've had all along? I sure have. After a while, it becomes clear that we cannot change ourselves. Yet here in the disciples we see real change – real change brought about by the Holy Spirit. My friends, we don't need a self-help program! We don't just need to unlearn some bad habits. We don't just need a little more self-discipline or accountability. We need God's grace; we need to have our hearts changed by His mighty power, we need to be filled with the Spirit of Jesus Christ Himself, so that each of us can say what Paul said in Gal. 2:20: **"I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me."**

Some people might be afraid of this idea of seeking the Holy Spirit. I can imagine two kinds of fear that might crop up in people's minds: one is the fear of being too close to God. Many Christians are scared of what God might do to them if they really surrender all to Jesus. I can understand this concern. And, I'll be honest with you, the fullness of the Spirit might mean a loss of some comforts and some security. It may mean an increase of persecution. It probably will bring trouble. It may mean giving away some of our possessions. It may mean losing some of our friends. It may mean letting go of some things that we really enjoy. It may mean doing some things that right now we would never want to do. There is a cost, but there is a benefit too. There is a heavenly benefit, but there is also an increase in joy and happiness in this life. For me, I would much rather be joyful and fulfilled and at peace in my discomforts, than miserable and troubled and restless in my comfort. Isn't that what you really want too?
